## AN ACT

- Amending the act of April 12, 1951 (P.L.90, No.21), entitled "An act relating to alcoholic liquors, alcohol and malt and 2 brewed beverages; amending, revising, consolidating and 3 changing the laws relating thereto; regulating and restricting the manufacture, purchase, sale, possession, 5 consumption, importation, transportation, furnishing, holding 6 in bond, holding in storage, traffic in and use of alcoholic liquors, alcohol and malt and brewed beverages and the 7 8 persons engaged or employed therein; defining the powers and 9 10 duties of the Pennsylvania Liquor Control Board; providing for the establishment and operation of State liquor stores, 11 for the payment of certain license fees to the respective 12 municipalities and townships, for the abatement of certain 13 nuisances and, in certain cases, for search and seizure 14 without warrant; prescribing penalties and forfeitures; 15 providing for local option, and repealing existing laws," in 16 licenses and regulations and liquor, alcohol and malt and brewed beverages, further providing for wine expanded 17 18 19 permits. 20 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 21 hereby enacts as follows: 22 Section 1. Section 415(a)(2) and (d) of the act of April 12, 1951 (P.L.90, No.21), known as the Liquor Code, are amended to 24 read: 25 Section 415. Wine Expanded Permits. -- (a) \* \* \*

- 5 day until the licensee's permitted hours of operation under
- 6 section 406 of the next day, including Sundays if the licensee
- 7 has a permit authorized under section 406(a)(3).]

- 9 (d) A wine expanded permit holder may sell for off-premises
- 10 consumption, in a single transaction, up to three thousand
- 11 (3,000) milliliters of wine. The sales may occur at any time the
- 12 wine expanded permit holder is otherwise authorized to sell
- 13 alcohol for on-premises consumption.

- 15 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
