## AN ACT

Amending the act of June 28, 1935 (P.L.477, No.193), entitled, as amended, "An act providing for the payment of the salary, 2 medical and hospital expenses of members of the State Police 3 Force, of the enforcement officers and investigators employed by the Pennsylvania Liquor Control Board, and the parole agents, enforcement officers and investigators of the 6 Pennsylvania Board of Probation and Parole, Capitol Police 7 8 officers, correction employes employed by the Department of Corrections whose principal duty is the care, custody and 9 control of inmates, psychiatric security aides employed by 10 the Department of Public Welfare and the Department of 11 Corrections whose principal duty is the care, custody, and 12 13 control of the criminally insane, drug enforcement agents of the Office of Attorney General whose principal duty is the 14 enforcement of the drug laws of the Commonwealth, special 15 agents of the Office of Attorney General whose principal duty 16 is the enforcement of the criminal laws of the Commonwealth, 17 members of the Delaware River Port Authority Police and of 18 19 policemen, firemen and park guards by the Commonwealth of 20 Pennsylvania, the Delaware River Port Authority, counties, 21 cities, boroughs, towns and townships, and sheriffs and 22 deputy sheriffs who are injured or contract certain diseases in the performance of their duty; and providing that absence 23 during such injury shall not reduce any usual sick leave 24 period," amending the title of the act; and providing for 25 eligibility of firemen of airport authorities, firemen 26 27 employed by the Commonwealth and emergency medical services personnel of cities; AND MAKING EDITORIAL CHANGES. <--28

- 1 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 2 hereby enacts as follows:
- 3 Section 1. The title and sections 1 and 2 of the act of June
- 4 28, 1935 (P.L.477, No.193), referred to as the Enforcement
- 5 Officer Disability Benefits Law, amended July 7, 2006 (P.L.614,
- 6 No.95), are amended to read:
- 7 AN ACT
- 8 Providing for the payment of the salary, medical and hospital
- 9 expenses of members of the State Police Force, of the
- 10 enforcement officers and investigators employed by the
- 11 Pennsylvania Liquor Control Board, and the parole agents,
- 12 enforcement officers and investigators of the Pennsylvania
- Board of Probation and Parole, Capitol Police officers,
- 14 correction employes employed by the Department of Corrections
- whose principal duty is the care, custody and control of
- inmates, psychiatric security aides employed by the
- Department of [Public Welfare] <u>HUMAN SERVICES</u> and the
- Department of Corrections whose principal duty is the care,

- 19 custody, and control of the criminally insane, drug
- 20 enforcement agents of the Office of Attorney General whose
- 21 principal duty is the enforcement of the drug laws of the
- 22 Commonwealth, special agents of the Office of Attorney
- 23 General whose principal duty is the enforcement of the
- criminal laws of the Commonwealth, members of the Delaware
- 25 River Port Authority Police and of policemen, firemen,
- 26 <u>firemen employed by the Commonwealth</u> and park guards by the
- 27 Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, the Delaware River Port
- Authority, counties, cities, boroughs, towns and townships,
- and sheriffs and deputy sheriffs who are injured or contract
- 30 certain diseases in the performance of their duty; and

- 1 providing that absence during such injury shall not reduce
- 2 any usual sick leave period.
- 3 Section 1. (a) Be it enacted, &c., That any member of the
- 4 State Police Force, any enforcement officer or investigator
- 5 employed by the Pennsylvania Liquor Control Board, and the
- 6 parole agents, enforcement officers and investigators of the
- 7 Pennsylvania Board of Probation and Parole, Capitol Police
- 8 officers, correction employes employed by the Department of
- 9 Corrections, whose principal duty is the care, custody and
- 10 control of inmates, psychiatric security aides employed by the
- 11 Department of [Public Welfare] HUMAN SERVICES and the Department <--
- 12 of Corrections, whose principal duty is the care, custody, and
- 13 control of the criminally insane, drug enforcement agents of the
- 14 Office of Attorney General whose principal duty is the
- 15 enforcement of the drug laws of the Commonwealth, special agents
- 16 of the Office of Attorney General whose principal duty is the
- 17 enforcement of the criminal laws of the Commonwealth, any member
- 18 of the Delaware River Port Authority Police, any policeman,
- 19 fireman or park guard of any county, city, borough, town or
- 20 township, firemen employed by the Commonwealth or any sheriff or
- 21 deputy sheriff who is injured in the performance of his duties
- 22 including, in the case of firemen, duty as special fire police,
- 23 and by reason thereof is temporarily incapacitated from
- 24 performing his duties, shall be paid by the Commonwealth of
- 25 Pennsylvania if a member of the State Police Force or an
- 26 enforcement officer or investigator employed by the Pennsylvania
- 27 Liquor Control Board or the parole agents, enforcement officers
- 28 and investigators of the Pennsylvania Board of Probation and
- 29 Parole, Capitol Police officers, correction employes employed by
- 30 the Department of Corrections, whose principal duty is the care,

- 1 custody and control of inmates, psychiatric security aides
- 2 employed by the Department of [Public Welfare] HUMAN SERVICES

- 3 and the Department of Corrections, whose principal duty is the
- 4 care, custody, and control of the criminally insane, drug
- 5 enforcement agents of the Office of Attorney General whose
- 6 principal duty is the enforcement of the drug laws of the
- 7 Commonwealth, special agents of the Office of Attorney General
- 8 whose principal duty is the enforcement of the criminal laws of
- 9 the Commonwealth, or by the Delaware River Port Authority if a
- 10 member of the Delaware River Port Authority Police or by the
- 11 county, township or municipality, by which he is employed, his
- 12 full rate of salary, as fixed by ordinance or resolution, until
- 13 the disability arising therefrom has ceased. All medical and
- 14 hospital bills, incurred in connection with any such injury,
- 15 shall be paid by the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania or by the
- 16 Delaware River Port Authority or by such county, city, township
- 17 or municipality. During the time salary for temporary incapacity
- 18 shall be paid by the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania or by the
- 19 Delaware River Port Authority or by the county, city, borough,
- 20 town or township, any workmen's compensation, received or
- 21 collected by any such employe for such period, shall be turned
- 22 over to the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania or to the Delaware
- 23 River Port Authority or to such county, city, borough, town or
- 24 township, and paid into the treasury thereof, and if such
- 25 payment shall not be so made by the employe the amount so due
- 26 the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, the Delaware River Port
- 27 Authority or the county, city, borough, town or township shall
- 28 be deducted from any salary then or thereafter becoming due and
- 29 owing.
- 30 (b) In the case of the State Police Force, enforcement

- 1 officers and investigators employed by the Pennsylvania Liquor
- 2 Control Board and the parole agents, enforcement officers and
- 3 investigators of the Pennsylvania Board of Probation and Parole,
- 4 Capitol Police officers, correction employes employed by the
- 5 Department of Corrections, whose principal duty is the care,
- 6 custody and control of inmates, psychiatric security aides
- 7 employed by the Department of [Public Welfare] HUMAN SERVICES

- 8 and the Department of Corrections whose principal duty is the
- 9 care, custody, and control of the criminally insane, drug
- 10 enforcement agents of the Office of Attorney General whose
- 11 principal duty is the enforcement of the drug laws of the
- 12 Commonwealth, special agents of the Office of Attorney General
- 13 whose principal duty is the enforcement of the criminal laws of
- 14 the Commonwealth, members of the Delaware River Port Authority
- 15 Police, salaried policemen [and], firemen, firemen employed by
- 16 the Commonwealth and sheriffs and deputy sheriffs who have
- 17 served for four consecutive years or longer, diseases of the
- 18 heart and tuberculosis of the respiratory system, contracted or
- 19 incurred by any of them after four years of continuous service
- 20 as such, and caused by extreme overexertion in times of stress
- 21 or danger or by exposure to heat, smoke, fumes or gases, arising
- 22 directly out of the employment of any such member of the State
- 23 Police Force, enforcement officer, investigator employed by the
- 24 Pennsylvania Liquor Control Board, guard or enforcement officer
- 25 employed by the Department of Corrections or parole agent,
- 26 enforcement officer or investigator of the Pennsylvania Board of
- 27 Probation and Parole, Capitol Police officers, correction
- 28 employes employed by the Department of Corrections whose
- 29 principal duty is the care, custody and control of inmates,
- 30 psychiatric security aides employed by the Department of [Public <--

- 1 Welfare] HUMAN SERVICES and the Department of Corrections whose <--
- 2 principal duty is the care, custody, and control of the
- 3 criminally insane, drug enforcement agents of the Office of
- 4 Attorney General whose principal duty is the enforcement of the
- 5 drug laws of the Commonwealth, special agents of the Office of
- 6 Attorney General whose principal duty is the enforcement of the
- 7 criminal laws of the Commonwealth, member of the Delaware River
- 8 Port Authority Police, policeman [or], fireman, firemen employed
- 9 by the Commonwealth or sheriff or deputy sheriff shall be
- 10 compensable in accordance with the terms hereof; and unless any
- 11 such disability shall be compensable under the compensation laws
- 12 as having been caused by accidental injury, such disability
- 13 shall be compensable as occupational disease disabilities are
- 14 presently compensable under the compensation laws of this
- 15 Commonwealth. It shall be presumed that tuberculosis of the
- 16 respiratory system contracted or incurred after four consecutive
- 17 years of service was contracted or incurred as a direct result
- 18 of employment.
- 19 (c) In the case of any person receiving benefits pursuant to
- 20 this act, the statutes of limitations set forth in sections
- 21 306.1, 315, 413, and 434 of the act of June 2, 1915 (P.L.736,
- 22 No.338), known as the "Workers' Compensation Act," shall not
- 23 begin to run until the expiration of the receipt of benefits
- 24 pursuant to this act.
- 25 (d) All payments herein required to be made by the
- 26 Commonwealth of Pennsylvania on account of any member of the
- 27 State Police Force shall be made from moneys appropriated to the
- 28 Pennsylvania State Police, and any payments required to be made
- 29 on account of any enforcement officer or investigator employed
- 30 by the Pennsylvania Liquor Control Board shall be from

- 1 appropriations out of the State Stores Fund, any payments
- 2 required to be made on account of any parole agent, enforcement
- 3 officer or investigator employed by the Pennsylvania Board of
- 4 Probation and Parole shall be from moneys appropriated to the
- 5 Pennsylvania Board of Probation and Parole, any payments
- 6 required to be made on account of Capitol Police officers shall
- 7 be made from moneys appropriated to the Department of General
- 8 Services, any payments required to be made on account of any
- 9 correction employe shall be made from moneys appropriated to the
- 10 Department of Corrections, any payments required to be made on
- 11 account of any psychiatric security aides shall be made from
- 12 moneys appropriated to the Department of [Public Welfare] HUMAN <--
- 13 <u>SERVICES</u> or the Department of Corrections where appropriate, and
- 14 any payments required to be made on account of any drug
- 15 enforcement agent or special agents shall be made from moneys
- 16 appropriated to the Office of Attorney General and any payments

- 17 required to be made on account of any fireman employed by the
- 18 Commonwealth shall be made from moneys appropriated by the
- 19 General Assembly TO THE EMPLOYING AGENCY.
- 20 Section 2. No absence from duty of any such policeman,
- 21 sheriff, deputy sheriff [or], fireman or firemen employed by the
- 22 <u>Commonwealth</u> by reason of any such injury shall in any manner be
- 23 included in any period of sick leave, allowed such policeman,
- 24 sheriff, deputy sheriff [or], fireman or firemen employed by the
- 25 <u>Commonwealth</u> by law or by regulation of the police, sheriff's
- 26 [or], fire department, airport authority or city by which he is
- 27 employed.
- 28 Section 2. The act is amended by adding a section to read:
- 29 Section 2.1. For the purposes of this act, the term
- 30 <u>"fireman" shall mean and include the following:</u>

- 1 (1) Paid firemen not employed by the Commonwealth.
- 2 (2) Emergency medical services personnel employed within a
- 3 city fire department.
- 4 (3) Firemen of airport authorities, including fire
- 5 <u>suppression instructors</u>.
- 6 (4) Fire and safety marshals who are firemen employed by the
- 7 Commonwealth.
- 8 (5) Fire academy instructors employed at the State Fire
- 9 <u>Academy.</u>
- 10 (6) Assistant fire marshals employed by the Commonwealth.
- 11 (7) Forest patrolmen and forest technicians employed by the
- 12 <u>Commonwealth</u>.
- 13 Section 3. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
