Amending Title 75 (Vehicles) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated 1 Statutes, in licensing of drivers, further providing for 2 issuance and content of driver's license. 3 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 4 5 hereby enacts as follows: Section 1. Section 1510 of Title 75 of the Pennsylvania 6 Consolidated Statutes is amended by adding a subsection to read: § 1510. Issuance and content of driver's license. 8 * * * 9 10 (a.2) Communication impairment designation .--11 (1) Beginning as soon as practicable, but no later than 12 18 months following the effective date of this subsection, the department shall issue a driver's license or 13 identification card that clearly indicates that the person 14 15 has a communication impairment. A qualified applicant is an 16 individual who has been diagnosed by a licensed medical 17 professional as deaf, having a hearing impairment or with 18 autism, Asperger's Syndrome or any other medical condition that substantially impairs the individual's ability to 19

- 2 (2) Upon receipt of an application from a qualified
- 3 applicant accompanied by such documentation as the department
- 4 <u>shall require, the department shall issue to the qualified</u>
- 5 <u>applicant a driver's license or identification card</u>
- 6 <u>displaying a communication impairment designation. There</u>
- 7 <u>shall be no fee for the designation under this subsection,</u>
- 8 <u>but the qualified applicant must pay any renewal or duplicate</u>
- 9 driver's license or identification card fees.
- 10 (3) A person who falsely represents himself as having a
- 11 <u>communication impairment as described in paragraph (1) on an</u>
- 12 application for a driver's license or identification card is
- subject to the penalty under 18 Pa.C.S. § 4904(b) (relating
- to unsworn falsification to authorities).
- 15 (4) Nothing in this subsection shall be construed to
- require an individual who has a communication impairment as
- 17 described in paragraph (1) to obtain the designation under
- 18 this subsection.
