## AN ACT

- Establishing the Save Our Stages (SOS) Grant Program and the 1
- Save Our Stages (SOS) Fund; providing for duties of the 2
- Department of Community and Economic Development; and making 3
- an appropriation. 4
- 5 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- hereby enacts as follows:
- Section 1. Short title.
- 8 This act shall be known and may be cited as the Save Our
- Stages (SOS) Act. 9
- 10 Section 2. Definitions.
- The following words and phrases when used in this act shall 11
- 12 have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
- 13 context clearly indicates otherwise:
- 14 "CARES Act." The Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic
- 15 Security Act (Public Law 116-136, 134 Stat. 281).
- 16 "COVID-19." The coronavirus disease 2019, an infectious
- 17 disease caused by severe acute respiratory syndrome coronavirus
- 18 2.

1 "Department." The Department of Community and Economic 2 Development of the Commonwealth. "Eligible operator, producer or promoter." As follows: 3 (1) A live venue operator, producer or promoter that 4 5 meets the following requirements: 6 (i) The live venue operator, producer or promoter 7 was fully operational within this Commonwealth as a live 8 venue operator, producer or promoter on February 29, 9 2020. 10 (ii) As of the date of the grant under this act, the 11 live venue operator, producer or promoter is organizing, 12 promoting, producing, managing or hosting future events 13 described in paragraph (1)(i) of the definition of "live 14 venue operator, producer or promoter." 15 (iii) The venue at which the live venue operator, 16 producer or promoter promotes, produces, manages or hosts 17 events described in paragraph (1)(i) of the definition of 18 "live venue operator, producer or promoter": 19 Has a defined performance and audience 20 space. 21 Has a mixing desk, public address system and 22 lighting rig. 23 (C) Employs not fewer than two of the following: 24 (I) A sound engineer. 25 (II) A booker. 26 (III) A promoter. 27 (IV) A stage manager. 28 (V) Security personnel. 29 (VI) A box office manager.

(VII) An executive director, program

1 director or the equivalent of an executive 2 director or program director. 3 Has a paid ticket or cover charge to attend most performances, where artists and entertainers are 4 paid fairly and do not play for free or solely for 5 6 tips, except for legitimate fundraisers or similar 7 charitable events. 8 (E) For a venue owned or operated by a nonprofit entity that produces free events, produces and 9 10 manages events by paid employees, not by volunteers. 11 Markets performances through listings in 12 printed or electronic publications, on websites, by mass e-mail or on social media. 13 14 The live venue operator, producer or promoter 15 does not have, or is not majority-owned or controlled by 16 an entity with more than one of the following characteristics: 17 18 (A) Being an issuer, the securities of which are 19 listed on a national securities exchange. 20 (B) Owning or operating venues or talent 21 agencies or talent management companies with offices 22 in more than one country. 23 Owning or operating venues in more than 10 24 states. 25 Employing more than 500 employees, (D) 26 determined on a full-time equivalent basis, in accordance with paragraph (2). 27 28 Receiving more than 10% of gross revenue 29 from Federal funding. 30 (2) For purposes of determining the number of full-time

- 1 equivalent employees under paragraph (1) (iv) (D):
- 2 (i) An employee working not fewer than 30 hours per 3 week shall be considered a full-time employee.
- 4 (ii) An employee working not fewer than 10 hours and fewer than 30 hours per week shall be counted as one-half of a full-time employee.
- 7 "Exchange." As defined in section 3(a) of the Securities
- 8 Exchange Act of 1934 (48 Stat. 881, 15 U.S.C. § 78c(a)(1)).
- 9 "Fund." The Save Our Stages (SOS) Fund established under
- 10 section 4.
- "Issuer." As defined in section 3(a) of the Securities
- 12 Exchange Act of 1934 (48 Stat. 881, 15 U.S.C. § 78c(a)(8)).
- "Live venue operator, producer or promoter." As follows:
- 14 (1) An individual or entity domiciled in this
- 15 Commonwealth that:
- (i) as not less than 70% of the operations of the
  individual or entity, organizes, promotes, sells tickets,
  produces, manages or hosts a live concert, comedy show,
  theatrical production or other event by a performing
  artist and applies a cover charge through ticketing or a
  front door entrance fee; or
- 22 (ii) makes tickets to an event described in
  23 subparagraph (i) available for purchase by the public an
  24 average of not fewer than 60 days before the date of the
  25 event and pays the performing artist in the event an
  26 amount that is based on a percentage of sales, on a
  27 guarantee in writing or in a standard contract or another
  28 mutually beneficial formal agreement.
- 29 (2) The term shall include an individual or entity 30 described in paragraph (1) that:

- 1 (i) operates on a for-profit basis or nonprofit
- basis;
- 3 (ii) is government-owned; or
- 4 (iii) is a corporation, limited liability company or
- 5 partnership or operated as a sole proprietorship.
- 6 "National securities exchange." An exchange registered as a
- 7 national securities exchange under section 6 of the Securities
- 8 Exchange Act of 1934 (48 Stat. 881, 15 U.S.C. 78f).
- 9 "Program." The Save Our Stages (SOS) Program established
- 10 under section 3.
- "Secretary." The Secretary of Community and Economic
- 12 Development of the Commonwealth.
- "Security." As defined in section 3(a) of the Securities
- 14 Exchange Act of 1934 (48 Stat. 881, 15 U.S.C. § 78c(a)(10)).
- 15 "State." A state of the United States, the District of
- 16 Columbia, the Commonwealth of Puerto Rico or any territory or
- 17 possession of the United States.
- 18 Section 3. Save Our Stages (SOS) Grant Program.
- 19 (a) Establishment. -- The Save Our Stages (SOS) Grant Program
- 20 is established within the department.
- 21 (b) Duties of department. -- The department shall provide
- 22 grants under the program in accordance with this act for an
- 23 eligible operator, producer or promoter.
- 24 Section 4. Save Our Stages (SOS) Fund.
- 25 (a) Establishment. -- The Save Our Stages (SOS) Fund is
- 26 established as a special fund in the State Treasury.
- 27 (b) Use of fund. -- Money appropriated under section 11 shall
- 28 be deposited into the fund to be used exclusively by the
- 29 department to award grants to each eligible operator, producer
- 30 or promoter.

- 1 Section 5. Grants for independent live venue operators.
- 2 (a) Authority. -- The secretary may make an initial grant to
- 3 an eligible operator, producer or promoter in accordance with
- 4 this section.
- 5 (b) Amount.--A grant under subsection (a) shall be in the
- 6 amount equal to the greater of the following:
- 7 (1) The amount equal to 45% of the gross revenue of the
- 8 eligible operator, producer or promoter during 2019.
- 9 (2) For an eligible operator, producer or promoter that
- began operations after January 1, 2019, the amount equal to
- 11 the product obtained by multiplying the average monthly gross
- 12 revenue for each full month during which the entity was in
- operation during 2019 by six.
- 14 (3) \$2,000,000.
- 15 (c) Use of money.--
- 16 (1) An eligible operator, producer or promoter may use
- amounts received under a grant under this section for any of
- 18 the following:
- 19 (i) Payroll costs for employees and furloughed
- employees.
- 21 (ii) Rent.
- 22 (iii) Utilities.
- 23 (iv) Mortgage interest payments on existing
- 24 mortgages as of February 15, 2020.
- 25 (v) Scheduled interest payments on other scheduled
- 26 debt as of February 15, 2020.
- 27 (vi) Costs related to personal protective equipment.
- 28 (vii) Payments of principal on outstanding loans.
- 29 (viii) Payments made to independent contractors, as
- 30 reported on Form-1099 MISC.

- 1 (ix) Other ordinary and necessary business expenses,
- 2 including any of the following:
- 3 (A) Settling existing debts owed to vendors.
- 4 (B) Maintenance expenses.
- 5 (C) Administrative costs.
- 6 (D) Taxes.
- 7 (E) Operating leases.
- 8 (F) Insurance.
- 9 (G) Any other capital expenditure or expense
- 10 required under Federal, State or local law or
- 11 guideline related to social distancing.
- 12 (2) An eligible operator, producer or promoter may not
- use amounts received under a grant under this section:
- 14 (i) to purchase real estate;
- 15 (ii) for payments of interest or principal on loans
- originated after February 15, 2020;
- 17 (iii) to invest or re-lend money;
- 18 (iv) for contributions or expenditures to, or on
- behalf of, a political party, party committee or
- 20 candidate for elective office; or
- 21 (v) for any other use as may be prohibited by the
- 22 secretary.
- 23 Section 6. Grant application forms.
- 24 (a) Development.--The department shall develop a grant
- 25 application form for a live venue operator, producer or promoter
- 26 to apply for a grant under the program.
- 27 (b) Contents. -- At minimum, the grant application form shall
- 28 include the following information:
- 29 (1) The name, address and contact information of the
- 30 applicant.

- 1 (2) The applicant's eligibility for a grant under the
- 2 program.
- 3 (3) The amount of grant money requested under the
- 4 program.
- 5 (4) Any other information that the department deems
- 6 necessary and appropriate.
- 7 (c) Submission.--A live venue operator, producer or promoter
- 8 must submit the grant application form required under this
- 9 section to the department in the manner prescribed by the
- 10 department.
- 11 Section 7. Award of grants.
- 12 (a) Review of grants. -- Not later than 20 days after receipt
- 13 of the grant application form under section 6, the department
- 14 shall review the grant application form and determine whether to
- 15 award a grant to the applicant under the program and, if so, the
- 16 amount of grant money to be awarded.
- 17 (b) Notice.--After conducting a review of the grant
- 18 application under subsection (a), the department shall provide
- 19 written notice to the applicant of the award or denial of the
- 20 grant under the program. The following shall apply:
- 21 (1) Notice of the award of a grant under the program
- shall include the amount of the grant money awarded and all
- conditions or restrictions on the use of the grant money.
- 24 (2) Notice of the denial of all or part of the grant
- money requested under the program on the grant application
- 26 under subsection (a) shall include the reasons for full or
- 27 partial denial.
- 28 Section 8. Guidelines.
- 29 The department may promulgate guidelines for the
- 30 implementation and administration of this act.

- 1 Section 9. Public notice.
- 2 The department shall provide information regarding the
- 3 availability of grants under the program on the publicly
- 4 accessible Internet website of the department.
- 5 Section 10. Limitation on award of grants.
- 6 Subject to the availability of funding, a grant to an
- 7 applicant under the program shall not exceed \$2,000,000.
- 8 Section 11. Appropriation.
- 9 The sum of \$200,000,000 of the money available to the
- 10 Commonwealth under the CARES Act and any additional future
- 11 Federal dollars is appropriated to the department for the
- 12 purpose of awarding grants to applicants under the program.
- 13 Section 12. Expiration.
- 14 This act shall expire December 31, 2021.
- 15 Section 13. Effective date.
- 16 This act shall take effect immediately.
