- Amending the act of September 27, 1961 (P.L.1700, No.699), entitled "An act relating to the regulation of the practice of pharmacy, including the sales, use and distribution of drugs and devices at retail; and amending, revising, consolidating and repealing certain laws relating thereto," providing for nonresident pharmacies. 7 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows: 8 9 Section 1. Section 2 of the act of September 27, 1961 10 (P.L.1700, No.699), known as the Pharmacy Act, is amended by 11 adding a clause to read: 12 Section 2. - 3 (K) EVERY PHARMACY THAT IS ALSO LICENSED, PERMITTED OR
- 4 REGISTERED BY THE PROPER LICENSING AUTHORITY OF ANOTHER STATE TO
- 5 SHIP, MAIL OR DELIVER LEGEND DEVICES OR LEGEND DRUGS TO PATIENTS

- 14 <u>Section 4.1. Nonresident Pharmacies.--(a) A nonresident</u>
- 15 pharmacy shall register ON A BIENNIAL BASIS with the board and <--
- 16 obtain a certificate of registration to conduct a pharmacy in
- 17 <u>accordance with this section. The nonresident pharmacy shall:</u>
- 18 <u>(1) Disclose annually in a report to the board ON THE</u> <--

- 6 board, submit a copy of the most recent inspection report
- 7 resulting from an inspection conducted by the regulatory or
- 8 <u>licensing agency of the state in which the nonresident pharmacy</u>
- 9 is located OR BY THE NATIONAL ASSOCIATION OF BOARDS OF
- 10 PHARMACY'S VERIFIED PHARMACY PROGRAM.
- 11 (b) A nonresident pharmacy shall, during its regular hours
- 12 of operation, but not less than six days per week, and for a
- 13 minimum of forty hours per week, provide a toll-free telephone
- 14 <u>number to facilitate communication between patients in this</u>
- 15 Commonwealth and a pharmacist at the nonresident pharmacy WHO IS <--
- 16 LICENSED IN THIS COMMONWEALTH OR IN THE STATE IN WHICH THE
- 17 NONRESIDENT PHARMACY IS LOCATED AND who has access to the
- 18 patient's records. The toll-free telephone number shall be
- 19 disclosed on a label affixed to each container of drugs
- 20 dispensed to patients in this Commonwealth.
- 21 (C) A NONRESIDENT PHARMACY SHALL REPORT TO THE BOARD WITHIN <--

- 22 THIRTY DAYS OF FINAL DISPOSITION ANY DISCIPLINARY ACTION TAKEN
- 23 BY THE REGULATORY OR LICENSING AGENCY OF THE STATE IN WHICH THE
- 24 NONRESIDENT PHARMACY IS LOCATED.
- 25 (c) (D) A nonresident pharmacy may not engage in the
- 26 business of shipping, mailing or delivering legend devices or
- 27 <u>legend drugs in this Commonwealth unless the nonresident</u>
- 28 pharmacy has been issued a certificate of registration by the
- 29 board and has paid the fee established by the board by
- 30 regulation for issuance or renewal of the certificate of

- 1 registration. Applications for a certificate of registration OR <--
- 2 RENEWAL as a nonresident pharmacy shall be made on a form
- 3 furnished by the board. The board may require the information it
- 4 <u>deems reasonably necessary to carry out the purpose of this</u>
- 5 <u>section</u>.
- 6 (E) The board may deny, revoke or suspend any
- 7 <u>certificate of registration as a nonresident pharmacy for</u>
- 8 <u>failure to comply with any requirement of this section.</u>
- 9 (e) (F) The board may deny, revoke or suspend any <--
- 10 certificate of registration as a nonresident pharmacy for
- 11 conduct which causes serious bodily or serious psychological
- 12 <u>injury to a resident of this Commonwealth if PROVIDED THAT the</u> <--
- 13 board has referred the matter to the regulatory or licensing
- 14 agency in the state in which the nonresident pharmacy is
- 15 located. and the regulatory or licensing agency fails to:
- 16 <u>(1) Initiate an investigation within forty five days of</u>
- 17 referral;
- 18 (2) Complete its investigation within one hundred twenty
- 19 days of referral;
- 20 (3) Resolve the referral through formal agreement,
- 21 settlement or decision within one hundred eighty days; or
- 22 (4) Initiate disciplinary proceedings when the proceedings
- 23 are determined to be necessary in the judgment of the regulatory
- 24 or licensing agency in the state in which the nonresident
- 25 pharmacy is located.
- 26 (G) THE BOARD MAY DENY, REVOKE OR SUSPEND ANY CERTIFICATE OF <--
- 27 REGISTRATION AS A NONRESIDENT PHARMACY UPON PROOF SATISFACTORY
- 28 TO THE BOARD THAT THE NONRESIDENT PHARMACY HAS HAD ITS PERMIT TO
- 29 CONDUCT A PHARMACY SUSPENDED, REVOKED OR OTHERWISE DISCIPLINED
- 30 BY THE PROPER LICENSING AUTHORITY OF ANOTHER STATE.

- 1 (H) It shall be unlawful for any nonresident pharmacy <--
- 2 <u>which has not been issued a certificate of registration pursuant</u>
- 3 to this section to advertise its services in this Commonwealth,
- 4 or for any person who is a resident of this Commonwealth to
- 5 advertise the pharmacy services of a nonresident pharmacy which
- 6 has not received a certificate of registration from the board,
- 7 with the knowledge that the advertisement will or is likely to
- 8 <u>induce members of the public in this Commonwealth to use the</u>
- 9 pharmacy for dispensing prescriptions.
