## AN ACT

18	"Kinship care." The care of a child by a kinship caregiver
19	when the biological or custodial parents of the child cannot

2	"Kinship caregiver." An individual who:
3	(1) is at least 21 years of age; and
4	(2) lives with and has legal responsibility for a child.

10	(c) EligibilityIn order to receive a fostering

15	113 Stat. 1822) as administered by the Department of Human
16	Services and must have applied for all available Federal and

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1 Duties of institutions of higher education.--Each (b) 2 institution of higher education shall do all of the following: \* \* \*

Section 3. Section 2605-K(1) of the act is amended and the section is amended by adding a paragraph to read: Section 2605-K. Report.

13 In order to determine and maximize the effectiveness of this 14 article, the department, in conjunction with the Department of 15 Human Services, shall collect information provided from 16 institutions of higher education under section 2603-K(b)(3) and prepare an anonymized report to be submitted by August 31, 2021, 17 18 and by August 31 of each year thereafter, to the chair and 19 minority chair of the Education Committee of the Senate, the 20 chair and minority chair of the Education Committee of the House 21 of Representatives, the chair and minority chair of the Health and Human Services Committee of the Senate and the chair and 22 23 minority chair of the Children and Youth Committee of the House 24 of Representatives that contains all of the following:
