- 26 Appropriation Act of 2019.
- 27 Section 102. Definitions.

- 2 2019, and ending June 30, 2020.
- 3 "Employees." Includes all directors, superintendents, bureau
- 4 or division chiefs, assistant directors, assistant
- 5 superintendents, assistant chiefs, experts, scientists,
- 6 engineers, surveyors, draftsmen, accountants, secretaries,
- 7 auditors, inspectors, examiners, analysts, statisticians,
- 8 marshals, clerks, stenographers, bookkeepers, messengers and
- 9 other assistants in a department, board or commission.
- 10 "Expenses" and "maintenance." Includes all printing, binding
- 11 and stationery, food and forage, materials and supplies,
- 12 traveling expenses, training, motor vehicle supplies and
- 13 repairs, freight, express and cartage, postage,
- 14 telecommunication devices and telecommunication rentals and toll
- 15 charges, newspaper advertising and notices, public advertising
- 16 by or through any medium, fuel, light, heat, power and water,
- 17 minor construction and renovation, repairs or reconstruction of
- 18 equipment, buildings and facilities, rent of real estate and
- 19 equipment, premiums on workers' compensation, insurance premiums
- 20 on policies of liability insurance, insurance premiums on
- 21 medical payment insurance and surety bonds for volunteer
- 22 workers, premiums on employee group life insurance and employee
- 23 and retired employee group hospital and medical insurance,
- 24 payment of Commonwealth share of Social Security taxes and
- 25 unemployment compensation costs for State employees, the
- 26 purchase of replacement or additional equipment and machinery
- 27 and all other incidental costs and expenses, including payment
- 28 to the Department of General Services of mileage and other
- 29 charges for the use of motor vehicles and rental payments for
- 30 permanently assigned motor vehicles and of expenses or costs of

- 1 services incurred through the Purchasing Fund. The term
- 2 "expenses" also shall include the medical costs for the
- 3 treatment of inmates of State institutions when the inmate must
- 4 be transferred to an outside hospital, provided that in no case
- 5 shall the State institution pay more for patient care than that
- 6 provided under the State medical assistance program.
- 7 "Prior fiscal year." The fiscal year beginning July 1 of the
- 8 fiscal year immediately prior to the current fiscal year.

- 29 (a) General Fund. -- The sums specified in this act, or as
- 30 much thereof as may be necessary, are specifically appropriated

- 1 from the General Fund to agencies of the Executive, Legislative
- 2 and Judicial Departments of the Commonwealth for the payment of
- 3 salaries, wages or other compensation and travel expenses of the
- 4 duly elected or appointed officers and employees of the
- 5 Commonwealth, for the payment of fees for contractual services
- 6 rendered, for the purchase or rental of goods and services,
- 7 printing, public advertising by or through any medium,
- 8 equipment, land and buildings and for payment of any other
- 9 expenses, as provided by law or by this act, necessary for the
- 10 proper conduct of the duties, functions and activities and for
- 11 the purposes specified in this act for the current fiscal year
- 12 and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid at
- 13 the close of the prior fiscal year.
- 14 (b) Special funds and accounts. -- The sums specified in this
- 15 act, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are specifically
- 16 appropriated from the special funds and accounts in the State
- 17 Treasury to agencies of the Executive Department of the
- 18 Commonwealth for the payment of salaries, wages or other
- 19 compensation and travel expenses of the duly appointed officers
- 20 and employees of the Commonwealth, for the payment of fees for
- 21 contractual services rendered, for the purchase or rental of
- 22 goods and services and for payment of any other expenses, as
- 23 provided by law or by this act, necessary for the proper conduct
- 24 of the duties, functions and activities and for the purposes
- 25 specified in this act for the current fiscal year and for the
- 26 payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of
- 27 the prior fiscal year.
- 28 Section 105. Federal appropriations.
- 29 The Federal appropriations specified in this act, or as much
- 30 thereof as may be necessary, are specifically appropriated to

- 1 the agencies of the Executive Department of the Commonwealth
- 2 specified in this act for the payment of the expenses of
- 3 implementing and carrying out the programs specified in this act
- 4 for the current fiscal year and for the payment of bills
- 5 incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the prior fiscal
- 6 year. Unless otherwise stated, the Federal appropriations
- 7 include any carryovers from the prior fiscal year.
- 8 Section 106. Block grants.
- 9 (a) Appropriations. -- The sums specified in this act, or as
- 10 much thereof as may be necessary, are specifically appropriated
- 11 from the block grant (BG) funds to agencies of the Executive
- 12 Department specified in this act for the purposes and under the
- 13 restrictions for which the funds are provided for the current
- 14 fiscal year.
- 15 (b) Small Communities Development Block Grant. -- The Small
- 16 Communities Development Block Grant (SCDBG) is to assist small
- 17 cities and communities that have a high concentration of
- 18 impoverished citizens and substandard housing to expand their
- 19 low-income and moderate-income housing opportunities and to meet
- 20 community development needs.
- 21 (c) Community Services Block Grant. -- The Community Services
- 22 Block Grant (CSBG) is to provide a range of services and
- 23 activities having a measurable and potentially major impact on
- 24 the causes of poverty in the community or those areas of the
- 25 community where poverty is a particularly acute problem. In
- 26 addition, new focus may be placed on the unemployed, both old
- 27 and new. Local agencies may lower their eligibility requirements
- 28 for recipients to three months to allow greater flexibility to
- 29 assure proper consideration of each recipient.
- 30 (d) Preventive Health and Health Services Block Grant. -- The

- 1 Preventive Health and Health Services Block Grant (PHHSBG) is
- 2 for the provision of preventive health and other health services
- 3 related to emergency medical systems, health initiative grants,
- 4 comprehensive public health, hypertension, fluoridation, health
- 5 education, risk reduction, home health, rape crisis and domestic
- 6 violence services.
- 7 (e) Maternal and Child Health Services Block Grant. -- The
- 8 Maternal and Child Health Services Block Grant (MCHSBG) is to
- 9 enable states to maintain and strengthen their leadership in
- 10 planning, promoting, coordinating and evaluating health care for
- 11 pregnant women, mothers, infants and children, and children with
- 12 special health care needs and in providing health services for
- 13 mothers and children who do not have access to adequate health
- 14 care.
- 15 (f) Low-Income Home Energy Assistance Block Grant.--The Low-
- 16 Income Home Energy Assistance Block Grant (LIHEABG) is to help
- 17 lessen the impact of the high cost of energy on low-income
- 18 families and individuals, including energy efficiency grants for
- 19 low-income dwellings. No less than 15% of the LIHEABG funds
- 20 received shall be used for weatherization. LIHEABG funds
- 21 received pursuant to a Presidential release of contingency funds
- 22 shall be exempt from the 15% requirement.
- 23 (q) Social Services Block Grant. -- The Social Services Block
- 24 Grant (SSBG) is for the provision of social services to eligible
- 25 persons.
- 26 (h) Mental Health Services Block Grant.--The Mental Health
- 27 Services Block Grant (MHSBG) provides funds for the provision of
- 28 services to adults with serious mental illness or children with
- 29 serious emotional disturbance.
- 30 (i) Substance Abuse Block Grant. -- The Substance Abuse Block

- 1 Grant (SABG) provides funds to establish and maintain programs
- 2 to combat alcohol and drug abuse.
- 3 (j) Child Care and Development Fund Block Grant. -- The Child
- 4 Care and Development Fund Block Grant (CCDFBG) is for the
- 5 provision of direct child care or to increase the quality and
- 6 availability of child care for low-income families.
- 7 (k) Temporary Assistance for Needy Families Block Grant.--
- 8 The Temporary Assistance for Needy Families Block Grant (TANFBG)
- 9 provides funds for the provision of cash grants, child care,
- 10 training and support services, child welfare and administration
- 11 for eligible families and individuals.
- 12 Section 107. Appropriations to Pennsylvania Higher Education
- 13 Assistance Agency.
- 14 The appropriations set forth in this act to the Pennsylvania
- 15 Higher Education Assistance Agency, which is an integral part
- 16 and arm of the Commonwealth and which is directly controlled by
- 17 the Commonwealth, shall supplement other Commonwealth funds
- 18 maintained by the Pennsylvania Higher Education Assistance
- 19 Agency in order to fulfill its essential State governmental
- 20 function of providing Commonwealth students with access to
