AN ACT

1 2 3	Establishing the Pennsylvania Clean Water Procurement Program and the Watershed Innovation and Improvement Fund; and making an appropriation.
4	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
5	hereby enacts as follows:
6	Section 1. Short title.
7	This act shall be known and may be cited as the Pennsylvania
8	Clean Water Procurement Program Act.
9	Section 2. Definitions.
10	The following words and phrases when used in this act shall
11	have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
12	context clearly indicates otherwise:
13	"Aggregator." A person that arranges for the sale of
14	nutrient and sediment reductions generated by another person.
15	The term includes an agricultural business acting on behalf of
16	farmers via a production contract or cooperative membership.
17	"Authority." The Pennsylvania Infrastructure Investment
18	Authority.

"Chesapeake Bay TMDL." The Chesapeake Bay TMDL for nitrogen,
 phosphorus and sediment as established by the United States
 Environmental Protection Agency on December 29, 2010.

4 "Department." The Department of Environmental Protection of5 the Commonwealth.

6 "Fund." The Watershed Innovation and Improvement Fund 7 established under section 3.

8 "Nutrient." Nitrogen or phosphorous.

9 "Nutrient or sediment reductions." Nitrogen, phosphorus and 10 sediment pollution load reductions to surface water and 11 groundwater resources that can be directly measured and 12 quantified or modeled by any of the following:

13

(1) The Chesapeake Bay Program Watershed Model.

14 (2) Any other model approved by the United States
15 Environmental Protection Agency or the department, including,
16 but not limited to, nonpoint source phosphorous, nitrogen and
17 sediment loads to surface water and groundwater resources and
18 pathogens using quantification methodologies and modeling
19 tools.

20 "Program." The Pennsylvania Clean Water Procurement Program21 established under section 4.

22 "Qualified bidder." A bidder with an approved verification 23 plan.

Request for proposals." A request for competitive sealed proposals that define contract terms, future delivery dates and technical specifications that is issued by the authority, in conjunction with the department, to procure verified nutrient and sediment reductions that count toward achievement of the Chesapeake Bay TMDL nutrient and sediment pollutant reduction requirements.

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"Sediment." Soils or other erodible materials transported by
 water as a product of erosion.

3 "Small farm." An agricultural operation that is not large
4 enough to meet the definition of CAFO as set forth in 25 Pa.
5 Code § 92a.2 (relating to definitions).

6 "TMDL." Total maximum daily load.

7 "Verification plan." As follows:

8 (1) A plan that details the method that a qualified 9 bidder will use to produce verified nutrient or sediment 10 reductions, including mass balance calculation.

11 (2) In the case of an aggregator, a plan as specified 12 under paragraph (1) that describes the process that the 13 aggregator will use to certify verified nutrient or sediment 14 reductions from approved contracting parties under section 15 4(b)(4), including the aggregator's contract farmers, 16 cooperative members or other similar entities.

17 "Verified nutrient and sediment reductions." Nutrient or 18 sediment reductions measured in pounds created by an action, 19 activity or technology pursuant to a verification plan and 20 approved by the department.

21 Section 3. Watershed Innovation and Improvement Fund.

(a) Establishment.--The Watershed Innovation and ImprovementFund is established in the State Treasury.

(b) Source of funding.--The fund shall consist of appropriations made to the fund and interest earned on money in the fund.

(c) Appropriation.--The sum of \$20,000,000 is hereby
appropriated from the General Fund to the fund for the purposes
specified under subsection (d).

30 (d) Use of fund.--The following apply:

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1 (1) Except as provided under paragraph (2), money in the 2 fund shall be used by the authority for the purchase of 3 verified nutrient and sediment reductions under section 4.

4 (2) No more than 5% of the money in the fund may be used
5 by the department and the authority to implement the program.
6 Section 4. Pennsylvania Clean Water Procurement Program.

7 Establishment.--The Pennsylvania Clean Water Procurement (a) 8 Program is established and shall provide for the purchase of verified nutrient and sediment reductions from approved 9 10 contracting parties through a competitive sealed proposal 11 procurement procedure consistent with 62 Pa.C.S. Pt. I (relating 12 to Commonwealth Procurement Code) or any other competitive bidding process determined to be appropriate by the authority. 13 14 Duties of authority. -- The authority shall have all of (b) 15 the following duties:

(1) Within 60 days of an appropriation to the fund, in
consultation with the department, issue a request for
proposals or initiate a competitive bidding process under 62
Pa.C.S. Pt. I for the supply of long-term nutrient and
sediment reductions for future delivery to accelerate
progress towards the achievement of the Chesapeake Bay TMDL
nutrient and sediment pollutant reduction requirements.

23 (2) Administer the fund for the purpose of implementing24 this act.

(3) Evaluate the responses to the request for proposals
or competitive bidding process under paragraph (1) and
execute contracts with verified nutrient and sediment
reduction producers or aggregators. Contracts under this
paragraph shall be for at least 10 years and shall provide
sufficient time for the construction and permitting of

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1 facilities and the delivery of verified nutrient and 2 sediment reductions.

3 (4) Require a contracting party for the supply of longterm nutrient and sediment reductions to make available 20% 4 of its total nutrient or sediment reduction allotment for 5 6 participation for 30 days by small farms or aggregators of 7 small farms. The purpose of this requirement is to enable 8 small farms or aggregators of small farms to sell their 9 credits from modeled reductions into the nutrient or 10 sediment reduction allotment and receive the winning bid 11 price without participating in the request for proposals or 12 competitive bidding process under paragraph (1).

13 (5) Purchase verified nutrient and sediment reductions 14 in accordance with the terms of the contracts under 15 paragraph (3) after the department has verified the nutrient and sediment reductions. The verification of nutrient and 16 17 sediment reductions shall be performed monthly, based upon 18 required data submissions from nutrient credit generators 19 certified by the department.

20 (c) Publicly funded reductions. -- Nutrient and sediment reductions funded entirely by public grants are not eligible to 21 bid or respond to the request for proposals or competitive 22 23 bidding process under subsection (b)(1). If a percentage of 24 nutrient and sediment reductions are funded partially by public 25 grants, the percentage of the remaining nutrient and sediment 26 reductions that are eligible to bid or respond to a request for proposals or competitive bidding process under subsection (b)(1) 27 28 shall be commensurate with the percentage of the reduction 29 activity that is not provided by public grants.

30 (d) Criteria.--The criteria for the evaluation of responses 20190HB1642PN2168

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1 to the request for proposals or competitive bidding process
2 under subsection (b)(1) and the weighted percentage to be
3 applied to each factor in the evaluation of the responses shall
4 be published by the department as part of the request for
5 proposals or competitive bidding process under subsection (b)(1)
6 and include, but not be limited to, all of the following:

7 (1) The environmental and recreational benefits to this
8 Commonwealth and local communities resulting from the
9 nutrient and sediment reduction activities.

10 (2) The cost effectiveness of the proposed nutrient and11 sediment reduction activity.

12 (3) Any additional criteria determined relevant and13 necessary by the department.

14 (e) Annual report.--The authority shall publish and make
15 available to the public an annual report on the program
16 detailing all of following information for the prior year:

17

(1) The total cost for the program.

18 (2) The nutrient and sediment reduction activities19 implemented.

(3) The verified nutrient and sediment reductions
 achieved towards the satisfaction of the Chesapeake Bay TMDL
 nutrient and sediment pollutant reduction requirements.

23 (4) The total cost for each verified nutrient and24 sediment reduction.

25 Section 5. Duties of department.

26 The department shall have all of the following duties:

27 (1) Administer the program and take any action necessary28 to effectuate the purposes of this act.

29 (2) Verify the generated nutrient and sediment load
 30 reductions achieved by a contracting party under section 4(b)

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1 (4).

(3) Review and approve the verification plans and mass
balance calculations submitted with the responses to the
request for proposals or competitive bidding process under
section 4(b)(1) and advise the authority regarding the
acceptability of the verification plans and mass balance
calculations.

8 (4) Evaluate the responses to the request for proposals 9 or competitive bidding process based on the criteria under 10 section 4(d), other than the price considerations, and advise 11 the authority regarding the acceptability of the responses. 12 Section 6. Regulations.

13 The department may promulgate regulations necessary to 14 administer the provisions of this act.

15 Section 7. Effective date.

16 This act shall take effect in 60 days.
