AN ACT

1 2 3 4	Amending the act of June 13, 1967 (P.L.31, No.21), entitled "An act to consolidate, editorially revise, and codify the public welfare laws of the Commonwealth," in public assistance, providing for work requirements.
5	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
6	hereby enacts as follows:
7	Section 1. The act of June 13, 1967 (P.L.31, No.21), known
8	as the Human Services Code, is amended by adding a section to
9	read:
10	<u>Section 441.10. Work Requirements(a) No later than March</u>
11	<u>1 of each year, the secretary shall apply to the Centers for</u>
12	Medicare and Medicaid Services of the United States Department
13	of Health and Human Services for a demonstration program under
14	section 1115 of the Social Security Act (49 Stat. 620, 42 U.S.C.
15	<u>§ 1315) for the following purposes:</u>
16	(1) Instituting a work requirement for a medical assistance
17	enrollee who is not exempt under paragraph (4). The work
18	requirement shall require a medical assistance enrollee to

1	become employed, actively seek employment as verified by the
2	department, or attend a job training program in accordance with
3	the following:
4	(i) In the case of a medical assistance enrollee who is
5	employed or attending job training programs in order to maintain
6	enrollment in the medical assistance program, the medical
7	assistance enrollee shall work twenty hours a week or complete
8	twelve job training program-related activities a month.
9	(ii) A medical assistance enrollee who has failed to comply
10	with the work requirement under subparagraph (i) shall
11	relinquish medical assistance program eligibility for the
12	following time periods:
13	(A) Three months beginning in year two of enrollment in
14	medical assistance.
15	(B) Six months beginning after the time period under clause
16	(A) expires.
17	(C) Nine months beginning after the time period under clause
18	<u>(B) expires.</u>
19	(2) Requiring an able-bodied medical assistance enrollee who
20	is nineteen years of age or older to verify on a biannual basis
21	or by request of the department the medical assistance
22	enrollee's family income or the medical assistance enrollee's
23	compliance with the provisions under paragraph (1) for the
24	purpose of determining the medical assistance enrollee's
25	<u>eligibility.</u>
26	(3) Delaying an individual from enrolling in a medical
27	assistance program if the individual has failed to comply with
28	paragraphs (1) and (2).
29	(4) Exempting a medical assistance enrollee from the
30	requirements under paragraphs (1) and (2) if the medical
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1	assistance enrollee meets any of the following conditions:
2	(i) Is attending high school as a full-time student.
3	(ii) Is currently receiving temporary or permanent long-term
4	disability benefits.
5	(iii) Is an individual eighteen years of age or younger or
6	<u>sixty-five years of age or older.</u>
7	<u>(iv) Is a pregnant woman.</u>
8	(v) Receives Supplemental Security Income (SSI) benefits.
9	(vi) Resides in a mental health institution or correctional
10	institution.
11	(vii) Is experiencing a crisis, serious medical condition or
12	temporary condition that prevents the Medicaid enrollee from
13	actively seeking employment, including, but not limited to,
14	<u>domestic violence or a substance use disorder.</u>
15	(viii) Is the primary caregiver to a dependent who is six
16	years of age or younger.
17	(ix) Is the primary caregiver to an individual who is
18	permanently disabled or who is in hospice care.
19	(b) The secretary's application for the demonstration
20	program under subsection (a) shall align with other assistance
21	programs that have work requirements in order to reduce the cost
22	of monitoring the work requirements.
23	(c) The demonstration program under subsection (a) may
24	include a medical assistance buy-in component to allow workers
25	with disabilities to have higher wage earnings and maintain
26	their medical assistance coverage.
27	Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.

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
