AN ACT

- Amending the act of October 18, 1988 (P.L.756, No.108), entitled "An act providing for the cleanup of hazardous waste sites; 2 providing further powers and duties of the Department of 3 Environmental Resources and the Environmental Quality Board; providing for response and investigations for liability and cost recovery; establishing the Hazardous Sites Cleanup Fund; 6 providing for certain fees and for enforcement, remedies and 7 penalties; and repealing certain provisions relating to the 8 rate of the capital stock franchise tax," in preliminary 9 provisions, further providing for definitions and providing 10 for Governor may declare disaster emergency. 11 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania

- 13 hereby enacts as follows:
- 14 Section 1. Section 103 of the act of October 18, 1988
- 15 (P.L.756, No.108), known as the Hazardous Sites Cleanup Act, is
- amended by adding a definition to read: 16
- Section 103. Definitions. 17
- 18 The following words and phrases when used in this act shall
- 19 have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
- 20 context clearly indicates otherwise:

- 2.2 "Special drinking water resource-impacted community." A

- 1 municipality whose surface or groundwater resources used for
- 2 <u>public drinking water supply purposes have been impaired by</u>
- 3 emerging contaminants, methane or other gases or catastrophic
- 4 releases of pollutants to such water resources for which
- 5 <u>treatment or alternative water supply development or procurement</u>
- 6 <u>is required on an emergency basis to protect public health and</u>
- 7 safety.

- 9 Section 2. The act is amended by adding a section to read:
- 10 <u>Section 105. Governor may declare disaster emergency.</u>
- 11 <u>(a) General rule. -- The Governor shall have emergency</u>
- 12 <u>authority in accordance with 35 Pa.C.S. § 7301 (relating to</u>
- 13 general authority of Governor) to declare any municipality a
- 14 special drinking water resource-impacted community based on the
- 15 <u>discovery of a release or threatened release of hazardous</u>
- 16 <u>substances</u>, a <u>polyfluoroalkyl substance or perfluorinated</u>
- 17 chemical, including, but not limited to, perfluorooctane
- 18 sulfonate (PFOS) and perfluorooctanoic acid (PFOA), if PFOS and
- 19 PFOA are present in groundwater or surface water measured at or
- 20 above 15 parts per trillion, individually or in the aggregate,
- 21 or other pollutants in or to the municipality's public water
- 22 <u>supply system.</u>
- 23 (b) Special drinking water resource-impacted communities.--
- 24 The Governor may establish alternative or incident-specific
- 25 drinking water standards and cleanup standards for impaired
- 26 surface or groundwater resources in a special drinking water
- 27 <u>resource-impacted community. Standards established in accordance</u>
- 28 with this section shall take effect immediately upon
- 29 <u>establishment by the Governor and remain in effect for 24 months</u>
- 30 or until such time as the Governor has rescinded or amended the

- 1 standard, the emergency condition and public health threat has
- 2 been abated or, with respect to drinking water resources, either
- 3 <u>a final rulemaking is published by the Environmental Quality</u>
- 4 Board establishing a maximum contaminant level for the substance
- 5 under provisions of the act of May 1, 1984 (P.L.206, No.43),
- 6 known as the Pennsylvania Safe Drinking Water Act or a final
- 7 <u>rulemaking is published by the Environmental Protection Agency</u>
- 8 <u>establishing a maximum contaminant level.</u>
- 9 (c) Grants.--Special drinking water resource-impacted
- 10 communities shall be eligible to receive PENNVEST grants of up
- 11 to \$???? per impacted water supply source. The grants may be
- 12 used to provide treatment to impacted public water supplies,
- 13 <u>extension of water lines, booster stations, pressure management</u>
- 14 equipment, interconnection of private water users to public
- 15 water supply systems and analytical sampling and to procure
- 16 <u>alternative water supply resources.</u>
- 17 Section 3. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
