AN ACT

- 1 Amending the act of June 13, 1967 (P.L.31, No.21), entitled "An
- act to consolidate, editorially revise, and codify the public
- welfare laws of the Commonwealth," in children and youth, providing for Statewide children's mental health ombudsman.
- 5 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 6 hereby enacts as follows:
- 7 Section 1. The act of June 13, 1967 (P.L.31, No.21), known
- 8 as the Human Services Code, is amended by adding a section to
- 9 read:
- 10 Section 710. Statewide Children's Mental Health Ombudsman.--
- 11 (a) The secretary, subject to THE appropriation OF STATE FUNDS <--
- 12 or the receipt of Federal funds, shall establish FOR a Statewide <--
- 13 children's mental health ombudsman, SHALL ESTABLISH A STATEWIDE <--
- 14 CHILDREN'S MENTAL HEALTH OMBUDSMAN for the following purposes:
- 15 (1) Advocating on behalf of children with mental health
- 16 disorders.
- 17 (2) Identifying barriers to effective mental health

- 1 treatment and proposed solutions.
- 2 (3) Monitoring and ensuring compliance with relevant
- 3 statutes, regulations, rules and policies pertaining to
- 4 children's behavioral health services.
- 5 (4) Receiving, investigating and resolving through
- 6 <u>administrative action</u>, as described under subsection (d),
- 7 complaints filed by a child or by individuals legally authorized
- 8 to act on behalf of the child, or by an individual, organization
- 9 or government agency that has reason to believe that an entity
- 10 regulated by the Commonwealth has engaged in activities,
- 11 practices or omissions that constitute violations of applicable
- 12 court orders, statutes or regulations or that may have an
- 13 <u>adverse effect upon the health, safety, welfare or rights of</u>
- 14 <u>children.</u>
- 15 (b) Within sixty days of the appropriation OF STATE FUNDS or <--
- 16 <u>receipt of Federal funds required under subsection (a) TO</u>
- 17 ESTABLISH A STATEWIDE CHILDREN'S MENTAL HEALTH OMBUDSMAN, the
- 18 secretary shall designate an individual to act as the ombudsman
- 19 who shall be qualified by training and experience to perform the
- 20 duties of the ombudsman.
- 21 (C) THE OMBUDSMAN SHALL REPORT TO THE SECRETARY AND THE <--
- 22 EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR OF THE GOVERNOR'S OFFICE OF ADVOCACY AND
- 23 REFORM OR ITS SUCCESSOR.
- 24 (c) (D) The ombudsman shall serve for a term of five years <--
- 25 <u>and shall continue to hold office until a successor is</u>
- 26 appointed. the THE secretary may reappoint the ombudsman for one <--
- 27 <u>additional term. The secretary may remove the ombudsman only for</u>
- 28 neglect of duty, misconduct or inability to perform duties.
- 29 (d) (E) The secretary, in consultation with the ombudsman, <--
- 30 the Deputy Secretary for Medical Assistance Programs and the <--

- 1 Director of the Bureau of Children's Behavioral Health Services
- 2 MENTAL HEALTH AND SUBSTANCE ABUSE SERVICES AND THE EXECUTIVE
- 3 <u>DIRECTOR OF THE GOVERNOR'S OFFICE OF ADVOCACY AND REFORM OR ITS</u>
- 4 SUCCESSOR, shall establish policies and procedures to facilitate
- 5 the purposes of the ombudsman. The policies and procedures shall
- 6 <u>include procedures for filing complaints</u>, investigating
- 7 complaints and taking action to implement resolutions to
- 8 complaints, including the use of State agency enforcement
- 9 authority to resolve complaints as recommended by the ombudsman.
- 10 (F) In ensuring that the goals of the ombudsman are met, <--
- 11 the following shall apply:
- 12 (1) The ombudsman shall monitor the development and
- 13 <u>implementation of Federal, State and local statutes, regulations</u>
- 14 and policies regarding services and supports for children with
- 15 mental health disorders, including the education of children
- 16 with mental health disorders.
- 17 (2) The ombudsman shall maintain complete records of
- 18 complaints received, the actions taken, findings, outcomes and
- 19 recommendations in response to any complaints and other actions,
- 20 including those taken by the Commonwealth and private agency
- 21 responses to serious complaints.
- 22 (3) Each quarter, the ombudsman shall send a report to each

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- 23 government agency about which a complaint was THAT WAS THE
- 24 SUBJECT OF A COMPLAINT received by the ombudsman during the
- 25 relevant period, listing the complaints involving that agency
- 26 which THAT were received during the past quarter, and. THE
- 27 OMBUDSMAN shall meet regularly with the secretary, the Deputy
- 28 Secretary for Medical Assistance Programs and the Director of <--
- 29 <u>the Bureau of Children's Behavioral Health Services MENTAL</u>
- 30 HEALTH AND SUBSTANCE ABUSE SERVICES AND THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

- 1 OF THE GOVERNOR'S OFFICE OF ADVOCACY AND REFORM OR ITS SUCCESSOR
- 2 and shall report on any Statewide problems that the ombudsman
- 3 <u>has identified and potential solutions.</u>
- 4 (4) The ombudsman shall report annually, within one hundred
- 5 twenty days of the end of the fiscal year, to the Governor, the
- 6 President pro tempore of the Senate, the Speaker of the House of
- 7 Representatives, the Majority Chairman and the Minority Chairman
- 8 of the Aging and Youth Committee of the Senate, the Majority
- 9 Chairman and the Minority Chairman of the Children and Youth
- 10 Committee of the House of Representatives, the Majority Chairman
- 11 and the Minority Chairman of the Education Committee of the
- 12 Senate, the Majority Chairman and Minority Chairman of the
- 13 Education Committee of the House of Representatives, the
- 14 Majority Chairman and the Minority Chairman of the Health and
- 15 <u>Human Services Committee of the Senate</u>, the Majority Chairman
- 16 and the Minority Chairman of the Health Committee of the House
- 17 of Representatives and the Majority Chairman and the Minority
- 18 Chairman of the Human Services Committee of the House of
- 19 Representatives, on the activities of the children's mental
- 20 health ombudsman, including complaints that are relevant to the
- 21 ombudsman and an analysis of patterns in complaints made through
- 22 the ombudsman and shall make recommendations for legislation,
- 23 policy or programmatic changes related to the protection of the
- 24 rights of children with mental health disorders. The report
- 25 <u>shall be made available to the public and published on the</u>
- 26 department's publicly accessible Internet website.
- 27 (f) (G) The department shall MAY promulgate regulations

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- 28 necessary for the implementation of this section.
- 29 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 90 days.
