AN ACT

Amending the act of March 4, 1971 (P.L.6, No.2), entitled "An act relating to tax reform and State taxation by codifying 2 and enumerating certain subjects of taxation and imposing 3 taxes thereon; providing procedures for the payment, collection, administration and enforcement thereof; providing for tax credits in certain cases; conferring powers and imposing duties upon the Department of Revenue, certain 7 employers, fiduciaries, individuals, persons, corporations 8 and other entities; prescribing crimes, offenses and 9 10 penalties," in personal income tax, providing for citation authority. 11 12 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 13 hereby enacts as follows: 14 Section 1. The act of March 4, 1971 (P.L.6, No.2), known as 15 the Tax Reform Code of 1971, is amended by adding a section to 16 read: Section 352.2. Citation Authority. -- (a) Notwithstanding any 17 other provision of this act, an individual or entity shall not 18 do any of the following: 19 20 (1) Fail to pay employer withholding tax, interest or 21 penalty within ninety (90) days after the due date and the tax 22 liability due has not been timely appealed or subject to a duly

- 2 (2) Underpay any employer withholding tax, interest or
- 3 penalty within ninety (90) days after the due date and the tax
- 4 <u>liability due has not been timely appealed or subject to a duly</u>
- 5 <u>authorized deferred payment plan.</u>
- 6 (3) Fail to file a tax employer withholding return or
- 7 report, or any other reporting document within ninety (90) days
- 8 after the due date of the applicable payment or return, report
- 9 <u>or any other reporting document.</u>
- 10 (b) A person or entity who violates a provision of
- 11 <u>subsection (a) shall be guilty of a summary offense and, upon</u>
- 12 conviction thereof, be sentenced to pay a fine of not less than
- 13 three hundred dollars (\$300) nor more than one thousand five
- 14 <u>hundred dollars (\$1,500) and, in default thereof, to undergo</u>
- 15 imprisonment of not less than five days (5) nor more than thirty
- 16 (30) days. The penalties imposed by this section shall be in
- 17 addition to any other penalties imposed by this article. The
- 18 <u>Secretary of Revenue may designate employes of the department to</u>
- 19 enforce the provisions of this subsection. The employes shall
- 20 exhibit proof of and be within the scope of the designation when
- 21 <u>instituting proceedings as provided by the Pennsylvania Rules of</u>
- 22 Criminal Procedure.
- 23 Section 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
