6	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
7	hereby enacts as follows:
8	Section 1. Title 35 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated
9	Statutes is amended by adding a chapter to read:

9	<u>§ 7901. Scope of chapter.</u>
10	This chapter relates to incentives for municipal volunteers
11	of fire companies and emergency medical services agencies and
12	volunteers of hazardous materials response teams.
13	<u>§ 7902. Purpose.</u>
14	The purpose of this chapter is to authorize municipalities to
15	enact a tax credit against an active volunteer's earned income
16	and property tax liability as a financial incentive to:
17	(1) Indicate the municipality's acknowledgment of the
18	value of and the absence of any public cost for volunteer
19	fire protection, emergency medical services and hazardous
20	materials response provided by active volunteers.
21	(2) Encourage other individuals to newly volunteer or
22	for former volunteers to consider rejoining as active
23	volunteers in a volunteer fire company, emergency medical
24	services agency or hazardous materials response team.
25	<u>§ 7903. Definitions.</u>
26	The following words and phrases when used in this chapter
27	shall have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
28	context clearly indicates otherwise:
29	"Active volunteer." A volunteer for a volunteer fire company
30	or emergency medical services agency who has complied with the
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1	requirements of the volunteer service credit program and who is
2	certified under section 7923 (relating to certification). The
3	term includes a person who is a volunteer member of a hazardous
4	materials response team.
5	"Commissioner." The State Fire Commissioner of the
6	Commonwealth.
7	"Earned income tax." A tax on earned income and net profits
8	levied under Chapter 3 of the act of December 31, 1965
9	(P.L.1257, No.511), known as The Local Tax Enabling Act.
10	"Emergency medical services agency." As defined in section
11	8103 (relating to definitions).
12	"Governing body." A county council, county board of
13	commissioners, city council, borough council, incorporated town
14	council, board of township commissioners, board of township
15	supervisors, governing council of a home rule municipality or
16	optional plan municipality, a school district board of directors
17	or a governing council of any similar purpose government which

14	<u>§ 7911. Program authorization.</u>
15	(a) EstablishmentA municipality or school district that
16	levies an earned income tax may establish by ordinance or
17	resolution a tax credit against an individual's liability
18	imposed under Chapter 3 of the act of December 31, 1965
19	(P.L.1257, No.511), known as The Local Tax Enabling Act, for
20	<u>active service as a volunteer.</u>
21	(b) AmountA municipality or school district must set
22	forth in the ordinance or resolution the amount of the tax
23	credit. If the total earned income tax liability is less than
24	the amount established, the tax credit shall equal the remaining
25	<u>tax liability.</u>
26	(c) Public noticeAt least 30 days prior to adoption of
27	the ordinance or resolution, the governing body shall give
28	public notice of its intent to adopt an ordinance or resolution
29	to establish a tax credit and conduct at least one public
30	hearing on the issue.

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1	<u>(d) Specific noticeA municipality or school district that</u>
2	establishes a tax credit under this chapter shall notify the
3	commissioner in the manner and pursuant to any schedule
4	prescribed by the commissioner.
5	<u>§ 7912. Claim.</u>
6	(a) EligibilityAn individual who satisfies all of the
7	following criteria may claim a tax credit established under
8	section 7911 (relating to program authorization):
9	(1) The individual is subject to an earned income tax
10	that has established a tax credit under section 7911.
11	(2) The individual is certified under section 7923
12	(relating to certification).
13	(b) ReturnAn active volunteer may claim a tax credit
14	provided for under this subchapter when filing a joint return.
15	The tax return form shall provide a mechanism for separating the
16	liability of an individual for any earned income tax imposed by
17	the school district of residence from the liability of an
18	individual for any earned income tax imposed by the
19	municipality.
20	<u>§ 7912.1. Real property tax credit.</u>
21	(a) School districtThe governing body of a school
22	district may provide, by resolution, for a tax credit against
23	real property tax to be granted to an active volunteer. The tax
24	credit shall apply to tax levied on residential real property
25	owned and occupied by an active volunteer who is certified under
26	section 7923 (relating to certification). The amount of the tax
27	credit shall be equivalent to no more than 20% of the tax
28	liability of the active volunteer.
29	(b) CountyThe governing body of a county may provide, by
30	resolution, for a tax credit against real property taxes to be
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1	granted to active volunteer firefighters. The tax credit shall
2	apply to taxes levied on residential real property owned and
3	occupied by an active volunteer firefighter who is certified
4	under section 7923. The amount of the tax credit shall be
5	equivalent to no more than 20% of the tax liability of the
6	active volunteer firefighter.
7	<u>§ 7913. Limitations.</u>
8	<u>A tax credit established under this subchapter may be used</u>
9	against the active volunteer's earned income tax or property tax
10	liability for the current taxable year.

18	<u>§ 7921. Volunteer service credit program.</u>
19	(a) EstablishmentWithin 90 days of the effective date of
20	this section, the commissioner shall establish a volunteer
21	service credit program that establishes the annual requirements
22	for the certification of a volunteer in active service at a
23	volunteer fire company, an emergency medical services agency or
24	<u>hazardous materials response team.</u>
25	(b) ActivitiesThe volunteer service credit program shall
26	consider the following activities in determining credit toward a
27	certification of active service:
28	(1) The number of emergency calls to which a volunteer
29	responds.
30	(2) The level of training and participation in formal
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1	training and drills for a volunteer.
2	(3) The total amount of time expended by a volunteer on
3	administrative and other support services, including
4	fundraising and facility or equipment maintenance.
5	(4) The involvement in other events or projects that aid
6	the financial viability, emergency response or operational
7	readiness of a volunteer fire company, an emergency medical
8	services agency or hazardous materials response team.
9	(c) GuidelinesThe commissioner shall adopt guidelines,
10	including forms and applications, necessary to implement this
11	section.
12	<u>§ 7922. Service record.</u>
13	(a) LogThe chief of a volunteer fire company or the
14	supervisor, chief of an emergency medical services agency or
15	supervisor or chief of a hazardous materials response team or
16	their designees shall establish and maintain a service log that
17	documents the activities of each volunteer that qualifies for
18	credit toward active service under the volunteer service credit
19	program and the calculation of the total credits earned for each
20	volunteer in the volunteer fire company, emergency medical
21	services agency or hazardous materials response team.
22	(b) ReviewService logs established and maintained by
23	volunteer fire companies, emergency medical services agencies or
24	hazardous materials response teams shall be subject to periodic
25	review by the Auditor General, the governing body where the
26	volunteer fire company, emergency medical services agency or
27	hazardous materials response team is located and the governing
28	body where the volunteer fire company, emergency medical
29	services agency or hazardous materials response team provides
30	services.

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1 <u>§ 7923. Certification.</u>

2	(a) Self-certificationThe active volunteer shall sign and
3	submit an application to the chief of the volunteer fire
4	company, the supervisor or chief of the emergency medical
5	services agency or the supervisor or chief of the hazardous
6	materials response team where the volunteer serves.
7	(b) Local sign-offThe chief and another officer of the
8	volunteer fire company, the supervisor or chief and another
9	officer of the emergency medical services agency or the
10	supervisor or chief and another officer of the hazardous
11	materials response team shall sign the application attesting to
12	the individual's status as an active volunteer. The application
13	shall then be forwarded to the county, municipality or school
14	district, as appropriate, for final review and processing.
15	§ 7924. Rejection and appeal.
16	(a) General ruleA governing body that establishes a tax
17	credit under this chapter shall adopt, by ordinance or
18	resolution, a process for rejecting a claim by an active
19	volunteer who does not satisfy all of the criteria established
20	under this chapter for each type of tax credit provided under
21	this chapter.
22	(b) AppealAn active volunteer shall have the right to
23	appeal a claim that has been rejected by a governing body. The
24	governing body shall establish, by ordinance or resolution, the
25	procedure by which a rejected claim can be appealed.

27	MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS

29	7931. Penalties for false reporting.
30	<u>§ 7931. Penalties for false reporting.</u>
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1 <u>The following shall apply:</u>

2	(1) Any person who knowingly makes or conspires to make
3	a false service record report under this chapter to the
4	commissioner commits a misdemeanor of the first degree
5	punishable by a fine of \$2,500.
6	(2) Any person who knowingly provides or conspires to
7	provide false information that is used to compile a service
8	record report under this chapter commits a misdemeanor of the
9	<u>first degree punishable by a fine of \$2,500.</u>
10	Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
