#### AN ACT

1 2 3 4 5 6 7	Amending the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), entitled "An act relating to the public school system, including certain provisions applicable as well to private and parochial schools; amending, revising, consolidating and changing the laws relating thereto," in certification of teachers, further providing for certificates qualifying persons to teach and providing for special temporary certificate for veterans.
8	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
9	hereby enacts as follows:
10	Section 1. Section 1201 of the act of March 10, 1949
11	(P.L.30, No.14), known as the Public School Code of 1949, is
12	amended to read:
13	Section 1201. Certificates Qualifying Persons to Teach
14	Only those persons holding one of the following certificates
15	shall be qualified to teach in the public schools of this
16	Commonwealth(1) Permanent college certificate, (2) provisional
17	college certificate, (3) normal school diploma, (4) normal
18	school certificate, (5) special permanent certificate, (6)
19	special temporary certificate, (7) permanent State certificate,
20	(8) residency certificate, (9) intern certificate, (10)

certificates which are permanent licenses to teach by virtue of 1 2 the provisions of section one thousand three hundred eight of 3 the act, approved the eighteenth day of May, one thousand nine hundred eleven (Pamphlet Laws 309), as amended, which is 4 repealed hereby, (10.1) special temporary certificate for 5 veterans or (11) such other kinds of certificates as are issued 6 7 under the standards prescribed by the State Board of Education. 8 The State Board of Education shall also provide for issuance of certificates by district superintendents to meet such 9 10 emergencies or shortage of teachers as may occur. 11 Section 2. The act is amended by adding a section to read: 12 Section 1207.5. Special Temporary Certificate for Veterans.--(a) Notwithstanding any other provision of law to 13 14 the contrary, the secretary, in conjunction with the State Board 15 of Education, shall develop a special temporary certificate for 16 veterans. The special temporary certificate program shall provide an alternative pathway for an eligible veteran to earn 17 18 an Instructional I Certificate. 19 (b) The secretary shall: (1) Evaluate and approve qualified providers for a special 20 21 temporary certificate for veterans. 22 (2) Adopt standards and quidelines as necessary to implement 23 a program for a special temporary certificate for veterans. The 24 program standards and guidelines shall address: (i) Instruction and training in the following: 25 26 (A) Educational strategies for the designated subject area. 27 (B) Child development specifically related to the level of 28 the certificate sought. 29 (C) Professional ethics and responsibilities. 30 (D) Pennsylvania academic standards.

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1	(E) Assessment knowledge and skills.
2	(F) Accommodations and adaptations for students with
3	<u>disabilities in an inclusive setting.</u>
4	(G) Strategies for meeting instructional needs of English
5	language learners.
6	(ii) Requirements for candidate oversight and mentoring that
7	may include field placement, student teaching, classroom
8	observations and ongoing support for novice educators in
9	partnership with school entities during their induction period,
10	including observation, consultation and assessment that includes
11	close supervision by a professional employe.
12	(3) Issue special temporary certificates for veterans in
13	accordance with this section.
14	(c) An individual who applies for a special temporary
15	certificate for veterans shall comply with all of the following:
16	(1) Satisfy the requirements specified under section 1209.
17	(2) Complete at least sixty (60) college credits with a
18	minimum grade point average of 3.0 on a 4.0 grade scale, as
19	provided by one or more accredited institutions of higher
20	education that the department has identified as having a quality
21	program resulting in a bachelor's degree or higher.
22	(3) Be continuously enrolled in an approved residency
23	program as developed by the department.
24	(4) Present evidence of satisfactory achievement on the
25	<u>appropriate subject area content test.</u>
26	(d) A certification program offered under this section shall
27	consist of flexible and accelerated pedagogical training to
28	candidates who have demonstrated subject matter competency in a
29	subject area related to their certification.
30	(e) The secretary may issue a special temporary certificate

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1	for veterans for service in a specific area of instruction to
2	candidates who satisfy the requirements under this section.
3	(f) A special temporary certificate for veterans shall be
4	valid for five (5) years of teaching in the public schools of
5	this Commonwealth in the area for which it applies.
6	(g) While teaching under a special temporary certificate for
7	veterans, the individual must be assigned a cooperating teacher
8	for a minimum of two (2) school years after commencing
9	employment.
10	(h) The program shall provide for the special temporary
11	certificate for veterans to be converted to an Instructional I
12	Certificate upon the completion of all program requirements as
13	developed by the department, in conjunction with the State Board
14	of Education, and the completion of two (2) years of
15	satisfactory teaching in school entities.
16	(i) At least one (1) year before a candidate's certificate
17	is set to expire, the department shall electronically notify the
18	candidate of the date on which the certificate will expire and
19	provide a list of each method by which the qualifications for an
20	Instructional I Certificate can be completed.
21	(j) The State Board of Education shall adopt rules to allow
22	the department to extend the validity period of a temporary
23	certificate for an additional two (2) years if the requirements
24	for the Instructional I Certificate cannot be completed due to
25	any of the following:
26	(1) A serious illness or injury of the candidate.
27	(2) Military service requirements of a veteran's spouse
28	serving in the United States Armed Forces, including a reserve
29	<u>component or National Guard.</u>
30	(3) Extraordinary extenuating circumstances. The department

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1	shall extend the special temporary certificate for veterans upon	
2	approval by the secretary.	
3	(k) A candidate shall be issued an Instructional I	
4	Certificate upon successful completion of the approved	
5	certification program provided that the candidate has satisfied	
6	the requirements of section 1209.	
7	(1) As used in this section, the following words and phrases	
8	shall have the meanings given to them in this subsection:	
9	"Candidate." A veteran who holds a special temporary	
10	certificate and seeks an Instructional I Certificate.	
11	"Cooperating teacher." An individual who satisfies all of	
12	the following:	
13	(1) Holds a certification under section 1201 in the subject	
14	area in which the individual will provide guidance to a student	
15	teacher.	
16	(2) Has received at least three (3) years of satisfactory	
17	ratings as a certified teacher.	
18	(3) Has at least one (1) year of certificated teaching	
19	experience in the school entity where the student teacher is	
20	placed.	
21	"Department." The Department of Education of the	
22	Commonwealth.	
23	"School entity." A public school, including a charter	
24	school, cyber charter school or regional charter school, private	
25	school, nonpublic school, intermediate unit or area career and	
26	technical school operating within this Commonwealth.	
27	"Secretary." The Secretary of Education of the Commonwealth.	
28	"Veteran." An individual who served in the United States	
29	Armed Forces, including a reserve component or National Guard,	
30	who was discharged or released under conditions other than	
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## 1 <u>dishonorable.</u>

2 Section 3. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
