- 9 The provisions of this subchapter shall only apply during the
- 10 <u>effective period of a disaster emergency declared by the</u>
- 11 Governor on March 6, 2020, and published at 50 Pa.B. 1644 (March
- 12 21, 2020), and any renewal of the state of disaster emergency.
- 13 <u>§ 2322. Definitions.</u>
- 14 The following words and phrases when used in this subchapter
- 15 shall have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
- 16 <u>context clearly indicates otherwise:</u>
- 17 <u>"Working capital expenses." Expenses incurred by a small</u>
- 18 business for operations, excluding fixed assets and production
- 19 machinery and equipment.
- 20 § 2323. Eligible applicants.
- 21 A for-profit enterprise that employs not more than five
- 22 individuals shall be considered a small business and shall be
- 23 <u>eligible for assistance under this subchapter.</u>
- 24 § 2324. Terms of assistance.
- 25 Subject to sections 2325 (relating to COVID-19 small business
- 26 loans) and 2326 (relating to COVID-19 small business grants),
- 27 the authority may do the following:
- 28 <u>(1) Enter into loan agreements with eliqible applicants</u>
- 29 under this chapter as determined by the authority.
- 30 (2) Waive or adjust loan requirements, repayment periods

- 1 <u>and job creation or preservation requirements for small</u>
- 2 businesses located in the geographic area specified in the
- 3 <u>disaster emergency declaration.</u>
- 4 (3) Accept applications for loans and other financial
- 5 <u>assistance directly from eligible applicants.</u>
- 6 § 2325. COVID-19 small business loans.
- 7 The following shall apply:
- 8 (1) The authority shall approve, to the extent money is
- 9 <u>appropriated or available to the authority for the purpose</u>,
- 10 <u>loans to eliqible small businesses as provided in this</u>
- 11 <u>section</u>.
- 12 (2) A loan under this subsection may only be for working
- capital expenses, may not exceed \$15,000 and shall not accrue
- 14 <u>interest for the life of the loan.</u>
- 15 (3) The authority may not require a payment during the
- first year of a loan issued under this section.
- 17 § 2326. COVID-19 small business grants.
- 18 The following shall apply:
- 19 (1) The authority shall approve, to the extent money is
- appropriated or available to the authority for the purpose,
- 21 grants to eligible small businesses as provided in this
- 22 section.
- 23 (2) A grant under this section shall be for working
- 24 <u>capital expenses and may not exceed \$15,000.</u>
- 25 § 2327. Fund transfer.
- The sum of \$100,000,000 is transferred from the Budget
- 27 <u>Stabilization Reserve Fund under section 1701-A of the act of</u>
- 28 April 9, 1929 (P.L.343, No.176), known as The Fiscal Code, to
- 29 the authority for the program under this chapter. Section 1703-A
- 30 of The Fiscal Code does not apply to this section.

- 1 <u>§ 2328. Use of money.</u>
- No less than \$50,000,000 of the money transferred to the
- 3 authority under section 2327 (relating to fund transfer) shall
- 4 be used for programs under sections 2325 (relating to COVID-19
- 5 small business loans) and 2326 (relating to COVID-19 small
- 6 <u>business grants</u>). The remainder of the money transferred to the
- 7 <u>authority may be used for programs under this chapter, including</u>
- 8 sections 2325 and 2326.
- 9 Section 3. This act shall take effect immediately.
