AN ACT

- Amending the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), entitled "An 1 act relating to the public school system, including certain 2 provisions applicable as well to private and parochial 3 schools; amending, revising, consolidating and changing the laws relating thereto," in pupils and attendance, further providing for age limits and temporary residence and 5 providing for age limit extension during COVID-19 pandemic of 7 2020. 8 9 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows: 10 Section 1. Section 1301 of the act of March 10, 1949 11 (P.L.30, No.14), known as the Public School Code of 1949, is 12 13 amended to read: 14 Section 1301. Age Limits; Temporary Residence. -- Every child, being a resident of any school district, between the ages of six 15 16 (6) and twenty-one (21) years, may attend the public schools in 17 his district, subject to the provisions of this act. [Notwithstanding] Except as provided in section 1301.1,
- 18
- notwithstanding any other provision of law to the contrary, a 19
- child who attains the age of twenty-one (21) years during the 20

- 1 school term and who has not graduated from high school may
- 2 continue to attend the public schools in his district free of
- 3 charge until the end of the school term. The board of school
- 4 directors of any school district may admit to the schools of the
- 5 district, with or without the payment of tuition, any non-
- 6 resident child temporarily residing in the district, and may
- 7 require the attendance of such non-resident child in the same
- 8 manner and on the same conditions as it requires the attendance
- 9 of a resident child.
- 10 Section 2. The act is amended by adding a section to read:
- 11 <u>Section 1301.1. Age Limit Extension During COVID-19 Pandemic</u>
- 12 <u>of 2020.--Notwithstanding section 1301, every student who was</u>
- 13 twenty (20) or twenty-one (21) years of age before the
- 14 proclamation of disaster emergency issued by the Governor on
- 15 March 6, 2020, published at 50 Pa.B. 1644 (March 21, 2020), and
- 16 any renewal of the state of disaster emergency, and who was
- 17 enrolled in a school district of this Commonwealth, in
- 18 accordance with section 1301, during the proclamation of
- 19 <u>disaster emergency</u>, or any renewal of the state of disaster
- 20 <u>emergency</u>, shall be eligible for a six-month extension of
- 21 eligibility under section 1301 free of charge.
- 22 Section 3. This act shall take effect immediately.
