7	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
8	hereby enacts as follows:
9	Section 1. The act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), known
10	as the Public School Code of 1949, is amended by adding a
11	section to read:
12	<u>Section 124. Pennsylvania Core Standards Commission(a)</u>
13	<u>The Pennsylvania Core Standards Commission is established.</u>
14	(b) The commission shall study the Pennsylvania Core
15	Standards under 22 Pa. Code Ch. 4 (relating to academic
16	standards and assessment) and make recommendations to the State
17	Board of Education for new standards to replace the Pennsylvania
18	Core Standards.
19	(c) The commission shall consist of the following members:

1	(1) The following persons to be appointed by the Governor:
2	(i) Two (2) professional educators currently teaching in a
3	public school offering classes at any grade level from
4	<u>kindergarten through grade twelve.</u>
5	(ii) One (1) parent of a student enrolled in a public school
6	offering classes at any grade level from kindergarten through
7	grade twelve.
8	(iii) Two (2) persons employed in the private sector.
9	(2) The Secretary of Education or the secretary's designee.
10	(3) The following persons to be appointed by the President
11	pro tempore of the Senate, in consultation with the Majority
12	Leader and Minority Leader of the Senate:
13	(i) Two (2) professional educators currently teaching in a

15	<u>kindergarten through grade twelve.</u>
	(ii) One (1) percent of a student enrolled in a public school

5	(c) The members of the commission shall be appointed no
6	later than thirty (30) days after the effective date of this
7	section.
8	(d) The commission shall appoint a member to serve as chair
9	of the commission.
10	(e) The commission shall hold meetings at the call of the
11	<u>chair.</u>
12	(f) The commission shall have the following powers and
13	<u>duties:</u>
14	(1) Consult with and utilize experts.
15	(2) Receive input from interested parties.
16	(3) Hold public hearings in different regions of this
17	Commonwealth.
18	(g) The members of the commission may not receive
19	compensation for their services, but shall be reimbursed for all
20	necessary travel and other reasonable expenses incurred in
21	connection with the performance of their duties as members of
22	the commission.
23	(h) The Department of Education shall:
24	(1) Provide administrative support, meeting space and any
25	other assistance required by the commission to carry out its
26	duties under this section.
27	(2) Provide the commission with data, research and other
28	information upon request by the commission.
29	(i) The commission shall submit its recommendations under
30	subsection (b) no later than six (6) months after the effective
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1 date of this section.

2 (j) The State Board of Education shall promulgate final_

- 4 (P.L.633, No.181), known as the "Regulatory Review Act," based
- 5 <u>on the recommendations received under subsection (i) no later</u>
- 6 than one (1) year after receipt of the recommendations under
- 7 subsection (i). The regulations promulgated under this
- 8 subsection shall not deviate from the recommendations received
- 9 <u>under subsection (i).</u>
- 10 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
