## AN ACT

Amending Title 3 (Agriculture) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, establishing the Agriculture Rapid Response Disaster Readiness Account. 3 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 5 hereby enacts as follows: 6 Section 1. - 7 § 11101. Declaration of purpose.
- 8 The purpose of this chapter is to establish a restricted
- 9 account within the department to provide emergency money for
- 10 training, equipment and other resources necessary for rapid
- 11 responses to transmissible diseases, plant pests, plant
- 12 <u>diseases</u>, controlled and noxious weeds, foodborne illnesses and
- 13 <u>natural and other disasters affecting agriculture in this</u>
- 14 Commonwealth.
- 15 § 11102. Definitions.
- The following words and phrases when used in this chapter
- 17 shall have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
- 18 <u>context clearly indicates otherwise:</u>
- 19 "Account." The Agriculture Rapid Response Disaster Readiness
- 20 Account established under section 11107 (relating to Agriculture
- 21 Rapid Response Disaster Readiness Account).
- 22 "Controlled plant." As defined under section 1502 (relating
- 23 to definitions).
- 24 <u>"Hazardous substance."</u> As defined under section 2303
- 25 (relating to definitions).
- 26 "Invasive species." A species declared to be invasive by the
- 27 <u>Governor's Invasive Species Council of Pennsylvania.</u>
- 28 "Noxious weed." As defined under section 1502.
- 29 "Person." An individual, partnership, association, firm,
- 30 corporation, local agency, agency of the Federal Government or

- 1 the Commonwealth or other legal entity.
- 2 "Plant pest." As defined under the act of December 16, 1992
- 3 (P.L.1228, No.162), known as the Plant Pest Act.
- 4 <u>"Transmissible disease."</u> As defined under section 2303.
- 5 § 11103. Authority.
- 6 (a) Authority and duty. -- The department shall have the
- 7 <u>authority and duty to:</u>
- 8 (1) Administer the provisions of this chapter.
- 9 (2) Allocate money in accordance with this chapter.
- 10 (b) Training programs. -- The department may develop training
- 11 programs and training program requirements and allocate money in
- 12 <u>a manner consistent with this chapter.</u>
- 13 <u>(c) Competitive bidding.--The department shall use a</u>
- 14 competitive bidding process for contracts awarded under this
- 15 <u>chapter and may not make sole source procurements.</u>
- 16 § 11104. Eligible disaster funding.
- 17 Purposes for which money from the account may be used by the
- 18 department shall include, but are not limited to, the following:
- 19 (1) To mitigate, contain, control, eradicate, prevent or
- 20 limit the spread of:
- 21 (i) Transmissible disease.
- 22 (ii) Hazardous substance contamination.
- 23 <u>(iii) Plant pests.</u>
- 24 (iv) Invasive species.
- 25 <u>(v) Plant diseases.</u>
- (vi) Noxious weeds.
- 27 <u>(vii) Controlled plants.</u>
- 28 (viii) Foodborne illness.
- 29 (2) To assist in providing transportation of livestock
- feed from a commercial feed establishment in the event of a

- disaster declaration issued by the Governor that includes the
- 2 <u>department</u>.
- 3 (3) To make grants for and acquire data regarding animal
- 4 <u>health research and animal disease diagnosis. No more than</u>
- 5 \$100,000 may be used for this purpose in a year.
- 6 (4) To provide additional financial assistance as may be
- 7 requested in a declaration of disaster issued by the Governor
- 8 <u>that includes the department.</u>
- 9 § 11105. Recordkeeping and audit.
- 10 (a) Eligible person receiving money. -- The department shall
- 11 require a person receiving money under this chapter to keep and
- 12 provide upon request records as the department believes are
- 13 <u>necessary to ensure money is spent in accordance with this</u>
- 14 chapter. The person must reside in this Commonwealth. The
- 15 records shall include the name and address of the person,
- 16 evidence of the eligible disaster for which the money was
- 17 received and a copy of each invoice and expenditure to account
- 18 for the expenditure of money received. The department may
- 19 request production of the documents and may copy and hold the
- 20 documents as the department deems necessary. The department may
- 21 enter onto the premises of the person in order to carry out the
- 22 department's duties under this chapter.
- 23 (b) Department records.--The department shall keep a record
- 24 of all expenditures from the account, which shall include the
- 25 date, eligible purpose of the expenditure and any eligible
- 26 entity that may have received the funding. The General Assembly
- 27 may request a report, including the required records, from the
- 28 department on a fiscal year basis or as the General Assembly
- 29 believes necessary.
- 30 § 11106. Cooperation.

- 1 In order to increase the efficiency of the department
- 2 regarding the administration and implementation of this chapter,
- 3 the department may cooperate and enter into agreements with the
- 4 appropriate regulatory agencies of the Federal Government and
- 5 any other Commonwealth agency in furtherance of this chapter.
- 6 § 11107. Agriculture Rapid Response Disaster Readiness Account.
- 7 (a) Establishment. -- The Agriculture Rapid Response Disaster
- 8 Readiness Account is established as a special nonlapsing account
- 9 in the State Treasury. All money allocated to or supplements to
- 10 the account and the interest collected on money and supplements
- 11 shall be paid into the account. All money placed into the
- 12 account and the interest the account accrues are appropriated to
- 13 the department on a continuing basis for activities necessary to
- 14 meet the requirements of this chapter.
- 15 (b) Supplements to account. -- The account may be supplemented
- 16 by money received from the following sources:
- 17 (1) State money appropriated to the department.
- 18 (2) Federal money appropriated to the department.
- 19 (3) Money received from other governmental agencies
- through an interagency agreement or memorandum of
- 21 understanding.
- 22 (4) Gifts and other contributions from public and
- 23 private sources.
- 24 (c) Account administration. -- The department may adopt
- 25 procedures for the use of money in the account, including the
- 26 creation of subaccounts within the account for the purposes of
- 27 <u>allocation of money authorized under this chapter.</u>
- 28 (d) Deposit and use of money. -- An administrative action may
- 29 not prevent the deposit of money into the account in the fiscal
- 30 year in which the money is received. The money shall only be

- 1 <u>used for the purposes authorized under this chapter and shall</u>
- 2 <u>not be transferred or diverted to any other purpose by</u>
- 3 administrative action, except as specifically provided for in
- 4 <u>section 11106 (relating to cooperation).</u>
- 5 § 11108. Applicability.
- 6 This chapter shall apply to the distribution of account money
- 7 <u>allocated or made available to the department beginning with the</u>
- 8 <u>2019-2020 fiscal year and each fiscal year thereafter. The</u>
- 9 <u>department shall not be liable for a commitment or for</u>
- 10 completion of a partially completed or partially funded project
- 11 which cannot be completed due to the unavailability of
- 12 Commonwealth money or future Commonwealth appropriations.
- 13 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
