AN ACT

1 2	Amending the act of June 30, 1987 (P.L.163, No.16), entitled "An act providing for the revitalization of rural Pennsylvania;
3	establishing the Center for Rural Pennsylvania; providing for
4	rural education partnerships and adult literacy programs;
5	allocating funds appropriated to the Department of Commerce
6	for a Regional Center for Continuing Education of Health
7 8	Science Practitioners in western Pennsylvania; making appropriations; and making a repeal," establishing the Rural
9	Population Revitalization Commission and providing for duties
10	of the commission; and establishing the Rural Population
11	Revitalization Fund.
12	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
13	hereby enacts as follows:
14	Section 1. The act of June 30, 1987 (P.L.163, No.16), known
15	as the Rural Pennsylvania Revitalization Act, is amended by
16	adding a chapter to read:
17	CHAPTER 4
18	RURAL POPULATION REVITALIZATION COMMISSION
19	Section 401. Scope of chapter.
20	This chapter relates to the Rural Population Revitalization
21	Commission.

- 1 Section 402. Definitions.
- 2 The following words and phrases when used in this act shall
- 3 have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
- 4 context clearly indicates otherwise:
- 5 <u>"Commission." The Rural Population Revitalization Commission</u>
- 6 <u>established in section 403.</u>
- 7 "Rural county." A county located in this Commonwealth with a
- 8 population density less than 291 people per square mile, or as
- 9 <u>otherwise defined by the Center for Rural Pennsylvania.</u>
- 10 "Rural school district." A public school district located in
- 11 this Commonwealth with a population density less than 291 people
- 12 per square mile, or as otherwise defined by the Center for Rural
- 13 <u>Pennsylvania.</u>
- 14 Section 403. Establishment.
- The Rural Population Revitalization Commission is
- 16 established.
- 17 Section 404. Duties.
- 18 (a) Reviews and recommendations. -- After issuing an initial
- 19 report under subsection(b)(12), the commission shall issue a
- 20 biennial report on population change in rural areas of this
- 21 Commonwealth which shall include reviews and recommendations
- 22 aimed at attracting and retaining residents in rural
- 23 Pennsylvania while addressing challenges facing rural
- 24 communities due to population shifts and changing demographics.
- 25 Reviews and recommendations shall include, but not be limited
- 26 to, the following areas:
- 27 (1) Increasing participation in the Federal decennial
- census.
- 29 (2) Attracting and retaining residents in rural
- 30 Pennsylvania.

1	(3) Education and career opportunities.
2	(4) Access to health care.
3	(5) Affordable housing.
4	(6) Access to social services.
5	(7) Current issues facing rural Pennsylvania.
6	(8) Grant awards and tax credit opportunities for rural
7	Pennsylvania residents and businesses.
8	(9) Statutory and regulatory costs and impacts on rural
9	municipal governments, businesses and communities.
10	(10) Other issues facing rural Pennsylvania as
11	identified by the commission.
12	(b) Additional powers and duties The commission shall have
13	the following additional powers and duties:
14	(1) Review, make findings and offer recommendations
15	related to addressing and mitigating rural population shifts
16	in this Commonwealth.
17	(2) Consult with and utilize experts to assist the
18	commission in carrying out the duties under this subsection.
19	(3) Receive input from interested parties.
20	(4) Hold public hearings in different regions of this
21	Commonwealth. Virtual public hearings may be utilized by the
22	commission.
23	(5) Review and consider rural development strategies
24	utilized throughout the United States.
25	(6) Review the administration and operation of State and
26	regional programs and services and make recommendations to
27	implement new policies, statutes and regulations on improving
28	quality of life and attracting residents to rural
29	communities.
30	(7) Recommend proposed legislation and regulatory

1	changes based on the commission's findings.
2	(8) Create and maintain a database on rural
3	Pennsylvania's demographic conditions and trends.
4	(9) Establish subcommittees, including noncommission
5	members subject to the approval of the chairperson, to
6	address specific population change issues.
7	(10) Provide periodic estimates on the fiscal impact of
8	population changes to local governments, such as projected
9	changes in tax revenue resulting from population changes.
10	(11) Collect and distribute information about available
11	public grants, services and resources available to rural
12	communities.
13	(12) Not later than 90 days after the effective date of
14	this paragraph the commission shall convene its first meeting
15	under section 406 and no later than two years after the first
16	meeting the commission shall transmit an initial report of
17	the commission's findings and recommendations to the
18	<pre>following:</pre>
19	(i) The Governor.
20	(ii) All members of the Senate and the House of
21	Representatives.
22	(iii) The Center for Rural Pennsylvania's publicly
23	accessible Internet website.
24	Section 405. Membership.
25	(a) Members The commission shall consist of the following
26	members:
27	(1) Three individuals appointed by the Governor,
28	including one individual representing the State System of
29	<u>Higher Education.</u>
30	(2) Two members from the Senate appointed by the

1	President pro tempore of the Senate, one from the majority
2	party and one from the minority party.
3	(3) Two members from the House of Representatives
4	appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives, one
5	from the majority party and one from the minority party.
6	(4) The director of the Center for Rural Pennsylvania or
7	a designee.
8	(5) An individual selected by the chairperson from an
9	organization representing the interests of legal immigrants
10	in rural communities.
11	(6) A representative from the Pennsylvania Office of
12	Rural Health.
13	(7) A young adult selected from a Statewide general farm
14	organization selected by the chairperson.
15	(8) A representative from the County Commissioners
16	Association of Pennsylvania who holds office in a rural
17	county.
18	(9) A representative from the County Commissioners
19	Association of Pennsylvania's Human Services Committee from a
20	rural county.
21	(10) A representative from the Pennsylvania School
22	Boards Association from a rural school district.
23	(11) A representative from the Pennsylvania Chamber of
24	Business and Industry who resides in or operates a business
25	in a rural county.
26	(12) The executive director of the Rural Development
27	Council or a designee.
28	(13) A certified community health worker from a rural
29	county selected by the Pennsylvania Community Health Worker
30	Collaborative.

- 1 (b) Chairperson. -- The executive director of the Center for
- 2 Rural Pennsylvania shall serve as chairperson of the commission
- 3 until the commission elects a chairperson from the membership.
- 4 The members of the commission shall elect a vice chairperson
- 5 from among the members of the commission. The member elected
- 6 vice chairperson shall serve in that capacity for the ensuing
- 7 term.
- 8 (c) Considerations. -- Members appointed under subsection (a)
- 9 shall:
- 10 (1) have knowledge of problems facing rural communities
- in this Commonwealth;
- 12 (2) have experience in advocacy relating to rural
- 13 <u>issues; or</u>
- 14 (3) provide leadership in programs or activities that
- improve the quality of life for rural communities or attract
- 16 <u>and retain residents in rural Pennsylvania.</u>
- 17 (d) Terms.--The term of office of all members of the
- 18 commission shall be two years. Each member shall be eliqible to
- 19 be reappointed to the commission.
- 20 Section 406. Meetings.
- 21 The commission shall hold its first meeting within 90 days of
- 22 the effective date of this section, with quorum based upon the
- 23 majority of the members who have been appointed. The commission
- 24 shall hold meetings at the call of the chairperson on no less
- 25 than four different dates annually.
- 26 Section 407. Expenses.
- The members of the commission shall serve without salary or
- 28 compensation, but shall be entitled to expenses that are
- 29 <u>reasonable and necessary to perform their duties.</u>
- 30 Section 408. Administrative support.

- 1 The Center for Rural Pennsylvania staff shall provide
- 2 <u>administrative support, meeting space and any other assistance</u>
- 3 required by the commission to carry out the commission's duties
- 4 <u>under this chapter.</u>
- 5 <u>Section 409</u>. <u>Establishment of Rural Population Revitalization</u>
- Fund.
- 7 (a) Fund established. -- There is established the Rural
- 8 Population Revitalization Fund, which shall be an interest
- 9 <u>bearing restricted revenue account, in which shall be deposited</u>
- 10 as money is appropriated, given, granted or donated to the
- 11 commission, or to the programs provided for in Chapter 5, by the
- 12 Federal Government, the Commonwealth or any other governmental
- 13 <u>or private agency or person.</u>
- 14 (b) Use of fund. -- Money deposited into the fund and interest
- 15 earned on money deposited into the fund shall be used solely for
- 16 the purpose of carrying out the provisions of Chapters 4 and 5.
- 17 Section 410. Grants.
- 18 (a) Purpose. -- In exercising its powers and duties under the
- 19 provisions of this act and in order to improve planning
- 20 capabilities for rural communities impacted by population
- 21 shifts, the commission may make grants available in order to
- 22 fulfill the commission's duties under section 404.
- 23 (b) Grant quidelines. -- Any grant program proposed by the
- 24 commission shall not be established until rules and quidelines
- 25 are promulgated and approved by two-thirds of the members.
- 26 (c) Reporting. -- The commission shall publish an annual
- 27 report that includes the recipient, purpose and value of each
- 28 grant awarded.
- 29 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 180 days.
