AN ACT

1 2	Amending the act of April 12, 1951 (P.L.90, No.21), entitled "An act relating to alcoholic liquors, alcohol and malt and
3	brewed beverages; amending, revising, consolidating and
4	changing the laws relating thereto; regulating and
5	restricting the manufacture, purchase, sale, possession,
6 7	consumption, importation, transportation, furnishing, holding in bond, holding in storage, traffic in and use of alcoholic
8	liquors, alcohol and malt and brewed beverages and the
9	persons engaged or employed therein; defining the powers and
10	duties of the Pennsylvania Liquor Control Board; providing
11	for the establishment and operation of State liquor stores,
12	for the payment of certain license fees to the respective
13	municipalities and townships, for the abatement of certain
14	nuisances and, in certain cases, for search and seizure
15	without warrant; prescribing penalties and forfeitures;
16	providing for local option, and repealing existing laws," in
17	Pennsylvania liquor stores, further providing for sales by
18	Pennsylvania liquor stores.
19	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
20	hereby enacts as follows:
21	Section 1. Section 305 of the act of April 12, 1951 (P.L.90,
22	No.21), known as the Liquor Code, is amended by adding a
23	subsection to read:
24	Section 305. Sales by Pennsylvania Liquor Stores* * *
25	(g.1) The following shall apply:

1	(1) The board shall contract with a vendor to operate,
2	maintain and oversee the online store through the Commonwealth
3	bidding process. The vendor:
4	<u>(i) shall:</u>
5	(A) operate the online store in consultation with the board
6	to ensure continuity with brick and mortar stores, as well as
7	operation under the same privileges and restrictions contained
8	<u>in this section;</u>
9	(B) operate, maintain and manage fulfillment centers in
10	order to provide delivery of any product ordered through the
11	online store; and
12	(C) be a transporter for hire licensee and may further
13	utilize any transporter for hire licensee it deems necessary for
14	delivery of product; and
15	(ii) may hire any employe to ensure successful operation of
16	the online store and fulfillment center and is not subject to
17	section 302.
18	(2) The limitations under subsection (g) shall not apply to
19	the board's online store, unless a vendor operating the online
20	store determines the measures are necessary for equitable sale
21	and distribution.

23	Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.

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
