AN ACT

- Amending the act of March 4, 1971 (P.L.6, No.2), entitled "An act relating to tax reform and State taxation by codifying 2 and enumerating certain subjects of taxation and imposing 3 taxes thereon; providing procedures for the payment, 4 collection, administration and enforcement thereof; providing 5 for tax credits in certain cases; conferring powers and 6 imposing duties upon the Department of Revenue, certain employers, fiduciaries, individuals, persons, corporations 8 and other entities; prescribing crimes, offenses and 9 penalties," in sales and use tax, further providing for 10 exclusions from tax. 11 12 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 13 hereby enacts as follows: 14 Section 1. Section 204 of the act of March 4, 1971 (P.L.6, 15 No.2), known as the Tax Reform Code of 1971, is amended by 16 adding a clause to read: Section 204. Exclusions from Tax. -- The tax imposed by 17 18 section 202 shall not be imposed upon any of the following: * * * 19 20 (71) The sale at retail or use of services related to the
- installation, maintenance or repair of solar energy devices. The 21

- 1 <u>Department of Environmental Protection shall establish standards</u>
- 2 with respect to the technical sufficiency of solar energy
- 3 systems for the purposes of this clause. For the purposes of
- 4 this clause, the term "solar energy devices" shall mean a system
- 5 or series of mechanisms designed primarily to provide heating or
- 6 cooling or to produce electrical or mechanical power by
- 7 <u>collecting and transferring solar-generated energy. The term</u>
- 8 <u>includes a mechanical or chemical device that has the ability to</u>
- 9 store solar-generated energy for use in heating or cooling or in
- 10 the production of power. This clause shall expire June 30, 2029.
- 11 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
