- 6 § 9701. Definitions.
- 7 The following words and phrases when used in this chapter
- 8 shall have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
- 9 <u>context clearly indicates otherwise:</u>
- 10 "Program." The Veterans and Reservists Entrepreneurial
- 11 Training and Support Program.
- 12 "Reservist." A member of a United States Armed Forces
- 13 <u>reserve component or National Guard.</u>
- 14 <u>"Secretary." The Secretary of Community and Economic</u>
- 15 <u>Development of the Commonwealth.</u>
- 16 "Small business." A company that is engaged in a for-profit
- 17 enterprise and employs no more than 100 individuals.
- 18 "Veteran." An individual who served in the United States
- 19 Armed Forces, including a reserve component or the National
- 20 Guard, and who was discharged or released from service under
- 21 conditions other than dishonorable.
- 22 <u>"Veteran-owned small business." A small business owned and</u>
- 23 controlled by a veteran. The term shall include a small business
- 24 owned and controlled by a member of a United States Armed Forces
- 25 reserve component or National Guard.
- 26 <u>§ 9702. Program establishment.</u>
- The Department of Community and Economic Development, in
- 28 consultation with the department, shall establish the Veterans
- 29 and Reservists Entrepreneurial Training and Support Program
- 30 within the Department of Community and Economic Development to

- 1 provide small business and entrepreneurial-focused services to
- 2 <u>veterans</u>, <u>reservists</u> and the <u>dependents</u> of <u>veterans</u> and
- 3 reservists for purposes of assisting the individuals in
- 4 <u>obtaining the skills necessary to create, manage and operate a</u>
- 5 small business.
- 6 § 9703. Program components and Department of Community and
- 7 <u>Economic Development duties.</u>
- 8 (a) Establishment.--In developing the program, the
- 9 Department of Community and Economic Development shall establish
- 10 the following program components:
- 11 (1) A network of veterans and reservists business
- centers throughout this Commonwealth. Business centers shall
- be colocated at State System of Higher Education universities
- or community colleges to maximize innovative potential and
- 15 minimize program costs. The secretary shall ensure the
- 16 utilization and coordination of available resources,
- including, but not limited to, PA CareerLink centers, Small
- 18 Business Development Centers and the Ben Franklin Technology
- 19 Partners. The number and location of the veterans and
- 20 reservists business centers shall be at the discretion of the
- 21 secretary, except that veterans, reservists and dependents of
- veterans and reservists from all areas of this Commonwealth
- 23 <u>must have reasonable access to all services under this</u>
- 24 chapter by June 30, 2024.
- 25 (2) A strong academic foundation to support ongoing
- training and research capabilities.
- 27 (3) A sustainable business model to ensure the program
- continues beyond its initial start-up period.
- 29 (4) Open innovation practices, through ongoing doctoral-
- 30 level research, job training and program evaluation, that

- 1 share lessons learned and showcase best practices.
- 2 (b) Services. -- Services provided through the program must
- 3 adequately provide for the unique needs of veterans, reservists
- 4 and dependents of veterans and reservists. The training and
- 5 <u>development provided must be tailored to address individual</u>
- 6 <u>entrepreneurial needs. Each business center established under</u>
- 7 this section shall, at a minimum, provide the following
- 8 services:
- 9 (1) Financial guidance, including training and
- 10 counseling on applying for and securing business credit and
- 11 <u>investment capital, preparing and presenting financial</u>
- 12 <u>statements and managing cash flow and other operations of a</u>
- 13 <u>small business concern.</u>
- 14 (2) Information seminars on securing loans, business
- 15 plan development, marketing, accounting, budgeting and
- 16 <u>merchandising.</u>
- 17 (3) Assistance for veteran-owned small businesses to
- 18 facilitate access to traditional and nontraditional financing
- 19 sources.
- 20 (4) Counseling for members of reserve components to
- 21 prepare their businesses for periods when reservists are
- 22 under orders for active duty for a substantial period of
- 23 time.
- 24 (5) Coordinated services to assist unemployed veterans
- 25 <u>and reservists or dependents of veterans and reservists in</u>
- 26 becoming entrepreneurs.
- 27 (6) Assistance with the Commonwealth procurement
- 28 process, the Pennsylvania Small Business Contracting Program
- and other federally sponsored and State-sponsored programs
- that provide opportunities for doing business.

1	(7) Guidance on management, training, planning,
2	organization, staffing, direction and control of each major
3	activity and function of a small business concern.
4	(8) Assistance with marketing and training in marketing,
5	preparing and executing marketing plans, developing pricing
6	strategies, locating contracting opportunities, negotiating
7	contracts and using public relations and advertising.
8	(c) Coordination Whenever possible, the Department of
9	Community and Economic Development shall coordinate with the
10	Department of Labor and Industry to effectuate this chapter.
11	Information provided by the Joint State Government Commission
12	pursuant to Senate Resolution 255, Printer's Number 1465,
13	adopted on December 18, 2015, shall be utilized to assist the

14 <u>department in the implementation of this chapter.</u>

Section 4. This act shall take effect in 60 days.

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
