AN ACT

- 1 Amending Title 42 (Judiciary and Judicial Procedure) of the
 2 Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in bases of jurisdiction
- Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in bases of jurisdiction and interstate and international procedure, further providing
- for persons and providing for personal jurisdiction in
- 5 medical professional liability actions.
- 6 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 7 hereby enacts as follows:
- 8 Section 1. Section 5301(a) introductory paragraph and (b) of
- 9 Title 42 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes are amended
- 10 to read:
- 11 § 5301. Persons.
- 12 (a) General rule.--[The] <u>Except as further provided by</u>
- 13 section 5301.1 (relating to personal jurisdiction in medical
- 14 professional liability actions), the existence of any of the
- 15 following relationships between a person and this Commonwealth
- 16 shall constitute a sufficient basis of jurisdiction to enable
- 17 the tribunals of this Commonwealth to exercise general personal
- 18 jurisdiction over such person, or his personal representative in
- 19 the case of an individual, and to enable such tribunals to

- 1 render personal orders against such person or representative:
- 2 * * *
- 3 (b) Scope of jurisdiction. -- When jurisdiction over a person
- 4 is based upon this section or section 5301.1, any cause of
- 5 action may be asserted against [him] the person, whether or not
- 6 arising from acts enumerated in this section. Discontinuance of
- 7 the acts enumerated in subsection (a)(2)(i) and (iii) and (3)(i)
- 8 and (iii) shall not affect jurisdiction with respect to any act,
- 9 transaction or omission occurring during the period such status
- 10 existed.
- 11 Section 2. Title 42 is amended by adding a section to read:
- 12 § 5301.1. Personal jurisdiction in medical professional
- 13 <u>liability actions.</u>
- 14 <u>(a) General rule.--In addition to the requirements of</u>
- 15 <u>section 5301 (relating to persons), the tribunals of this</u>
- 16 Commonwealth may exercise general personal jurisdiction over a
- 17 health care provider in a medical professional liability action
- 18 for a medical professional liability claim only in the county in
- 19 which the cause of action arose.
- 20 (b) Definitions.--As used in this section, the following
- 21 words and phrases shall have the meanings given to them in this
- 22 <u>subsection unless the context clearly indicates otherwise:</u>
- 23 "Birth center." An entity licensed as a birth center under
- 24 the act of July 19, 1979 (P.L.130, No.48), known as the Health
- 25 Care Facilities Act.
- 26 <u>"Health care provider." A primary health care center, a</u>
- 27 personal care home licensed by the Department of Human Services
- 28 under the act of June 13, 1967 (P.L.31, No.21), known as the
- 29 <u>Human Services Code</u>, or a person, including a corporation,
- 30 university or other educational institution, licensed or

- 1 approved by the Commonwealth to provide health care or
- 2 professional medical services as a physician, certified nurse
- 3 midwife, podiatrist, hospital, nursing home or birth center. The
- 4 term includes an officer, employee or agent of the primary
- 5 health care center, personal care home or person if the officer,
- 6 employee or agent is acting in the course and scope of_
- 7 <u>employment.</u>
- 8 "Hospital." An entity licensed as a hospital under the Human
- 9 <u>Services Code or the Health Care Facilities Act.</u>
- 10 "Medical professional liability action." A proceeding in
- 11 which a medical professional liability claim is asserted,
- 12 <u>including an action in a court of law or an arbitration</u>
- 13 proceeding.
- 14 "Medical professional liability claim." A claim seeking the
- 15 recovery of damages or loss from a health care provider arising
- 16 <u>out of a tort or breach of contract causing injury or death</u>
- 17 resulting from the furnishing of health care services that were
- 18 or should have been provided.
- 19 "Nursing home." An entity licensed as a nursing home under
- 20 the Health Care Facilities Act.
- 21 "Primary health care center." A community-based nonprofit
- 22 corporation that meets standards prescribed by the Department of
- 23 <u>Health and provides preventive</u>, diagnostic, therapeutic and
- 24 basic emergency health care by licensed practitioners who are
- 25 employees of the corporation or under contract to the
- 26 corporation.
- 27 Section 3. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
