## AN ACT

Amending Title 18 (Crimes and Offenses) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in inchoate crimes, prohibiting the 2 possession of firearm at polling place. 3 4 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 5 hereby enacts as follows: 6 Section 1. Title 18 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated 7 Statutes is amended by adding a section to read: § 914. Possession of firearm at polling place. 8 9 (a) Offense defined. -- Except as provided under subsections 10 (c) and (d)(2), a person commits an offense if the person: (1) knowingly possesses a firearm in any building, real 11 12 property or parking area of a polling place holding an 13 election; 14 (2) knowingly possesses a firearm in any building, real 15 property or parking area of a polling place holding an election with the intent of using the firearm in the 16 17 commission of a crime; or

(3) knowingly causes a firearm to be used in the

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- 1 commission of a crime in any building, real property or
- 2 parking area of a polling place holding an election.
- 3 (b) Grading.--
- 4 (1) An offense committed under subsection (a) (1) shall
- 5 <u>constitute a misdemeanor of the third degree.</u>
- 6 (2) An offense committed under subsection (a) (2) or (3)
- 7 <u>shall constitute a misdemeanor of the first degree.</u>
- 8 (c) Exceptions. -- Subsection (a) shall not apply to the
- 9 <u>following:</u>
- 10 (1) The lawful performance of official duties by an
- officer, agent or employee of the Federal Government, the
- 12 <u>Commonwealth or a political subdivision of the Commonwealth</u>
- who is authorized to engage in or supervise the prevention,
- 14 <u>detection</u>, investigation or prosecution of any violation of
- 15 law.
- 16 (2) The lawful performance of official duties by a law
- 17 enforcement officer.
- 18 <u>(3) The concealment of a firearm inside a vehicle by a</u>
- 19 person who:
- 20 (i) possesses a valid and lawfully issued license to
- 21 carry a firearm; and
- (ii) owns the firearm.
- 23 (4) The concealment of a firearm by a member of the
- 24 Army, Navy, Marine Corps, Air Force or Coast Guard of the
- 25 <u>United States or the National Guard or organized reserves</u>
- 26 when on duty.
- 27 (d) Posting of notice.--
- 28 (1) Notice of the provisions of subsections (a), (b) and
- 29 (c) shall be posted conspicuously at each public entrance of
- 30 a building where a polling place is located during an

- 1 <u>election</u>.
- 2 (2) A person shall not be convicted of an offense under
- 3 subsection (a)(1) or (2) if the polling place fails to meet
- 4 <u>the notice requirements under paragraph (1).</u>
- 5 (e) Definitions. -- As used in this section, the following
- 6 words and phrases shall have the meanings given to them in this
- 7 <u>subsection unless the context clearly indicates otherwise:</u>
- 8 "Election." A general, municipal, special or primary
- 9 <u>election as authorized under the act of June 3, 1937 (P.L.1333,</u>
- 10 No.320), known as the Pennsylvania Election Code.
- 11 <u>"Firearm." Any weapon, including a starter gun, which will</u>
- 12 or is designed to expel a projectile or projectiles by the
- 13 action of an explosion, expansion of gas or escape of gas. The
- 14 term does not include any device designed or used exclusively
- 15 for the firing of stud cartridges, explosive rivets or similar
- 16 industrial ammunition.
- 17 <u>"Law enforcement officer." As the term "peace officer" is</u>
- 18 defined in section 501 (relating to definitions).
- 19 "Polling place." The room provided in each election district
- 20 for voting during an election.
- 21 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
