AN ACT

- 1 Designating the bridge, identified as Bridge Key 3937, carrying
- Pennsylvania Route 26 over Bloody Run in Everett Borough, Bedford County, as the PFC James E. Williams Memorial Bridge.
- 4 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 5 hereby enacts as follows:
- 6 Section 1. The PFC James E. Williams Memorial Bridge.
- 7 (a) Findings. -- The General Assembly finds and declares as
- 8 follows:
- 9 (1) PFC Jesse JAMES E. Williams, a native of Bedford <--
- 10 County, gave his life in service to his country during the
- 11 Korean War.
- 12 (2) PFC Williams served as a Light Weapons Infantryman
- with the 38th Infantry Regiment, 2nd Infantry Division.
- 14 (3) PFC Williams was captured and held by the Chinese as
- a prisoner of war for 27 months.
- 16 (4) On May 18, 1951, PFC Williams died while still in

- 1 captivity.
- 2 (5) PFC Williams was awarded the Purple Heart for his
- 3 valiant service.
- 4 (b) Designation. -- The bridge, identified as Bridge Key 3937,
- 5 carrying Pennsylvania Route 26 over Bloody Run in Everett
- 6 Borough, Bedford County, is designated as the PFC James E.
- 7 Williams Memorial Bridge.
- 8 (c) Signs.--The Department of Transportation shall erect and
- 9 maintain appropriate signs displaying the name of the bridge to
- 10 traffic in both directions on the bridge.
- 11 Section 2. Effective date.
- 12 This act shall take effect in 60 days.
