## AN ACT

- 1 Providing for the rights and privileges of homeless persons.
- 2 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 3 hereby enacts as follows:
- 4 Section 1. Short title.
- 5 This act shall be known and may be cited as the Bill of
- 6 Rights for the Homeless Act.
- 7 Section 2. Definitions.
- 8 The following words and phrases when used in this act shall
- 9 have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
- 10 context clearly indicates otherwise:
- "Homeless." The term shall have the same meaning as in
- 12 section 103 of the McKinney-Vento Homeless Assistance Act
- 13 (Public Law 100-77, 101 stat. 482)
- 14 "Housing status." The status of having or not having a fixed
- 15 or regular residence, including the status of living on the
- 16 streets, in a shelter or in a temporary residence.

- 1 Section 3. Legislative intent.
- 2 The following shall apply:
- 3 (1) It is the long-standing policy of this Commonwealth
- 4 that no individual should suffer unnecessarily from cold or
- 5 hunger, be deprived of shelter, or the basic rights incident
- 6 to shelter, or be subject to unfair discrimination based on
- 7 the individual's homeless status.
- 8 (2) Many individuals have been rendered homeless as a
- 9 result of economic hardship, a severe shortage of safe and
- 10 affordable housing and a shrinking social safety net.
- 11 (3) It is the intent of the General Assembly to lessen
- the adverse effects and conditions caused by homelessness.
- 13 Section 4. Rights afforded to homeless individuals.
- 14 (a) General rule. -- No individual's rights, privileges or
- 15 access to public services may be denied or abridged solely
- 16 because the individual is homeless.
- 17 (b) Specific rights.--A homeless individual shall be granted
- 18 the same rights and privileges as other residents of this
- 19 Commonwealth. A homeless individual shall have all of the
- 20 following rights:
- 21 (1) To use and move freely in public spaces, including,
- but not limited to, public sidewalks, public parks, public
- transportation and public buildings, in the same manner as
- 24 any other individual and without discrimination on the basis
- of the individual's housing status.
- 26 (2) To equal treatment by State and local government
- agencies, without discrimination on the basis of housing
- 28 status.
- 29 (3) To be free from discrimination while maintaining
- 30 employment due to the individual's lack of permanent mailing

- 1 address or due to the fact that the mailing address used by
- 2 the individual is for a shelter or social service provider.
- 3 (4) To emergency medical care free from discrimination 4 based on the individual's housing status.
- 5 (5) To vote, register to vote and receive documentation 6 necessary to prove identity for voting without discrimination 7 due to the individual's housing status.
- 8 (6) To protection from disclosure of the individual's
  9 records and information provided to homeless shelters and
  10 social service providers without appropriate legal authority.
- 11 (7) To confidentiality of personal records and
  12 information in accordance with limitations on disclosure
  13 established by the following:
- 14 (i) Federal Homeless Management Information Systems.
- 15 (ii) The Health Insurance Portability and
- Accountability Act of 1996 (Public Law 104-191, 110 Stat.
- 17 1936).
- 18 (iii) The Violence Against Women Act of 1994 (Title 19 IV of Public Law 103-322, 108 Stat. 1902).
- 20 (8) To a reasonable expectation of privacy in the 21 individual's personal property to the same extent as personal
- 22 property in a permanent residence.
- 23 Section 5. Damages and attorney fees.
- In a civil action alleging a violation of this act, the court
- 25 may award appropriate injunctive and declaratory relief, actual
- 26 damages and reasonable attorney fees and costs to a prevailing
- 27 plaintiff.
- 28 Section 6. Effective date.
- 29 This act shall take effect in 60 days.
