- 1 Amending the act of October 5, 1978 (P.L.1109, No.261), entitled
- 2 "An act requiring the licensing of practitioners of
- osteopathic medicine and surgery; regulating their practice;
- 4 providing for certain funds and penalties for violations and
- 5 repeals," further providing for definitions.
- 6 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 7 hereby enacts as follows:
- 8 Section 1. The definition of "primary supervising physician"
- 9 in section 2 of the act of October 5, 1978 (P.L.1109, No.261),
- 10 known as the Osteopathic Medical Practice Act, is amended to
- 11 read:
- 12 Section 2. Definitions.
- 13 The following words and phrases when used in this act shall
- 14 have, unless the context clearly indicates otherwise, the
- 15 meanings given to them in this section:
- 16 * * *
- 17 "Primary supervising physician." An osteopathic physician

- 1 who is [registered] <u>LICENSED</u> with the board <u>or a medical doctor</u> <--
- 2 who is registered LICENSED with the State Board of Medicine and <--
- 3 <u>is</u> designated in a written agreement with a physician assistant
- 4 under section 10(g) as having primary responsibility for
- 5 supervising the physician assistant.

- 7 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
