4	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
5	hereby enacts as follows:
6	Section 1. Title 18 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated
7	Statutes is amended by adding a section to read:
8	§ 1107.2. Restitution involving child support.
9	(a) OrderNotwithstanding any other provision of law and
10	in addition to any other sentence or order authorized by law,
11	the court shall sentence a person convicted of a designated
12	offense that resulted in the death of a parent of a child to pay
13	child support for the child as restitution. The following apply:
14	(1) The amount of the child support shall be determined
15	in accordance with 23 Pa.C.S. § 4322 (relating to support
16	guideline).
17	(2) The payment of child support shall be made to the
18	surviving parent of the child or, in the absence of a
19	surviving parent of the child, the person having physical

1 custody of the child. (3) The payment of child support shall be made until the 2 3 child reaches 18 years of age. 4 (b) Definitions.--As used in this section, the following words and phrases shall have the meanings given to them in this 5 subsection unless the context clearly indicates otherwise: 6 "Child." An individual under 18 years of age. 7 "Designated offense." An offense under any of the following: 8 9 (1) Section 2502 (relating to murder). (2) Section 2503 (relating to voluntary manslaughter). 10 (3) Section 2504 (relating to involuntary manslaughter). 11 (4) 75 Pa.C.S. § 3732 (relating to homicide by vehicle). 12 (5) 75 Pa.C.S. § 3735 (relating to homicide by vehicle 13 14 while driving under influence). "Parent." A biological parent, adoptive parent or legal 15 quardian of a child. 16 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days. 17
