AN ACT

Amending Titles 42 (Judiciary and Judicial Procedure) and 75 (Vehicles) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in 2 other required equipment, further providing for exhaust 3 systems, mufflers and noise control; in inspection of vehicles, further providing for suspension of certificates of 5 appointment; in snowmobiles and all-terrain vehicles, further 6 providing for mufflers and sound control; imposing penalties; 7 and making editorial changes. 8 9 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows: 10 11 Section 1. Section 933(a)(1)(ii) of Title 42 of the 12 Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes is amended to read: 13 § 933. Appeals from government agencies. 14 General rule. -- Except as otherwise prescribed by any (a) 15 general rule adopted pursuant to section 503 (relating to reassignment of matters), each court of common pleas shall have 16 17 jurisdiction of appeals from final orders of government agencies 18 in the following cases: 19 Appeals from Commonwealth agencies in the following 20 cases:

Except as otherwise prescribed by general rules, the venue shall be in the county of the principal place of business of any salvor or messenger service, the location of any inspection station involved, the county where the arrest for a violation of 75 Pa.C.S. § 3802 (relating to driving under influence of alcohol or controlled substance) was made in appeals involving the suspension of operating privileges under 75 Pa.C.S. § 1547 (relating to chemical testing to determine amount of alcohol or controlled substance) or the residence of any individual appellant where the venue is not otherwise fixed by this sentence. In the case of a nonresident individual venue, except as otherwise prescribed by general rules, shall be in the county in which the offense giving rise to the recall, cancellation, suspension or revocation of operating privileges occurred.

29 Section 2. Section 4523 of Title 75 is amended by adding a 30 subsection to read:

- 1 § 4523. Exhaust systems, mufflers and noise control.
- 2 * * *
- 3 (f) Unauthorized sale of modified mufflers and related
- 4 <u>equipment prohibited.--</u>
- 5 (1) No person shall sell, offer for sale or install for
- 6 the muffler or exhaust system of a motor vehicle a cut-out,
- 7 <u>bypass or a similar device that amplifies or increases the</u>
- 8 <u>noise emitted by the motor or exhaust system originally</u>
- 9 <u>installed on the vehicle.</u>
- 10 (2) No person shall sell, offer for sale or install a
- 11 <u>motorcycle exhaust device without internal baffles, known as</u>
- 12 <u>straight pipes.</u>
- 13 (3) No person shall sell, offer for sale or install a
- 14 motorcycle exhaust device that is intentionally designed to
- allow for the internal baffling to be fully or partially
- 16 <u>removed or interchangeable or that has been modified in a</u>
- manner that amplifies or increases the noise emitted by the

- 29 (a) General rule.--
- 30 (1) The department shall supervise and inspect official

1 inspection stations and may revoke, suspend or refuse to renew the certificate of appointment issued to a station or may impose a monetary penalty or may issue a warning against the station which it finds is not properly equipped or conducted or which has violated or failed to comply with any of the provisions of this chapter or regulations adopted by 7 the department.

(2) The department shall revoke, suspend or refuse to renew the certificate of appointment for an inspection station upon a third or subsequent violation, within a period of 18 months, of a regulation requiring the inspection station to inspect the muffler or exhaust system of a motor vehicle for the purpose of compliance with section 4523 (relating to exhaust systems, mufflers and noise control). The department shall attribute a violation of section 4523 by an employee of an inspection station, garage or repair shop to the station, garage or repair shop. A fine paid under section 4523 shall be in addition to, but not in lieu of, a monetary penalty, revocation, suspension or nonrenewal of a certificate of appointment imposed under this chapter.

(3) A schedule of all penalties, points and suspension may be established by the department by publishing a notice in the Pennsylvania Bulletin until the regulations governing these penalties are promulgated by the department. The department shall maintain a list of all stations holding certificates of appointment and of those whose certificates of appointment have been <u>revoked</u>, suspended <u>or not renewed</u>. Any revoked, suspended or not renewed certificate of appointment and all unused certificates of inspection shall be returned immediately to the department.

- 1 (b) Judicial review. -- Any person whose mechanic certificate
- 2 issued under section 4726 (relating to certification of
- 3 mechanics) or certificate of appointment has been denied [or],
- 4 <u>revoked</u>, suspended <u>or not renewed</u> or who has received a monetary
- 5 penalty under this chapter shall have the right to appeal to the
