AN ACT

- Amending Title 74 (Transportation) of the Pennsylvania
 Consolidated Statutes, establishing the Pavement Advisory
 Committee and providing for its powers and duties.

 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
 hereby enacts as follows:
- 6 Section 1. Title 74 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated
- 7 Statutes is amended by adding a chapter to read:

- 11 9701. Definitions.
- 12 9702. Pavement Advisory Committee.
- 13 <u>9703</u>. Powers and duties of committee.
- 14 <u>9704</u>. Reports.
- 15 <u>§ 9701. Definitions.</u>
- 16 The following words and phrases when used in this chapter
- 17 shall have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
- 18 context clearly indicates otherwise:

- 1 "Committee." The Pavement Advisory Committee established
- 2 under section 9702 (relating to Pavement Advisory Committee).
- 3 <u>"Department." The Department of Transportation of the</u>
- 4 Commonwealth.
- 5 § 9702. Pavement Advisory Committee.
- 6 (a) Establishment. -- The Pavement Advisory Committee is
- 7 <u>established under the jurisdiction of the department.</u>
- 8 (b) Composition of committee. -- The committee shall consist
- 9 of the following members:
- 10 (1) The Secretary of Transportation.
- 11 (2) The chairperson of the Pennsylvania Turnpike
- 12 <u>Commission</u>.
- 13 (3) The chairperson and minority chairperson of the
- 14 <u>Transportation Committee of the Senate.</u>
- 15 (4) The chairperson and minority chairperson of the
- 16 <u>Transportation Committee of the House of Representatives.</u>
- 17 (5) Six members from the pavement industry. Each member
- 18 representing the pavement industry shall be familiar with the
- 19 best practices in pavement procurement processes and pavement
- 20 maintenance and construction. The pavement industry members
- 21 shall be appointed by the Governor as follows:
- 22 (i) Three members representing the concrete pavement
- 23 industry.
- 24 (ii) Three members representing the asphalt pavement
- 25 industry.
- 26 (6) One member from the general public, to be appointed
- 27 by the Governor.
- 28 (c) Member alternates. -- Each member of the committee may
- 29 <u>designate an alternate to serve in the member's position on the</u>
- 30 committee. Each member shall notify the committee chair in

- 1 writing of the designation.
- 2 (d) Terms of appointees. -- The terms of all members of the
- 3 committee appointed by the Governor shall be for three years. A
- 4 member of the committee may be reappointed for additional terms.
- 5 An individual appointed to fill a vacancy shall serve for the
- 6 <u>unexpired term and shall be eligible for reappointment.</u>
- 7 <u>(e) Officers.--The members of the committee shall annually</u>
- 8 <u>elect a chairperson, a vice chairperson and a secretary from</u>
- 9 among the pavement industry members of the committee.
- 10 (f) Meetings.--
- 11 (1) The committee shall meet at least three times
- 12 <u>annually.</u>
- 13 (2) A member who misses three consecutive meetings
- 14 <u>without good cause acceptable to the chairperson may be</u>
- 15 replaced by the Governor.
- 16 (g) Expenses. -- The pavement industry members and the general
- 17 public member shall be allowed actual, necessary and reasonable
- 18 per diem expenses in accordance with regulations of the
- 19 Executive Board. The department shall provide appropriate staff
- 20 support to enable the committee to properly carry out its
- 21 <u>functions</u>.
- 22 § 9703. Powers and duties of committee.
- The committee shall assess, evaluate and make recommendations
- 24 related to the competitive pavement selection process,
- 25 including, but not limited to, the following:
- 26 (1) Reviewing and making recommendations on the usage of
- 27 <u>various pavement procurement processes to ensure that</u>
- 28 competition is achieved and to monitor the number of bids
- 29 <u>received on paving projects using various procurement</u>
- 30 processes.

- 1 (2) Reviewing pavement policies and practices and making
- 2 recommendations related to bringing a level of consistent
- 3 application across the department's engineering districts and
- 4 <u>the Pennsylvania Turnpike.</u>
- 5 (3) Studying the effect that competition, both inter-
- 6 <u>industry and intra-industry, has on the unit costs of</u>
- 7 pavement.
- 8 (4) Evaluating the cost per lane-mile-year of various
- 9 <u>pavement strategies.</u>
- 10 (5) Making recommendations to the department about cost
- savings as related to the Motor License Fund.
- 12 (6) Making recommendations for implementation of tools
- and new technologies that have the potential for stimulating
- 14 <u>pavement competition and achieving long-term savings.</u>
- 15 (7) Making recommendations for methods for improving
- 16 <u>safety and protecting the environment as related to surface</u>
- 17 characteristics and usage of pavement materials.
- 18 (8) Providing a forum for the exchange of information
- and making recommendations on the pavement selection process.
- 20 (9) Considering any other issue raised that is related
- 21 to the quality, usage and competitiveness of the pavement
- 22 industry.
- 23 § 9704. Reports.
- The committee shall submit reports of its deliberations and
- 25 conclusions to the Governor, members of the General Assembly and
- 26 State Transportation Commission.
- 27 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
