AN ACT

Amending the act of August 9, 1955 (P.L.323, No.130), entitled, as amended, "An act relating to counties of the first, third, fourth, fifth, sixth, seventh and eighth classes; amending, 3 revising, consolidating and changing the laws relating 4 thereto; relating to imposition of excise taxes by counties, including authorizing imposition of an excise tax on the 7 rental of motor vehicles by counties of the first class; and providing for regional renaissance initiatives," further 8 providing for authorization of hotel tax. 10 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 11 hereby enacts as follows: 12 Section 1. The definitions of "hotel," "occupancy" and "permanent resident" in section 1770.6(f) of the act of August 13 9, 1955 (P.L.323, No.130), known as The County Code, amended or 14 added December 22, 2000 (P.L.1019, No.142) and July 5, 2005 15 16 (P.L.38, No.12), are amended and the subsection is amended by 17 adding a definition to read: Section 1770.6. Authorization of Hotel Tax. --* * * 18

(f) Definitions. -- As used in this section, the following

- 1 words and phrases shall have the meanings given to them in this
- 2 subsection:
- 3 * * *
- 4 <u>"Domicile." The place where a person has a true and fixed</u>
- 5 home and principal establishment for an indefinite time and to
- 6 which, whenever absent, that person intends to return. Domicile
- 7 continues until another place of domicile is established. The
- 8 term domicile shall not include a person or business domiciled
- 9 <u>outside of this Commonwealth who rents or utilizes a room or any</u>
- 10 portion of a hotel for a period in excess of thirty days. In the
- 11 case of a business, domicile shall be that place where a
- 12 business' executive offices and executives' direct support staff
- 13 are located and where most, if not all, of the corporate
- 14 functions of the business are conducted or coordinated.
- "Hotel." A hotel, motel, bed and breakfast, homestead, inn,
- 16 guest house or other structure which holds itself out by any
- 17 means, including advertising, license, registration with an
- 18 innkeepers' group, convention listing association, travel
- 19 publication or similar association or with a government agency,
- 20 as being available to provide overnight lodging or use of
- 21 facility space for consideration to persons seeking temporary
- 22 accommodation; any place which advertises to the public at large
- 23 or any segment thereof that it will provide beds, sanitary
- 24 facilities or other space for a temporary period to members of
- 25 the public at large; or any place recognized as a hostelry. The
- 26 term does not include:
- 27 (1) any portion of a facility that is occupied for more than
- 28 thirty days by persons who are domiciled in this Commonwealth or
- 29 devoted to persons who [have an established permanent residence
- 30 or] are not domiciled in this Commonwealth, but who have been

- 1 granted a protection order by the court in accordance with 23
- 2 Pa.C.S. Ch. 61 (relating to protection from abuse) or by a
- 3 <u>comparable court in another state or persons who have left a</u>
- 4 <u>residence or household to avoid further abuse;</u>
- 5 (2) a college or university student residence hall [or];
- 6 (3) any private campground or any cabins, public campgrounds
- 7 or other facilities located on State land;
- 8 (4) any room of a hotel that is occupied by a member of the
- 9 armed forces of the United States, a reserve component or the
- 10 National Guard who is on active duty; or
- 11 (5) any room of a hotel that is occupied by persons seeking
- 12 temporary accommodations due to a declaration of a disaster
- 13 emergency by the governor in accordance with 35 Pa.C.S. § 7301
- 14 <u>(relating to general authority of governor) or a declaration of</u>
- 15 <u>a major disaster emergency by the President of the United States</u>
- 16 as defined under The Robert T. Stafford Disaster Relief and
- 17 Emergency Assistance Act (Public Law 93-288, 88 Stat. 143),
- 18 including any room that is occupied by emergency responders as
- 19 defined in 35 Pa.C.S. § 7332 (relating to definitions) due to an
- 20 <u>emergency declaration</u>, <u>regardless of whether such emergency</u>
- 21 responders are domiciled within or outside this Commonwealth.
- "Occupancy." The use or possession or the right to the use
- 23 or possession by any person [other than a permanent resident] of
- 24 any room in a hotel for any purpose or the right to the use or
- 25 possession of the furnishings or to the services accompanying
- 26 the use and possession of the room.

- ["Permanent resident." A person who has occupied or has the
- 29 right to occupancy of a room or rooms in a hotel as a patron or
- 30 otherwise for a period exceeding thirty consecutive days.]

- 2 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
