8	CHAPTER 1		
9	PRELIMINARY PROVISIONS		
10	Section 101. Short title.		
11	This act shall be known and may be cited as the Central		
12	Service Technician and Surgical Technologist Regulation Act.		
13	Section 102. Definitions.		
14	The following words and phrases when used in this act shall		
15	have the meanings given to them in this section unless the		
16	context clearly indicates otherwise:		
17	"Ambulatory surgical facility." As defined in section 802.1		
18	of the act of July 19, 1979 (P.L.130, No.48), known as the		
19	Health Care Facilities Act.		
20	"Central service technician." An individual who provides the		
21	services of inspecting, assembling, decontamination,		
22	preparation, packaging and sterilization of reusable medical		
23	instruments or devices in a hospital or an ambulatory surgical		
24	facility.		
25	"Department." The Department of Health of the Commonwealth.		
26	"Health care facility." A hospital, ambulatory surgical		
27	center or freestanding surgical outpatient facility.		
28	"Health care practitioner." As defined in section 103 of		
29	the Health Care Facilities Act.		
30	"Hospital." As defined in section 802.1 of the Health Care		
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1 Facilities Act.

"Surgical technologist." An individual who is employed or 2 3 contracted by a health care facility to perform surgical technology tasks and functions AS DIRECTED. 4 <---5 "Surgical technology." Surgical patient care that includes, 6 but is not limited to, the following tasks or functions: 7 (1) preparing the operating room and the sterile field <-for surgical procedures by ensuring that surgical equipment 8 9 is functioning properly and safely and preparing sterilesupplies, instruments and equipment using sterile technique; 10 11 and 12 (2) as directed, performing tasks at the sterile field, 13 including: 14 (i) maintaining asepsis and correcting breaks in the 15 sterile field; 16 (ii) passing supplies, equipment or instruments according to the needs of the surgical team; 17 18 (iii) sponging or suctioning an operative site; 19 (iv) preparing and cutting suture material; 20 (v) transferring and irrigating with fluids; 21 (vi) transferring but not administering drugs within 22 the sterile field; 23 (vii) handling specimens; (viii) holding retractors and other instruments; 24 25 (ix) applying electrocautery to clamps on bleeders; 26 (x) connecting drains to suction apparatus; 27 (xi) applying dressings to closed wounds; and 28 (xii) performing sponge, needle, supply and 29 instrument counts with the registered nurse circulator. 7 (3) PARTICIPATING IN THE TIME-OUT PROCESS OF VERIFYING
8 THE CORRECT PATIENT, PROCEDURE AND SURGICAL SITE;

9 (4) ANTICIPATING THE NEEDS OF THE SURGEON, BASED ON
10 KNOWLEDGE OF HUMAN ANATOMY AND PATHOPHYSIOLOGY, BY PREPARING
11 AND PASSING INSTRUMENTS AND SUPPLIES DURING A SURGICAL
12 PROCEDURE:

(5) SPONGING AND SUCTIONING THE OPERATIVE SITE;

14 (6) PREPARING AND CUTTING SUTURE MATERIAL;

15 (7) PREPARING AND POURING IRRIGATION SOLUTIONS DURING A16 SURGICAL PROCEDURE;

17 (8) PREPARING AND PASSING MEDICATIONS AND HEMOSTATIC18 AGENTS DURING A SURGICAL PROCEDURE;

(9) TRANSFERRING AND ADMINISTERING DRUGS WITHIN THE
 STERILE FIELD IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE APPLICABLE LAWS OF THIS
 COMMONWEALTH;

(10) PREPARING AND PASSING OFF SPECIMENS;

23 (11) HOLDING RETRACTORS OR OTHER INSTRUMENTS;

24 (12) APPLYING ELECTROCAUTERY TO CLAMPS OR FORCEPS ON
 25 BLEEDING VESSELS;

26 (13) OPERATING THE CAMERA DURING AN ENDOSCOPIC
 27 PROCEDURE;

28 (14) PLACING INSTRUMENTS IN ROBOTIC ARMS DURING A
29 SURGICAL PROCEDURE;

30 (15) CONNECTING DRAINS TO SUCTION APPARATUSES;

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1 (16)PERFORMING URINARY CATHETERIZATIONS; PREPARING AND APPLYING STERILE DRESSINGS TO CLOSED 2 (17)3 WOUNDS; PERFORMING COUNTS OF SPONGES, NEEDLES, SUPPLIES AND 4 (18)5 INSTRUMENTS WITH A REGISTERED NURSE CIRCULATOR; CLEANING AND PREPARING INSTRUMENTS FOR 6 (19)STERILIZATION UPON COMPLETION OF A SURGICAL PROCEDURE; 7 (20) ASSISTING THE SURGICAL TEAM WITH CLEANING OF THE 8 9 OPERATING ROOM UPON COMPLETION OF A SURGICAL PROCEDURE; 10 (21) ASSISTING WITH TRANSFERRING THE PATIENT TO AND POSITIONING THE PATIENT ON THE OPERATING TABLE; AND 11 (22) MAINTAINING THE HIGHEST STANDARD OF STERILE 12 13 TECHNIQUE, INCLUDING IDENTIFYING AND CORRECTING BREAKS IN THE 14 STERILE OPERATING FIELD. 15 CHAPTER 3 CENTRAL SERVICE TECHNICIANS 16 17 Section 301. Certification. 18 (a) Requirements. -- An individual shall not function as a 19 central service technician in a health care facility, and a health care facility shall not employ or otherwise contract for 20 the services of a central service technician unless the 21 22 individual has successfully passed a nationally accredited 23 central service exam for central service technicians and holds 24 and maintains one of the following credentials: 25 (1) Certified registered central service technician 26 credential. 27 (2) Certified sterile processing and distribution technician credential. 28 29 (b) Exemption.--The certification requirement under 30 subsection (a) shall not apply to an individual who has been

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employed or otherwise contracted for services as a central
 service technician in a hospital or ambulatory surgical facility
 on or before December 31, 2019 THE EFFECTIVE DATE OF THIS ACT. <--
 Section 302. Employment and continuing education.

5 (a) New employees.--A central service technician who does 6 not meet the requirements under section 301 shall have 18 months 7 from the date of hire to comply with section 301.

8 (b) Continuing education.--An individual who qualifies to 9 function as a central service technician in a hospital or an 10 ambulatory surgical facility under section 301 shall annually 11 complete 10 hours of continuing education to remain qualified as 12 a central service technician. The continuing education required 13 under this subsection shall be in areas related to the functions 14 of a central service technician.

15 (c) Facility responsibility.--

(1) A hospital or ambulatory surgical facility shall
 maintain documentation to verify that an individual meets the
 certification requirements under section 301(a).

19 (2)If an individual does not meet the certification 20 requirements under section 301(a), a hospital or ambulatory 21 surgical facility shall maintain documentation of a central 22 service technician's dates of employment or the contract 23 period when the central service technician provided services 24 to the hospital or ambulatory surgical facility to verify 25 that the central service technician meets the exemption 26 requirements under section 301(b).

27 Section 303. Scope of practice.

Nothing in this chapter may be construed to prohibit any of the following individuals from performing the tasks or functions of a central service technician:

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(1) A health care practitioner.

2 (2) A dental assistant or an individual who is licensed
3 or registered under the act of May 1, 1933 (P.L.216, No.76),
4 known as The Dental Law.

5 (3) A student or intern performing the functions of a 6 central service technician under the direct supervision of a 7 health care practitioner as part of the student's or intern's 8 training or internship.

9 Section 304. Departmental duties.

10 The department shall administer the provisions of this 11 chapter and promulgate and adopt such regulations as may be 12 necessary to implement this act.

CHAPTER 5

15 Section 501. Requirements for health care facilities.

16 The following apply:

17 (1) A health care facility shall not employ or otherwise 18 contract for the services of a surgical technologist in a 19 health care facility unless the individual meets at least one 20 of the following:

(i) has successfully completed a program accredited
by the Commission on Accreditation of Allied Health
Education Programs or other nationally accredited
educational program for surgical technologists and holds
and maintains the Certified Surgical Technologist
credential administered by the National Board of Surgical
Technology and Surgical Assisting or its successor;

(ii) has successfully completed an appropriate
training program for surgical technology in the United
States Army, Navy, Air Force, Marine Corps or Coast Guard

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or in the United States Public Health Service;

2 (iii) provides evidence that the individual was
3 employed to practice surgical technology AS THE
4 INDIVIDUAL'S PRIMARY FUNCTION in a health care facility
5 on the effective date of this act or was employed to
6 practice surgical technology during the two years
7 immediately preceding the effective date of this act; or

8 (iv) is in the service of the Federal Government, to 9 the extent that the individual is performing duties 10 related to that service.

(2) A HEALTH CARE FACILITY THAT EMPLOYS OR CONTRACTS <--
WITH AN INDIVIDUAL TO PRACTICE SURGICAL TECHNOLOGY SHALL
VERIFY THE DATES OF EMPLOYMENT OF THE INDIVIDUAL OR CONTRACT
PERIOD WITH THE INDIVIDUAL UPON REQUEST BY ANY OF THE
FOLLOWING:

16 (I) ANOTHER HEALTH CARE FACILITY;

17 (II) ANOTHER INDIVIDUAL WHO IS EMPLOYED BY OR
18 CONTRACTS WITH THE HEALTH CARE FACILITY TO PRACTICE
19 SURGICAL TECHNOLOGY; OR

20 (III) ANOTHER INDIVIDUAL WHO WAS FORMERLY EMPLOYED
21 BY OR CONTRACTED WITH THE HEALTH CARE FACILITY TO
22 PRACTICE SURGICAL TECHNOLOGY.

23 (2) (3) A health care facility may employ or contract an <--24 individual to practice surgical technology during the 12-<---25 month SIX-MONTH period immediately following successful <---26 completion of a surgical technology program, but may not continue to be employed or contracted with beyond that period 27 28 without documentation that the employee or contractor holds 29 and maintains the Certified Surgical Technologist credential 30 required under paragraph (1)(i).

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1 Section 502. Continuing education.

2 (a) General rule. An individual who qualifies to practice <--</p>
3 surgical technology in a health care facility under section4 501(1)(i) or (ii) must annually complete 15 hours of continuing5 education to remain qualified to practice as a surgical6 technologist.

7 (A) COMPLIANCE. -- AN INDIVIDUAL WHO IS EMPLOYED BY OR
8 CONTRACTS WITH A HEALTH CARE FACILITY TO PRACTICE SURGICAL
9 TECHNOLOGY AND IS CERTIFIED UNDER SECTION 501(1)(I) SHALL:

10 (1) COMPLY WITH THE CONTINUING EDUCATION REQUIREMENTS AS
 11 NECESSARY TO MAINTAIN THE CERTIFIED SURGICAL TECHNOLOGIST
 12 CREDENTIAL UNDER SECTION 501(1)(I); AND

13 (2) PROVIDE PROOF OF COMPLIANCE WITH THE CONTINUING
14 EDUCATION REQUIREMENTS TO THE HEALTH CARE FACILITY UPON
15 REQUEST.

16 (B) ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENT.--AN INDIVIDUAL WHO IS EMPLOYED
17 BY OR CONTRACTS WITH A HEALTH CARE FACILITY TO PRACTICE SURGICAL
18 TECHNOLOGY AND IS NOT CERTIFIED UNDER SECTION 501(1)(I) OR HAS
19 LET THE INDIVIDUAL'S CERTIFICATION LAPSE SHALL:

20 (1) COMPLETE 30 HOURS OF RELEVANT CONTINUING EDUCATION
21 EVERY TWO YEARS IN ORDER TO REMAIN ELIGIBLE TO PRACTICE
22 SURGICAL TECHNOLOGY; AND

(2) BE RESPONSIBLE FOR PROVING, TO THE SATISFACTION OF
THE HEALTH CARE FACILITY, THAT THE INDIVIDUAL COMPLIES WITH
THIS SUBSECTION.

(b) (C) Verification.--A health care facility that employs <--</p>
or contracts with an individual to practice surgical technology
shall verify that the individual meets the continuing education
requirements under subsection (a) (B) or, if applicable, that <--</p>
the individual holds and maintains the Certified Surgical

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Technologist credential as required under section 501(1)(i).
 Section 503. Exception.

A health care facility may employ or otherwise contract with an individual who does not meet the requirements of section 501 to practice surgical technology in a health care facility if:

6 (1) after a diligent and thorough effort has been made, 7 the health care facility is unable to employ or contract with 8 a sufficient number of qualified surgical technologists who 9 meet the requirements of section 501; and

10 (2) the health care facility makes a written record of 11 its efforts under paragraph (1) and retains the record at the 12 health care facility.

13 Section 504. Scope of practice.

Nothing in this chapter may be construed to prohibit any of the following individuals from performing the tasks or functions of a surgical technologist:

(1) A health care practitioner.

18 (2) A dental assistant or an individual who is licensed
19 or registered under the act of May 1, 1933 (P.L.216, No.76),
20 known as The Dental Law.

(3) A student or intern performing the functions of a
 central service technician SURGICAL TECHNOLOGIST under the
 direct supervision of a health care practitioner as part of
 the student's or intern's training or internship.

25 Section 505. Applicability.

Nothing in this chapter shall prohibit any licensed practitioner from performing surgical technology tasks or functions if the practitioner is acting within the scope of the practitioner's license.

30 Section 506. Departmental duties.

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1	The Department of Health shall enforce the provisions of this
2	chapter.

5	Section 2101. Effective date.
6	This act shall take effect in 60 days.
