AN ACT

- Amending the act of April 9, 1929 (P.L.177, No.175), entitled 1 "An act providing for and reorganizing the conduct of the 2 executive and administrative work of the Commonwealth by the 3 Executive Department thereof and the administrative departments, boards, commissions, and officers thereof, including the boards of trustees of State Normal Schools, or 5 6 Teachers Colleges; abolishing, creating, reorganizing or 7 authorizing the reorganization of certain administrative 8 9 departments, boards, and commissions; defining the powers and duties of the Governor and other executive and administrative 10 officers, and of the several administrative departments, 11 boards, commissions, and officers; fixing the salaries of the 12 Governor, Lieutenant Governor, and certain other executive 13 and administrative officers; providing for the appointment of 14 certain administrative officers, and of all deputies and 15 other assistants and employes in certain departments, boards, 16 and commissions; providing for judicial administration; and 17 prescribing the manner in which the number and compensation 18 19 of the deputies and all other assistants and employes of certain departments, boards and commissions shall be 20 determined," in powers and duties of the Department of 21 General Services and its departmental administrative and 22 23 advisory boards and commissions, providing for program for sale of used pursuit vehicles. 24 25 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 26 hereby enacts as follows:
- 27 Section 1. The act of April 9, 1929 (P.L.177, No.175), known
- 28 as The Administrative Code of 1929, is amended by adding a

- 2 Section 2407.2. Program for Sale of Used Pursuit Vehicles.--
- 3 (a) The department shall create a program designed to allow a
- 4 <u>local or regional police department within this Commonwealth to</u>
- 5 <u>purchase select used pursuit vehicles at a fixed price no later</u>
- 6 than twenty days prior to the next scheduled sale date.
- 7 (b) The Pennsylvania State Police shall allocate up to ten
- 8 per centum (10%) of its available used pursuit vehicle inventory
- 9 for the program.
- 10 (c) Payment for a used pursuit vehicle under the program
- 11 shall be required prior to obtaining the vehicle and shall be
- 12 made by organization check only.
- 13 (d) The program shall allow a local or regional police
- 14 <u>department within this Commonwealth to submit a form, developed</u>
- 15 by the department, which shall contain a section for a
- 16 <u>description and quantity of desired surplus pursuit vehicles.</u>
- 17 Upon submission of the form, the department shall make every
- 18 effort to notify the local or regional police department when
- 19 vehicles matching the description within the submitted form
- 20 become available for purchase through the program at a fixed
- 21 price.
- 22 (e) The department shall promulgate rules and regulations
- 23 necessary for the administration of this section.
- 24 (f) As used in this section, the following words and phrases
- 25 shall have the meanings given to them in this subsection:
- 26 "Department" means the Department of General Services of the
- 27 <u>Commonwealth</u>.
- 28 "Fixed price" means a price set by the department that is not
- 29 subject to bargaining.
- 30 "Local or regional police department" means a police

- 1 <u>department that is established by a political subdivision within</u>
- 2 this Commonwealth or that has been consolidated by act of a
- 3 municipal governing body.
- 4 "Program" means the program for the sale of used pursuit
- 5 vehicles under this section.
- 6 "Pursuit vehicle" means a publicly owned vehicle that is
- 7 operated by a law enforcement agency and used for the patrol
- 8 functions of the law enforcement agency.
- 9 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
