Section 6503(a) and (a.1) of Title 75 of the 6 7 Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes are amended to read: § 6503. Subsequent convictions of certain offenses. 8 9 General offenses. -- [Every] Except as provided in 10 subsection (a.1), a person convicted of a second or subsequent 11 violation of any of the following provisions shall be sentenced 12 to pay a fine of not less than \$200 nor more than \$1,000 or to imprisonment for not more than six months, or both: 13 14 Section 1543(a) (relating to driving while operating 15 privilege is suspended or revoked) except as set forth in 16 subsection (a.1). - 7 (1) A person convicted of a sixth, seventh, eighth or
- 8 <u>ninth offense under section 1543(a) shall be sentenced to pay</u>
- 9 a fine of not less than \$1,000 and to imprisonment for not
- less than 30 days but not more than six months.

- less than \$2,500 and to imprisonment for not less than six
