8	hereby enacts as follows:
9	Section 1. The act of December 22, 1983 (P.L.327, No.85),
10	known as the Auctioneer Licensing and Trading Assistant
11	Registration Act, is amended by adding a section to read:
12	Section 17.1. Horses sold at auction.
13	(a) Duty of auction companyBefore any horse may be sold
14	at auction, the auction company shall determine whether the
15	horse has an implanted microchip or has been tattooed or branded
16	with any identifying mark. If the horse has an implanted
17	microchip, tattoo or brand, the auction company shall post, on
18	its publicly accessible Internet website, all identifying
19	information, including any identification number contained in
20	the microchip and a detailed description or photograph of any

1	<u>tattoo or brand found on the horse.</u>
2	(b) LimitationNo horse shall be offered for sale at
3	auction before 72 hours have elapsed following posting of the
4	horse's identifying information on the auction company's
5	publicly accessible Internet website.
6	(c) Required recordkeepingFor a minimum of one year
7	following the date of sale, for each horse sold at auction, an
8	auction company shall maintain appropriate records which
9	accurately document compliance with this section, including:
10	(1) The presence or absence of a microchip, tattoo or
11	brand.
12	(2) The date and time of the posting of the information
13	required by this section.
14	(3) The date and time each horse was sold at auction.
15	Section 2. This act shall take effect in one year.
