AN ACT

Amending the act of April 9, 1929 (P.L.177, No.175), entitled 1 "An act providing for and reorganizing the conduct of the 2 executive and administrative work of the Commonwealth by the 3 Executive Department thereof and the administrative 4 departments, boards, commissions, and officers thereof, 5 including the boards of trustees of State Normal Schools, or 6 7 Teachers Colleges; abolishing, creating, reorganizing or authorizing the reorganization of certain administrative 8 departments, boards, and commissions; defining the powers and 9 duties of the Governor and other executive and administrative 10 officers, and of the several administrative departments, 11 boards, commissions, and officers; fixing the salaries of the 12 Governor, Lieutenant Governor, and certain other executive 13 and administrative officers; providing for the appointment of 14 certain administrative officers, and of all deputies and 15 other assistants and employes in certain departments, boards, 16 and commissions; providing for judicial administration; and 17 prescribing the manner in which the number and compensation 18 of the deputies and all other assistants and employes of 19 certain departments, boards and commissions shall be 20 21 determined," providing for establishment indoor space 22 operation. 23 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 24 hereby enacts as follows: 25 Section 1. The act of April 9, 1929 (P.L.177, No.175), known 26 as The Administrative Code of 1929, is amended by adding an

2	ESTABLISHMENT INDOOR SPACE OPERATION	
3	Section 101-A. Definitions.	
4	The following words and phrases when used in this article	
5	shall have the meanings given to them in this section unless the	
6	context clearly indicates otherwise:	
7	"Designated county." A county designated by executive order	
8	in the green phase of reopening.	
9	"Establishment." An eating or drinking place within a	
10	designated county.	
11	Section 102-A. Operation.	
12	An establishment may operate at a capacity subject only to	
13	the limitations of this section.	
14	Section 103-A. Requirements.	
15	(a) ApplicabilityThis section shall apply to an	
16	establishment operating under section 102-A.	
17	(b) GuidelinesThe following shall apply:	
18	(1) Except as provided under paragraph (2), an	
19	establishment shall follow guidelines issued by the Centers	
20	for Disease Control and Prevention and the Commonwealth	
21	regarding business and building operations.	
22	(2) An establishment may, consistent with guidelines	
23	issued by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention and	
24	the Commonwealth regarding business and building operations,	
25	use suitable barriers in addition to social distancing	
26	requirements.	
27	(c) Applicable practicesAn establishment shall, to the	
28	extent possible, follow applicable practices of the:	
29	(1) National Restaurant Association's Guide for the	
30	Restaurant Industry, titled "COVID-19 Reopening Guidance,"	
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1 published April 22, 2020; and

2	(2) United States Food and Drug Administration's Best
3	Practices for Retail Food Stores, Restaurants, and Food Pick-
4	<u>Up/Delivery Services During the COVID-19 Pandemic.</u>
5	(d) LimitationAn establishment may not use more than 50%
6	of the establishment's seating capacity during operation.
7	Section 104-A. Expiration.
8	This article shall expire upon termination or expiration of
9	the declaration of disaster emergency issued by the Governor on
10	March 6, 2020, published at 50 Pa.B. 1644 (March 21, 2020).
11	Section 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
