## AN ACT

1 2 3 4 5 6	Amending the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), entitled "An act relating to the public school system, including certain provisions applicable as well to private and parochial schools; amending, revising, consolidating and changing the laws relating thereto," providing for State-related university performance-based funding incentive.
7	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
8	hereby enacts as follows:
9	Section 1. The act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), known
10	as the Public School Code of 1949, is amended by adding an
11	article to read:
12	ARTICLE XX-L
13	STATE-RELATED UNIVERSITY
14	PERFORMANCE-BASED FUNDING INCENTIVE
15	Section 2001-L. Scope of article.
16	This article relates to the State-related University
17	Performance-Based Incentive awarded to State-related
18	<u>universities.</u>
19	Section 2002-L. Definitions.
20	The following words and phrases when used in this article

1	shall have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
2	context clearly indicates otherwise:
3	"Base State funding." The amount of funding appropriated to
4	each State-related university during the 2023-2024 fiscal year.
5	"Council." The Performance-based Funding Council established
6	under section 2003-L.
7	"Department." The Department of Education of the
8	Commonwealth.
9	"Institutional investment." A reallocated percentage, no
10	less than 3% nor more than 10%, of the aggregate base State
11	funding to the State-related universities as determined by the
12	council.
13	"Net tuition." Published tuition less all grant aid,
14	including Federal, State, local and institutional grants, and
15	tax benefits.
16	"Performance-based funding incentive." Consists of the
17	following:
18	(1) Institutional investment.
19	(2) State's investment for excellence.
20	"State-related university." The Pennsylvania State
21	University, including the Pennsylvania College of Technology,
22	the University of Pittsburgh and Temple University and
23	associated branch campuses.
24	"State wage interchange system." A system developed by the
25	United States Department of Labor and United States Department
26	of Education to facilitate the interstate exchange of wage data
27	between participating state agencies in order to satisfy
28	performance reporting requirements under 29 U.S.C. § 3141
29	(relating to performance accountability system).
30	"State's investment for excellence." An amount appropriated
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1	by the General Assembly that exceeds the base State funding to
2	reward excellence as measured by the performance-based funding
3	metrics at a State-related university.
4	Section 2003-L. Performance-based Funding Council.
5	(a) EstablishmentThe Performance-based Funding Council is
6	established within the department for the purpose of allocating
7	State funding to State-related universities based on student
8	outcomes.
9	(b) MembershipThe council shall consist of the following
10	members:
11	(1) The Secretary of Education of the Commonwealth or a
12	<u>designee.</u>
13	(2) The Deputy Secretary of Postsecondary and Higher
14	Education or a designee.
15	(3) Two individuals appointed by the President pro
16	tempore of the Senate.
17	(4) An individual appointed by the Minority Leader of
18	the Senate.
19	(5) Two individuals appointed by the Speaker of the
20	House of Representatives.
21	(6) An individual appointed by the Minority Leader of
22	the House of Representatives.
23	(7) Two current Pennsylvania residents with recognized
24	subject matter expertise in higher education funding, who
25	must be appointed by the Governor and confirmed by the
26	<u>Senate.</u>
27	(c) ChairpersonThe chairperson and vice chairperson of
28	the council shall be selected by the members of the council.
29	(d) TermMembers of the council appointed pursuant to this
30	section shall serve terms as follows:

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1	(1) A member appointed under subsection (b)(3), (4), (5)
2	<u>or (6) shall serve a three-year term.</u>
3	(2) A member appointed under subsection (b)(7) shall
4	<u>serve a four-year term.</u>
5	(3) After the expiration of each initial term:
6	(i) A member appointed under subsection (b)(3), (4),
7	(5) or (6) shall be appointed for a term of four years.
8	(ii) A member appointed under subsection (b)(7)
9	shall be appointed for a term of five years.
10	(e) QuorumA majority of the members of the council shall
11	constitute a quorum, and a quorum shall be required for all
12	actions.
13	(f) VacanciesA vacancy occurring on the council by
14	resignation, removal, death or other reason shall be filled
15	within 30 business days of the vacancy in the manner in which
16	that position was originally filled. An individual appointed to
17	fill a vacancy shall be appointed for the unexpired term of the
18	member who created the vacancy.
19	(g) Reimbursement of expensesThe members of the council
20	may not receive compensation for their services but shall be
21	reimbursed by the department for all necessary travel and other
22	reasonable expenses incurred in connection with the performance
23	<u>of their duties.</u>
24	(h) Administrative supportThe department shall provide
25	administrative support, data, research, meeting space and other
26	assistance or information required by the council to carry out
27	the duties under this article.
28	(i) ActionsA vote of the majority of the members of the
29	council shall be sufficient for all actions taken by the
30	<u>council.</u>
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1	<u>(j) Meetings</u>
2	(1) The council shall meet no less than four times a
3	year at the call of the chairperson.
4	(2) The council shall hold its first meeting no later
5	than 90 business days after the effective date of this
6	section.
7	(3) All meetings shall be conducted in accordance with
8	the requirements of 65 Pa.C.S. Ch. 7 (relating to open
9	meetings).
10	Section 2004-L. Duties of the council.
11	The council shall:
12	(1) Adopt guidelines to administer a performance-based
13	funding incentive program.
14	(2) Adopt performance-based metrics and minimum
15	eligibility thresholds pursuant to section 2006-L to evaluate
16	each State-related university's performance for eligibility
17	to receive a performance-based funding incentive from the
18	Commonwealth.
19	(3) Monitor State-related universities with performance
20	improvement plans under section 2008-L.
21	(4) Consult with the department and other Commonwealth
22	agencies and utilize experts to assist in carrying out the
23	duties of this article.
24	(5) Hold hearings and receive input from interested
25	parties, including State-related universities, parents and
26	students.
27	Section 2005-L. State-related university performance-based
28	funding incentive.
29	Beginning with the 2024-2025 fiscal year, the department
30	shall award a performance-based funding incentive, using

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1	performance-based metrics adopted by the council under section
2	2006-L, to a State-related university.
3	Section 2006-L. Performance-based metrics.
4	(a) General ruleThe council shall adopt the following
5	performance-based metrics to evaluate a State-related
6	university's performance for eligibility to receive performance-
7	based funding from the Commonwealth:
8	(1) The four-year graduation rate for first-time-in-
9	<u>college students.</u>
10	(2) The percentage of undergraduate students enrolled
11	who received a Pell Grant during the previous school year.
12	(3) The six-year graduation rate for students who are
13	awarded a Pell Grant in their first year.
14	(4) The four-year graduation rate for baccalaureate
15	students.
16	(5) Student retention rates.
17	(6) Baccalaureate degree production per 100 full-time
18	enrolled students.
19	(7) Net tuition and fees per 120 credit hours.
20	(8) Postgraduation employment rates and salaries,
21	including wage thresholds that reflect the added value of a
22	baccalaureate degree. The department shall provide wage data
23	from the State wage interchange system to the council.
24	(9) The number of students enrolled and the number of
25	degrees attained in the following fields:
26	(i) Agriculture.
27	<u>(ii) Science.</u>
28	<u>(iii) Technology.</u>
29	(iv) Engineering.
30	(v) Mathematics.

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1	(10) The number of high school students who are dual
2	enrolled, and the number of credits earned.
3	(11) The percentage of credits articulated.
4	(12) Other metrics provided by each State-related
5	<u>university.</u>
6	(b) Minimum eligibility thresholds to be adoptedThe
7	council shall adopt minimum eligibility thresholds to evaluate a
8	State-related university's achievement of institutional
9	excellence or need for improvement and minimum requirements for
10	eligibility to receive a performance-based funding incentive.
11	(c) PublicationWithin 30 days of the adoption of
12	performance-based funding metrics or minimum eligibility
13	thresholds, the council shall transmit notice of the adoption of
14	performance-based funding metrics or minimum eligibility
15	thresholds to the Legislative Reference Bureau for publication
16	in the next available issue of the Pennsylvania Bulletin. The
17	performance-based funding metrics or minimum eligibility
18	thresholds shall become effective upon publication of the notice
19	<u>in the Pennsylvania Bulletin.</u>
20	(d) Periodic reviewThe council shall review, and revise
21	if necessary, the performance-based funding metrics and minimum
22	<u>eligibility thresholds at least every five years. Within 60 days</u>
23	of the completion of the review, the council shall issue a
24	report to the Governor, the department and the General Assembly,
25	post the report on the department's publicly accessible Internet
26	website and transmit notice of the updates to the Legislative
27	Reference Bureau for publication in the next available issue of
28	<u>the Pennsylvania Bulletin.</u>
29	(e) Adjustment prohibitedAfter being published in the
30	Pennsylvania Bulletin, metrics and minimum eligibility

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1	thresholds may not be adjusted for the next fiscal year.
2	Section 2007-L. Allocation of funding.
3	(a) General ruleBeginning with the 2024-2025 fiscal year,
4	the amount of funds available for allocation to the State-
5	related universities based on the performance-based funding
6	incentive provisions of this article shall be from the base
7	State funding.
8	(b) Minimum eligibility thresholds
9	(1) The council shall establish minimum performance
10	funding eligibility thresholds for the State's investment for
11	excellence and the institutional investments.
12	(2) A State-related university that meets the minimum
13	institutional investment performance funding eligibility
14	threshold, but fails to meet the minimum State investment
15	eligibility threshold, shall have its institutional
16	investment restored but is ineligible for a share of the
17	State's investment for excellence in performance funding.
18	(3) The institutional investment shall be restored for
19	all State-related universities eligible for the State's
20	investment for excellence if all State-related universities
21	meet the minimum institutional investment threshold under the
22	performance-based funding model.
23	(c) Determination of shareA State-related university's
24	share of the performance funding shall be calculated based on
25	the university's performance relative to the established metrics
26	in conjunction with the institutional size and scope.
27	(d) Annual distributionThe department shall annually
28	distribute performance-based funding, as provided in this
29	article, to each of the approved State-related universities.
30	(e) ReportBy December 31 of each year money is
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1	appropriated for a performance-based funding incentive, the
2	council shall submit a report containing the rankings and award
3	distributions for the fiscal year which ended the prior June 30
4	to the Governor, the department and the General Assembly. A copy
5	of the report shall be posted on the department's publicly
6	accessible Internet website.
7	Section 2008-L. Improvement plans.
8	(a) Withholding of institutional investmentThe department
9	shall withhold a portion of a State-related university's
10	institutional investment if the State-related university fails
11	to meet the minimum institutional investment performance funding
12	eligibility threshold. The State-related university shall submit
13	an improvement plan to the council that specifies the activities
14	and strategies for improving the university's performance.
15	(b) Review of improvement planThe council shall review
16	the improvement plan and, if the plan is approved, monitor the
17	university's progress in implementing the activities and
18	strategies specified in the plan.
19	(c) Monitoring reportsThe State-related university shall
20	submit monitoring reports to the council by December 31 and May
21	<u>31 of each year in which an improvement plan is in place. The</u>
22	ability of the university to submit an improvement plan to the
23	council is limited to one fiscal year.
24	(d) Period of withheld institutional investment
25	(1) The department shall withhold disbursement of the
26	institutional investment until the monitoring report is
27	approved by the council.
28	(2) A State-related university determined by the council
29	to be making satisfactory progress on implementing the
30	improvement plan shall receive no more than one-half of the

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1	withheld institutional investment in January and the balance
2	of the withheld institutional investment in June.
3	(3) A State-related university that fails to make
4	satisfactory progress may not have the university's full
5	institutional investment restored. Institutional investment
6	funds that are not restored shall be redistributed in
7	accordance with the council's performance-based metrics.
8	Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
