## AN ACT

Amending the act of April 9, 1929 (P.L.177, No.175), entitled 1 "An act providing for and reorganizing the conduct of the 2 executive and administrative work of the Commonwealth by the 3 Executive Department thereof and the administrative departments, boards, commissions, and officers thereof, including the boards of trustees of State Normal Schools, or 5 6 Teachers Colleges; abolishing, creating, reorganizing or 7 authorizing the reorganization of certain administrative 8 9 departments, boards, and commissions; defining the powers and duties of the Governor and other executive and administrative 10 officers, and of the several administrative departments, 11 boards, commissions, and officers; fixing the salaries of the 12 Governor, Lieutenant Governor, and certain other executive 13 and administrative officers; providing for the appointment of 14 certain administrative officers, and of all deputies and 15 other assistants and employes in certain departments, boards, 16 and commissions; providing for judicial administration; and 17 prescribing the manner in which the number and compensation 18 19 of the deputies and all other assistants and employes of certain departments, boards and commissions shall be 20 determined, "providing for emergency COVID-19 provisions. 21 22 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 23 hereby enacts as follows: 24 Section 1. The act of April 9, 1929 (P.L.177, No.175), known 25 as The Administrative Code of 1929, is amended by adding an 26 article to read:

## EMERGENCY COVID-19 PROVISIONS

- 2 Section 101-A. Extension of waiver provisions.
- 3 (a) General rule. -- The Secretary of Community and Economic
- 4 <u>Development shall, upon request of a cosmetology salon or barber</u>
- 5 shop, immediately issue a waiver to the Governor's 20200319 TWW
- 6 COVID-19 Business Closure Order to the cosmetology salon or
- 7 <u>barber shop to provide hair services. Waivers shall only be</u>
- 8 <u>issued to cosmetology salons and barber shops that can adhere to</u>
- 9 the social distancing practices and other mitigation measures
- 10 defined by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention to
- 11 protect workers and to mitigate the spread of COVID-19.
- 12 (b) Protections. -- Cosmetology salons and barber shops that
- 13 <u>receive a waiver and operate under this section shall also</u>
- 14 provide, at a minimum, the following protections:
- 15 (1) Appropriate personal protective equipment,
- including, but not limited to, a mask, at the start of every
- 17 shift for employees.
- 18 (2) A work environment, including, but not limited to,
- 19 social distancing practices, that maximizes the safety of
- 20 employees and clients.
- 21 (3) Providing hair services on an appointment basis
- 22 only.

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- 23 (4) Cleaning areas with adequate soap and water and
- breaks to frequently engage in hand washing.
- 25 (c) Violation.--A cosmetology salon or barber shop operating
- 26 in this Commonwealth under a waiver issued under subsection (a)
- 27 that fails to comply with the requirements of this section shall
- 28 be immediately closed and may not be permitted to reopen until
- 29 <u>it is in compliance.</u>
- 30 (d) Construction. -- Nothing in this section shall affect or

- 1 limit the provisions of the act of June 19, 1931 (P.L.589,
- 2 No.202), referred to as the Barbers' License Law, or the act of
- 3 May 3, 1933 (P.L.242, No.86), referred to as the Cosmetology
- 4 Law, and regulations promulgated under those acts, relating to
- 5 sanitation and infectious disease.
- 6 (e) Applicability. -- This section shall apply until the
- 7 proclamation of disaster emergency issued by the Governor on
- 8 March 6, 2020, published at 50 Pa.B. 1644 (March 21, 2020), and
- 9 any renewal of the state of disaster emergency, is terminated or
- 10 expires under 35 Pa.C.S. § 7301(c) (relating to general
- 11 <u>authority of Governor</u>).
- (f) Definitions. -- As used in this section, the following
- 13 words and phrases shall have the meanings given to them in this
- 14 subsection unless the context clearly indicates otherwise:
- "Barber shop." A barber shop licensed under the Barbers'
- 16 License Law.
- 17 <u>"Cosmetology salon." A cosmetology salon licensed under the</u>
- 18 Cosmetology Law.
- 19 Section 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
