Transfers from State Gaming Fund. 8 * * * 9 10 (c) Local law enforcement grants. --11 [Annually, the sum of \$2,000,000] BEGINNING WITH THE <-- $\frac{(1)}{(1)}$ 2016-2017 FISCAL YEAR, THE SUM OF \$4,000,000 shall be 12 13 transferred ANNUALLY to the board for the purpose of issuing <--14 grants to local law enforcement agencies to investigate 15 violations of and enforce laws relating to unlawful gambling 16 in this Commonwealth, INCLUDING, BUT NOT LIMITED TO, 18 <--PA.C.S. § 5511(H.1) AND (H.2) (RELATING TO CRUELTY TO 17

<u>ANIMALS)</u>. For purposes of this subsection, the term "local

- 1 law enforcement agency" shall include the Pennsylvania State
- 2 Police when conducting unlawful gambling enforcement and
- 3 prevention activities [in a municipality which does not have
- 4 a municipal police department and in which the Pennsylvania
- 5 State Police provide the municipality with primary police
- 6 coverage].
- 7 (2) On July 1 each fiscal year, any portion of the
- 8 amount transferred under subsection (a) that is unexpended,

- 9 unencumbered or uncommitted as of June 30 of the prior fiscal
- 10 year shall automatically lapse and be transferred to the
- 11 <u>Compulsive and Problem Gambling Treatment Fund established in</u>
- 12 <u>section 1509 (relating to compulsive and problem gambling</u>
- 13 program).

- 15 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days JULY 1, <--
- 16 2016, OR IMMEDIATELY, WHICHEVER IS LATER.
