AN ACT

- 1 Establishing the Electric School Bus Grant Program and the
- 2 Electric School Bus Grant Program Fund; providing for duties
- of the Department of Education; and making an appropriation.
- 4 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 5 hereby enacts as follows:
- 6 Section 1. Short title.
- 7 This act shall be known and may be cited as the Electric
- 8 School Bus Grant Program Act.
- 9 Section 2. Definitions.
- 10 The following words and phrases when used in this act shall
- 11 have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
- 12 context clearly indicates otherwise:
- 13 "Charging infrastructure." A facility or equipment that is
- 14 used to charge a battery or other energy storage device of a
- 15 vehicle that is fully or partially powered by electricity.
- 16 "Department." The Department of Education of the
- 17 Commonwealth.

- 1 "Disproportionately impacted community." Any of the
- 2 following:
- 3 (1) A community that is in a census block group, as
- 4 determined in accordance with the most recent Federal
- 5 decennial census, where:
- 6 (i) the proportion of households that are low income 7 is more than 40%;
- 8 (ii) the proportion of households that identify as 9 minority is more than 40%; or
- 10 (iii) the proportion of households that are cost-11 burdened is more than 40%.
- 12 (2) A community identified or approved by a State agency
 13 as a disproportionately impacted community if any of the
 14 following apply:
- 15 (i) The community has a history of environmental 16 racism perpetuated through redlining, anti-Indigenous, 17 anti-immigrant, anti-Hispanic or anti-Black laws.
- (ii) The community is impacted by multiple factors,
 including socioeconomic stressors, disproportionate
 environmental burdens, vulnerability to environmental
 degradation and a lack of public participation, which may
 act cumulatively to affect the health and environment and
 contribute to persistent disparities.
- "Electric-powered school bus." A school bus that is powered solely by electricity.
- 26 "Fund." The Electric School Bus Grant Program Fund 27 established under section 6(a).
- "Grantee." A recipient of a grant under the program.
- "Internal combustion engine school bus." A school bus
- 30 powered by diesel fuel or gasoline.

- 1 "Nonattainment area." An area of this Commonwealth that has
- 2 been designated by the Environmental Protection Agency as being
- 3 in nonattainment with national ambient air quality standards.
- 4 "Program." The Electric School Bus Grant Program established
- 5 under section 3(a).
- 6 "School bus." A school bus as defined in 75 Pa.C.S. § 102
- 7 (relating to definitions).
- 8 "School entity." A public school, including a charter school <--
- 9 or cyber charter school, AN intermediate unit or area career and <--
- 10 technical school operating within this Commonwealth.
- "Secretary." The Secretary of Education of the Commonwealth.
- 12 Section 3. Electric School Bus Grant Program.
- 13 (a) Establishment. -- The Electric School Bus Grant Program is
- 14 established within the department. The department shall award
- 15 grants under the program to a school entity or a contracted
- 16 nonprofit organization or private entity acting on behalf of the
- 17 school entity to finance the following:
- 18 (1) The procurement and maintenance of electric-powered
- school buses, the conversion of internal combustion engine
- 20 school buses to electric-powered school buses, charging
- 21 infrastructure and electrical upgrades on each customer's
- side of the meter as necessary to support charging
- 23 infrastructure.
- 24 (2) The administrative costs associated with the
- 25 procurements, conversions, maintenance or retirements
- 26 specified under paragraph (1), including up-front
- 27 administrative costs associated with developing and
- implementing a proposal for the procurements, conversions or
- 29 maintenance.
- 30 (b) Duties.--The department shall administer the program,

- 1 including providing the necessary technical assistance for the
- 2 program. The department may provide no more than the equivalent
- 3 of one-half of a full-time employee of the department to provide
- 4 technical assistance to a school entity regarding applying for a
- 5 grant under the program and implementing a project with the
- 6 awarded grant money.
- 7 (c) Application. -- The department shall establish an
- 8 application process for a school entity or a contracted
- 9 nonprofit organization or private entity acting on behalf of the
- 10 school entity to apply for a grant under the program. The
- 11 department shall post information about the program application
- 12 process, including an application form that the department
- 13 develops for the program, on the department's publicly
- 14 accessible Internet website.
- 15 Section 4. Criteria for awarding grants under program.
- 16 (a) Criteria. -- The department shall develop criteria for
- 17 awarding grants under the program, which shall include all of
- 18 the following:
- 19 (1) Giving priority to a school entity:
- 20 (i) located in or attended by students living in a
- 21 disproportionately impacted community;
- 22 (ii) located in a nonattainment area;
- 23 (iii) where at least a certain percentage of
- 24 students, as determined by the department, receive free
- or reduced-price lunches under the National School Lunch
- 26 Program; or
- 27 (iv) that retires or converts at least a certain
- 28 percentage, as determined by the department, of the
- grantee's internal combustion engine school buses or
- 30 retire or convert the grantee's internal combustion

- 1 engine school buses in a certain manner.
- 2 (2) Periodic reporting requirements for a grantee to
- 3 demonstrate that the grant money awarded under the program is
- 4 being used in accordance with this act.
- 5 (3) Procedures for addressing a grantee's noncompliance
- 6 with this act, including procedures for the reimbursement of
- 7 grant money awarded under the program.
- 8 (b) Limitation. -- The department shall limit the amount of a
- 9 grant awarded under the program to a school entity as necessary
- 10 to achieve cost parity between the costs associated with the
- 11 school entity's existing internal combustion engine school buses
- 12 and costs associated with the procurements, conversions,
- 13 maintenance, retirements and administrative costs specified
- 14 under section 3.
- 15 Section 5. Contract terms for transportation services.
- 16 (a) Transportation services. -- If a contract for the
- 17 furnishing of transportation of students to and from a school
- 18 entity is executed by the school entity on or after the
- 19 effective date of this subsection, the contract shall be made
- 20 for a term not to exceed 15 years. The contract shall be
- 21 renewable at the option of the school entity and the party
- 22 contracted to provide transportation services, jointly, at the
- 23 end of the term of the contract. The renewed contract shall
- 24 include all of the terms and conditions of the previous
- 25 contract, including any provisions increasing rates based on
- 26 increased costs.
- 27 (b) School bus leases.--
- 28 (1) Except as provided under paragraph (2), if a
- 29 contract is executed by a school entity for the lease or
- 30 rental of a school bus on or after the effective date of this

- 1 subsection, the contract shall be made for a term not to
- 2 exceed 15 years.
- 3 (2) If the contract under paragraph (1) provides that
- 4 the school entity may exercise an option to purchase the
- 5 school bus or cancel the lease or rental at the end of each
- 6 annual period during the period of the contract, the contract
- 7 may be made for a term not to exceed 20 years.
- 8 (c) Negotiations. -- Notwithstanding any other provision of
- 9 law, nothing in this section shall be construed to prohibit a
- 10 contract specified under subsection (a) or (b) from being
- 11 negotiated annually within the contract period when economic
- 12 factors indicate negotiation is necessary to maintain an
- 13 equitable pricing structure, subject to the approval of each
- 14 contracting party.
- 15 (d) Compliance. -- Any rental, lease or lease-purchase of a
- 16 school bus shall comply with any other applicable laws of this
- 17 Commonwealth.
- 18 Section 6. Electric School Bus Grant Program Fund.
- 19 (a) Establishment. -- The Electric School Bus Grant Program
- 20 Fund is established within the State Treasury. The department
- 21 shall administer the fund for the purposes of this act. The fund
- 22 consists of money transferred or appropriated to the fund for
- 23 implementation of the program and available money from Federal
- 24 sources and gifts, grants and donations received under
- 25 subsection (b).
- 26 (b) Sources.--
- 27 (1) The fund shall consist of money appropriated to the
- 28 fund by the General Assembly.
- 29 (2) The department may seek, accept and receive money
- from Federal sources and gifts, grants and donations from

- 1 public and private entities for deposit into the fund. The
- 2 department shall transmit money received under this paragraph
- 3 to the State Treasurer, who shall deposit the money into the
- 4 fund.
- 5 (c) Appropriations. -- Money in the fund is appropriated on a
- 6 continuing basis to the department for the purposes of this act.
- 7 The State Treasurer shall credit all interest and income derived
- 8 from the deposit and investment of money in the fund to the
- 9 fund. Unexpended and unencumbered money remaining in the fund at
- 10 the end of a fiscal year shall not lapse.
- 11 (d) Direct or indirect costs. -- The department may use up to
- 12 8% of the money in the fund to cover the direct and indirect
- 13 costs the department incurs in administering the program.
- 14 (e) Technical assistance. -- The department shall reserve a
- 15 portion of the money in the fund to provide ongoing technical
- 16 assistance to a school district to seize available Federal funds
- 17 and understand fleet transition considerations for the school
- 18 district's specific situation.
- 19 Section 7. Contracted nonprofit organizations or private
- entities.
- 21 In order to expediently process contracts for the provision
- 22 of transportation services funded by a grant awarded under the
- 23 program, a school entity may select a preapproved contracted
- 24 nonprofit organization or private entity that meets all of the
- 25 following criteria:
- 26 (1) The nonprofit organization or private entity
- 27 provides any of the following:
- 28 (i) An electric school bus.
- 29 (ii) An electric school bus charging infrastructure.
- 30 (iii) Charging and charging management services.

- 1 (iv) Electric school bus services.
- 2 (2) The nonprofit organization or private entity has
- 3 sought and received approval from the secretary to provide
- 4 any of the products or services listed under paragraph (1).
- 5 Section 8. Reports.
- 6 (a) Submission.--On or before January 1, 2025, and on or
- 7 before January 1 of each odd-numbered year thereafter, the
- 8 department shall prepare a report summarizing the progress of
- 9 the program and submit the report to the following:
- 10 (1) The chairperson and minority chairperson of the
- 11 Education Committee of the Senate.
- 12 (2) The chairperson and minority chairperson of the
- 13 Education Committee of the House of Representatives.
- 14 (3) The chairperson and minority chairperson of the
- 15 Environmental Resources and Energy Committee of the Senate.
- 16 (4) The chairperson and minority chairperson of the
- 17 Environmental Resources and Energy Committee of the House of
- 18 Representatives.
- 19 (5) The chairperson and minority chairperson of the
- 20 Transportation Committee of the Senate.
- 21 (6) The chairperson and minority chairperson of the
- 22 Transportation Committee of the House of Representatives.
- 23 (b) Accessibility. -- The department shall post a copy of each
- 24 report under subsection (a) on the department's publicly
- 25 accessible Internet website.
- 26 Section 9. Effective date.
- 27 This act shall take effect in 60 days.
