AN ACT

Amending the act of June 24, 1968 (P.L.237, No.111), entitled "An act specifically authorizing collective bargaining 2 between policemen and firemen and their public employers; 3 providing for arbitration in order to settle disputes, and requiring compliance with collective bargaining agreements 5 and findings of arbitrators," further providing for fees and 6 costs associated with arbitration. 7 8 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows: 10 Section 1. Section 8 of the act of June 24, 1968 (P.L.237, 11 No.111), referred to as the Policemen and Firemen Collective 12 Bargaining Act, is amended to read: 13 Section 8. [The compensation, if any, of the arbitrator appointed by the policemen or firemen shall be paid by them. The 14 compensation of the other two arbitrators, as well as all 15 16 stenographic and other expenses incurred by the arbitration 17 panel in connection with the arbitration proceedings, shall be 18 paid by the political subdivision or by the Commonwealth, as the case may be.] (a) Except as provided under subsection (b), the 19 public employer and the policemen or firemen who are engaged in 2.0

- 1 the collective bargaining shall bear the costs of their
- 2 <u>respective appointed arbitrators</u>, <u>witnesses</u>, <u>including actuary</u>
- 3 or expert witnesses, and attorneys in an arbitration proceeding.
- 4 (b) The reasonable fees and costs associated with the
- 5 <u>neutral third arbitrator and the stenographic and other expenses</u>
- 6 <u>not governed under subsection (a) shall be divided as follows:</u>
- 7 (1) One-half of the fees and costs shall be paid by the
- 8 <u>public employer.</u>
- 9 (2) One-half of the fees and costs shall be paid by the
- 10 policemen and firemen who are engaged in the collective
- 11 <u>bargaining</u>.
- 12 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
