AN ACT

Amending the act of December 19, 1990 (P.L.1200, No.202), 1 entitled "An act providing for the registration and 2 regulation of solicitations by charitable organizations, 3 professional fundraisers and other solicitors; imposing additional powers on the Department of State and the Office of Attorney General; prescribing civil and criminal penalties; and making a repeal," further providing for 7 registration of charitable organizations and financial 8 reports and fees and failure to file, for limitation on activities of charitable organizations and disclosure 10 requirements and for prohibited acts. 11 12 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 13 hereby enacts as follows: 14 Section 1. Sections 5(e) and 13(a) of the act of December 19, 1990 (P.L.1200, No.202), known as the Solicitation of Funds 15 16 for Charitable Purposes Act, are amended to read: 17 Section 5. Registration of charitable organizations; financial 18 reports; fees; failure to file. 19 20 (e) Financial report. --21 (1) With each registration statement filed under this 22 section, a charitable organization must file a financial

- 1 report for the immediately preceding fiscal year, which shall
- 2 contain a balance sheet and statements of revenue, expenses
- and changes in fund balances indicating the organization's
- 4 gross revenue, the amount of funds received from
- 5 solicitations or other fundraising activities and all
- 6 expenditures for supplies, equipment, goods, services,
- 7 programs, activities or other expenses, a detailed list of
- 8 all salaries and wages paid and expenses allowed to any
- 9 officer or employee if the organization is not required to
- 10 file an Internal Revenue Service Form 990 and the disposition
- of the net proceeds received from solicited contributions or
- 12 other fundraising activities.
- 13 (2) No charitable organization shall solicit
- 14 <u>contributions or have contributions solicited on the</u>
- 15 <u>charitable organization's behalf if the charitable</u>
- organization fails to expend in the current fiscal year at
- 17 least 60% of the charitable organization's gross revenue for
- 18 the immediately prior fiscal year on goods or services, as
- defined in section 3 of the act of November 26, 1997
- 20 (P.L.508, No.55), known as the Institutions of Purely Public
- 21 Charity Act, until the department determines that the
- 22 charitable organization is expending the minimum required
- amount on goods or services and notifies the charitable
- organization that the charitable organization may resume
- 25 solicitation.

- 27 Section 13. Limitation on activities of charitable
- organizations; disclosure requirements.
- 29 (a) Solicitation limitation.--
- 30 (1) A charitable organization may only solicit

- 1 contributions for the charitable purpose expressed in
- 2 solicitation for contributions or the registration statement
- 3 of the charitable organization and may only apply
- 4 contributions in a manner substantially consistent with that
- 5 purpose.
- 6 (2) A charitable organization that fails to expend the
- 7 minimum required amount, as provided in section 5(e)(2), on
- 8 goods or services shall immediately cease all solicitation
- 9 and notify the department within 15 days.

- 11 Section 2. Section 15(a) of the act is amended by adding
- 12 paragraphs to read:
- 13 Section 15. Prohibited acts.
- 14 (a) General rule. -- Regardless of a person's intent or the
- 15 lack of injury, the following acts and practices are prohibited
- 16 in the planning, conduct or execution of any solicitation or
- 17 charitable sales promotion:

- 19 (14) Failing to expend the minimum required amount, as
- 20 provided in section 5(e)(2), on goods or services.
- 21 (15) Failing to immediately cease all solicitation if
- 22 the charitable organization does not expend the minimum
- required amount, as provided in section 5(e)(2), on goods or
- 24 services.
- 25 (16) Failing to notify the department within 15 days
- that the charitable organization is no longer expending the
- 27 <u>minimum required amount, as provided in section 5(e)(2), on</u>
- 28 goods or services.

- 30 Section 3. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
