- 10 shall have the meanings given to them in this section unless the

- "Best management practice." A practice or combination of
- 13 practices determined by the State Conservation Commission or
- 14 United States Department of Agriculture Natural Resources and
- 15 Conservation Service to be effective and practical, considering
- 16 technological, economic and institutional factors, to manage
- 17 nutrients and sediment to protect surface water and groundwater.
- 18 <u>"Commission." The State Conservation Commission established</u>
- 19 under section 4 of the act of May 15, 1945 (P.L.547, No.217),
- 20 known as the Conservation District Law.
- 21 "Program." The Conservation Excellence Grant Program
- 22 established under section 3102 (relating to establishment).
- 23 "USDA-NRCS." The United States Department of Agriculture
- 24 Natural Resources and Conservation Service.
- 25 § 3102. Establishment.
- The Conservation Excellence Grant Program is established
- 27 within the commission.
- 28 § 3103. Administration of program.
- The commission shall administer the program for the purpose
- 30 of providing technical and financial assistance to farmers and

- 1 <u>landowners</u> for the implementation of best management practice
- 2 projects in high-priority locations within this Commonwealth
- 3 through a combination of grants, loans and tax credits as
- 4 <u>authorized under section 4(7) of the act of May 15, 1945</u>
- 5 (P.L.547, No.217), known as the Conservation District Law.
- 6 § 3104. Application guidelines.
- 7 The commission shall establish guidelines for the approval of
- 8 applications for eligible projects under the program.
- 9 § 3105. Grants, loans and tax credits.
- 10 (a) Awards. -- The commission may award grants, loans or tax
- 11 <u>credits to applicants for eligible projects that the commission</u>
- 12 <u>determines will further the purpose of the program.</u>
- (b) Grants. -- Grants shall be awarded to the extent funding
- 14 <u>is made available by the General Assembly.</u>
- 15 (c) Loans.--Loans under this section may be awarded through
- 16 <u>the Agriculture-Linked Investment Program or any other loan</u>
- 17 program approved by the commission.
- 18 (d) Tax credits.--Tax credits under this section may be
- 19 awarded through the Resource Enhancement and Protection Tax
- 20 Credit Program under Article XVII-E of the act of March 4, 1971
- 21 (P.L.6, No.2), known as the Tax Reform Code of 1971.
- 22 § 3106. Project certification.
- The commission shall ensure that a project satisfies the
- 24 requirements of the program in accordance with the following:
- 25 (1) Except as provided under paragraph (2), if a
- 26 project's best management practice requires review and
- 27 <u>certification by a registered professional engineer under the</u>
- applicable laws or regulations of this Commonwealth, the best
- 29 management practice shall be certified by a registered
- 30 professional engineer.

1	(2) Any other project shall be certified by a technical
2	service provider, staff from a conservation district or the
3	USDA-NRCS or any other person who has appropriate training
4	and expertise and is approved by the commission.
5	§ 3107. Criteria for evaluation of applications.
6	In approving applications for eligible projects under the
7	program, the commission shall give priority to applications
8	based upon the following criteria and this order:
9	(1) Priority locations as follows:
10	(i) Counties designated by DEP as Tier 1 Chesapeake
11	Bay counties.
12	(ii) Counties designated by DEP as Tier 2 and 3
13	Chesapeake Bay counties.
14	(iii) All other counties.
15	(2) Priority practices as follows:
16	(i) Livestock exclusion fencing.
17	(ii) Stream-side buffers.
18	(iii) Streambank restoration.
19	(iv) Barnyard and feedlot runoff abatement.
20	(v) Stream crossings.
21	(vi) Off-stream watering.
22	(vii) Manure storage facilities.
23	(viii) Nutrient management plans and manure
24	management plans.
25	(ix) Agricultural erosion and sedimentation plans.
26	(x) Any other priority practices approved by the
27	commission.
28	(3) The level and extent of planning and technical
29	assistance, including inventory and evaluation, design work,
30	permits and similar types of assistance, already completed to

- 1 allow for accurate estimates of project costs and for
- 2 <u>completion of the project in a timely fashion.</u>
- 3 (4) The extent to which an applicant is willing to
- 4 <u>accept a reasonable mix of grants, loans and tax credits or</u>
- 5 to supply nongovernmental matching funds for the project.
- 6 (5) Any other criteria as adopted by the commission.
- 7 § 3108. Application, review and authorization by commission.
- 8 (a) Application process. -- A person must apply to the
- 9 commission for a grant, loan or tax credit for an eliqible
- 10 project under the program with an application created by the
- 11 commission. The application must include all of the following
- 12 <u>information:</u>
- 13 <u>(1) The location of the project.</u>
- 14 <u>(2) The type of the project.</u>
- 15 (3) The status of the project.
- 16 (4) The type and combination of funding requested under
- the program.
- 18 (5) The total cost of the project.
- 19 (6) Any other information as required by the commission.
- 20 (b) Review. -- The commission shall review applications based
- 21 upon the criteria established under section 3107 (relating to
- 22 criteria for evaluation of applications) on a first-come, first-
- 23 served basis. Within 60 days of receipt of an application, the
- 24 commission shall notify the applicant of all of the following:
- 25 (1) Whether the project is approved for funding under
- the program.
- 27 (2) The total amount of money approved for the project.
- 28 (3) The amount of each type of funding approved for the
- 29 <u>project.</u>
- 30 (c) Notice of completion. -- Upon completion of a project

- 1 <u>funded under this program, the person who received approval for</u>
- 2 the project shall notify the commission of the completion of the
- 3 project. The notice under this subsection shall include the
- 4 required certification under section 3106 (relating to project
- 5 certification).
- 6 (d) Inspection. -- Projects funded under this program may be
- 7 <u>subject to inspection by the commission or the commission's</u>
- 8 <u>designated agent.</u>
- 9 Section 3. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
