national origin, ancestry, mental or physical disability, sexual_ 1 orientation, gender or gender identity of another individual or 2 3 group of individuals, he commits an offense under any other provision of this article or under Chapter 33 (relating to 4 arson, criminal mischief and other property destruction) 5 exclusive of section 3307 (relating to institutional vandalism) 6 7 or under section 3503 (relating to criminal trespass) with 8 respect to such individual or his or her property or with 9 respect to one or more members of such group or to their 10 property.

(c) Definition.--As used in this section "malicious 12 13 intention" means the intention to commit any act, the commission 14 of which is a necessary element of any offense referred to in 15 subsection (a) motivated by hatred toward the actual or 16 perceived race, color, religion [or], national origin, ancestry, mental or physical disability, sexual orientation, gender or 17 18 gender identity of another individual or group of individuals. 19 Section 2. Section 8309(a) of Title 42 is amended to read: 20 § 8309. Civil rights violations.

21 Redress for personal injury.--A person who incurs injury (a) to his person or damage or loss to his property as a result of 22 23 conduct described in 18 Pa.C.S. § 2710 (relating to [ethnic] 24 unlawful intimidation) or 3307 (relating to institutional 25 vandalism) shall have a right of action against the actor for 26 injunction, damages or other appropriate civil or equitable relief. In the action, the issue of whether the defendant 27 engaged in the conduct alleged shall be determined according to 28 29 the burden of proof used in other civil actions for similar relief. The plaintiff may seek recovery for any of the 30

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1 following:

| 2 | (1) General and special damages, including damages for |
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| 3 | emotional distress. Damages under this paragraph shall be |
| 4 | actual damages or \$500, whichever is greater. |
| 5 | (2) Punitive damages. |
| 6 | (3) Reasonable attorney fees and costs. |
| 7 | (4) Injunctive and other equitable relief. |
