- 8 The following words and phrases when used in this chapter
- 9 shall have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
- 10 context clearly indicates otherwise:
- 11 "Program." The Veterans and Reservists Entrepreneurial
- 12 <u>Training and Support Program.</u>
- 13 <u>"Reservist." A member of a United States Armed Forces</u>
- 14 reserve component or National Guard.
- "Secretary." The Secretary of Community and Economic
- 16 <u>Development of the Commonwealth.</u>
- 17 "Small business." A company that is engaged in a for-profit
- 18 enterprise and employs no more than 100 individuals.
- 19 "Veteran." An individual who served in the United States
- 20 Armed Forces, including a reserve component or the National
- 21 Guard, and who was discharged or released from service under
- 22 conditions other than dishonorable.
- 23 "Veteran-owned small business." A small business owned and
- 24 controlled by a veteran. The term shall include a small business
- 25 <u>owned and controlled by a member of a United States Armed Forces</u>
- 26 reserve component or National Guard.
- 27 § 9702. Program establishment.
- The Department of Community and Economic Development, in
- 29 <u>consultation with the department, shall establish the Veterans</u>
- 30 and Reservists Entrepreneurial Training and Support Program

- 1 within the Department of Community and Economic Development to
- 2 provide small business and entrepreneurial-focused services to
- 3 veterans, reservists and the dependents of veterans and
- 4 <u>reservists for purposes of assisting the individuals in</u>
- 5 obtaining the skills necessary to create, manage and operate a
- 6 <u>small business.</u>
- 7 § 9703. Program components and Department of Community and
- 8 <u>Economic Development duties.</u>
- 9 (a) Establishment.--In developing the program, the
- 10 Department of Community and Economic Development shall establish
- 11 the following program components:
- 12 (1) A network of veterans and reservists business
- centers throughout this Commonwealth. Business centers shall
- be colocated at State System of Higher Education universities
- or community colleges to maximize innovative potential and
- minimize program costs. The secretary shall ensure the
- 17 utilization and coordination of available resources,
- including, but not limited to, PA CareerLink centers, Small
- 19 Business Development Centers and the Ben Franklin Technology
- 20 Partners. The number and location of the veterans and
- 21 reservists business centers shall be at the discretion of the
- 22 secretary, except that veterans, reservists and dependents of
- 23 veterans and reservists from all areas of this Commonwealth
- 24 <u>must have reasonable access to all services under this</u>
- 25 <u>chapter by June 30, 2022.</u>
- 26 (2) A strong academic foundation to support ongoing
- 27 <u>training and research capabilities.</u>
- 28 (3) A sustainable business model to ensure the program
- 29 <u>continues beyond its initial start-up period.</u>
- 30 (4) Open innovation practices, through ongoing doctoral-

- level research, job training and program evaluation, that
- 2 <u>share lessons learned and showcase best practices.</u>
- 3 <u>(b) Services.--Services provided through the program must</u>
- 4 <u>adequately provide for the unique needs of veterans, reservists</u>
- 5 and dependents of veterans and reservists. The training and
- 6 <u>development provided must be tailored to address individual</u>
- 7 <u>entrepreneurial needs. Each business center established under</u>
- 8 this section shall, at a minimum, provide the following
- 9 services:
- 10 (1) Financial guidance, including training and
- 11 <u>counseling on applying for and securing business credit and</u>
- 12 <u>investment capital, preparing and presenting financial</u>
- 13 <u>statements and managing cash flow and other operations of a</u>
- small business concern.
- 15 (2) Information seminars on securing loans, business
- 16 plan development, marketing, accounting, budgeting and
- 17 merchandising.
- 18 (3) Assistance for veteran-owned small businesses to
- 19 <u>facilitate access to traditional and nontraditional financing</u>
- 20 sources.
- 21 (4) Counseling for members of reserve components to
- 22 prepare their businesses for periods when reservists are
- 23 <u>under orders for active duty for a substantial period of</u>
- 24 time.
- 25 (5) Coordinated services to assist unemployed veterans
- 26 <u>and reservists or dependents of veterans and reservists in</u>
- 27 <u>becoming entrepreneurs.</u>
- 28 (6) Assistance with the Commonwealth procurement
- process, the Pennsylvania Small Business Contracting Program
- and other federally sponsored and State-sponsored programs

- that provide opportunities for doing business.
- 2 (7) Guidance on management, training, planning,
- 3 <u>organization, staffing, direction and control of each major</u>
- 4 <u>activity and function of a small business concern.</u>
- 5 (8) Assistance with marketing and training in marketing,
- 6 preparing and executing marketing plans, developing pricing
- 7 <u>strategies, locating contracting opportunities, negotiating</u>
- 8 <u>contracts and using public relations and advertising.</u>
- 9 (c) Coordination. -- Whenever possible, the Department of
- 10 Community and Economic Development shall coordinate with the
- 11 Department of Labor and Industry to effectuate this chapter.
- 12 <u>Information provided by the Joint State Government Commission</u>
- 13 pursuant to Senate Resolution 255, Printer's Number 1465,
- 14 adopted on December 18, 2015, shall be utilized to assist the
- 15 department in the implementation of this chapter.
- 16 Section 4. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
