## AN ACT

10	the State Workmen's Insurance Fund; providing penalties; and	
11	repealing existing laws," in casualty insurance, providing	
12	for coverage for oral <del>anticancer</del> CHEMOTHERAPY medications.	<
13	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania	
14	hereby enacts as follows:	
15	Section 1. The act of May 17, 1921 (P.L.682, No.284), known	
16	as The Insurance Company Law of 1921, is amended by adding a	
17	section to read:	
18	Section 631.1. Coverage for Oral Anticancer CHEMOTHERAPY	<
19	Medications(a) Whenever a health insurance policy provides	

1	coverage that includes coverage for cancer chemotherapy or <
2	anticancer INTRAVENOUSLY ADMINISTERED OR INJECTED CHEMOTHERAPY <
3	medications which have been approved by the United States Food
4	and Drug Administration for general use in the treatment of
5	cancer, the policy shall not provide coverage or impose cost
6	<pre>sharing for a prescribed, orally administered anticancer &lt;</pre>
7	CHEMOTHERAPY medication on a less favorable basis than the <
8	coverage it provides or cost sharing it imposes for
9	intravenously administered or injected cancer CHEMOTHERAPY <
10	medications.
11	(b) A health insurance policy shall not comply with this <
12	section by imposing an increase in cost sharing solely for
13	orally administered, intravenously administered or injected
14	<u>cancer medications. CHEMOTHERAPY MEDICATIONS GREATER THAN THE</u> <
15	POLICY'S COST-SHARING PROVISIONS FOR MEDICAL BENEFITS GENERALLY.
16	INCREASE COST SHARING FOR CHEMOTHERAPY MEDICATIONS IN ORDER TO <
17	AVOID COMPLIANCE WITH SUBSECTION (A). A HEALTH INSURANCE POLICY
18	MAY INCREASE COST SHARING FOR CHEMOTHERAPY MEDICATIONS IF AN
19	INCREASE IS APPLIED GENERALLY TO OTHER MEDICAL OR PHARMACEUTICAL
20	BENEFITS ADMINISTERED IN A SIMILAR HEALTH CARE SETTING UNDER THE
21	CONTRACT.
22	(c) The prohibitions in subsections (a) and (b) do not
23	preclude a health insurance policy from requiring an enrollee to
24	obtain prior authorization before orally administered anticancer <
25	CHEMOTHERAPY medication is dispensed to the enrollee. AS PART OF <
26	PRIOR AUTHORIZATION, AN INSURER MAY CONSIDER THE MEDICAL
27	NECESSITY AND COST OF ORAL CHEMOTHERAPY MEDICATIONS COMPARED
28	WITH INTRAVENOUSLY ADMINISTERED OR INJECTED CHEMOTHERAPY
29	MEDICATION.
30	(D) THIS SECTION SHALL APPLY ONLY TO ORAL CHEMOTHERAPY <

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1	MEDICATIONS WHERE AN INTRAVENOUSLY ADMINISTERED OR INJECTED
2	CHEMOTHERAPY MEDICATION IS NOT EQUALLY MEDICALLY EFFECTIVE.
3	(E) THIS SECTION SHALL APPLY TO A HIGH DEDUCTIBLE HEALTH
4	PLAN ONLY, AS DEFINED IN SECTION 223(C)(2) OF THE INTERNAL <
5	REVENUE CODE OF 1986 (PUBLIC LAW 99-514, 26 U.S.C. § 223(C)(2)), <
6	ONLY AFTER THE COVERED PERSON'S DEDUCTIBLE HAS BEEN SATISFIED
7	FOR THE YEAR.
8	(d) (F) (E) This section shall apply to those health <
9	insurance policies issued or entered into or renewed on or after
10	the effective date of this section.
11	<del>(e) (G)</del> (F) As used in this section: <
12	"Anticancer CHEMOTHERAPY medication" means a drug or <
13	biological product that is used to kill, slow or prevent
14	MEDICATION PRESCRIBED BY A TREATING PHYSICIAN HEALTH CARE <
15	PRACTITIONER THAT IS NECESSARY TO KILL OR SLOW the growth of
16	cancerous cells.
17	"Cost sharing" means the cost to an individual insured under
18	a health insurance policy according to any coverage limit,
19	copayment, coinsurance, deductible or other out-of-pocket
20	expense requirements imposed by the policy, contract or
21	agreement.
22	"Health insurance policy" means any individual or group
23	health, sickness or accident policy, or subscriber contract or
24	certificate offered, issued or renewed by an entity subject to
25	one of the following:
26	(1) This act.
27	(2) The act of December 29, 1972 (P.L.1701, No.364), known
28	as the "Health Maintenance Organization Act."
29	(3) 40 Pa.C.S. Ch. 61 (relating to hospital plan
30	corporations) or 63 (relating to professional health services

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1 plan corporations).

The term does not include accident only, fixed indemnity,
limited benefit, credit, dental, vision, specified disease,
Medicare supplement, Civilian Health and Medical Program of the
Uniformed Services (CHAMPUS) supplement, long-term care or
disability income, workers' compensation or automobile medical
payment insurance.
Section 2. The addition of section 631.1 of the act applies

8 Section 2. The addition of section 631.1 of the act applies9 as follows:

10 (1) For health insurance policies for which either rates
11 or forms are required to be filed with the Insurance
12 Department or the Federal Government, section 631.1 of the
13 act shall apply to any such policy for which a form or rate
14 is first filed on or after the effective date of this
15 section.

16 (2) For health insurance policies for which neither
17 rates nor forms are required to be filed with the Insurance
18 Department or the Federal Government, section 631.1 of the
19 act shall apply to any such policy issued or renewed on or
20 after 180 days after the effective date of this section.
21 Section 3. This act shall take effect immediately.

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
