## AN ACT

- 11 It is the intent of the General Assembly through this
- 12 legislation to reduce barriers for small business owners,
- 13 workers and returning residents of this Commonwealth who want to
- 14 enter the workforce in an occupation requiring a license.
- 15 § 4402. Definitions.
- The following words and phrases when used in this chapter
- 17 shall have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
- 18 context clearly indicates otherwise:
- 19 "Office." The Governor's Office of the Budget.
- 20 <u>"Pilot agencies." The following entities:</u>
- 21 (1) The Bureau of Professional and Occupational Affairs
- in the Department of State of the Commonwealth.
- 23 (2) The Pennsylvania Board of Probation and Parole.
- 24 "Program." The regulatory reduction pilot program under
- 25 section 4403 (relating to establishment).
- 26 "Regulation." Any rule or regulation, or order in the nature
- 27 of a rule or regulation, promulgated by an agency under
- 28 statutory authority in the administration of any statute
- 29 administered by or relating to the agency or amending, revising
- 30 or otherwise altering the terms and provisions of an existing

- 1 regulation, or prescribing the practice or procedure before the
- 2 agency. The term shall also include actions of the Pennsylvania <--
- 3 Liquor Control Board that have an effect on the discount rate
- 4 <u>for retail licensees.</u>
- 5 "Regulatory requirement." An action required to be taken or
- 6 <u>information required to be provided in accordance with a statute</u>
- 7 <u>or regulation in order to access government services or operate</u>
- 8 and conduct business by a regulated entity.
- 9 <u>"Secretary." The Secretary of the Budget.</u>
- 10 § 4403. Establishment.
- 11 (a) Direction and duration of program. -- The office shall be
- 12 under the direction of the secretary, who shall administer a
- 13 three-year regulatory reduction pilot program beginning July 1,
- 14 2020, and ending July 1, 2023, for pilot agencies.
- 15 (b) Program focus and reduction goal.--The program shall <--
- 16 <u>focus on regulations promulgated and administered by pilot</u>
- 17 agencies. The stated goal of the program shall be to reduce
- 18 <u>UNNECESSARY regulatory requirements, compliance costs and</u>
- 19 regulatory burden across pilot agencies by 25% by July 1, 2023. <--
- 20 (c) Baseline regulatory catalog. -- The secretary shall ensure
- 21 pilot agencies develop a baseline regulatory catalog by October
- 22 1, 2020, that identifies:
- 23 (1) The total number and type of regulations and
- 24 <u>regulatory requirements currently promulgated or administered</u>
- 25 by the pilot agencies.
- 26 (2) Any specific Federal or State mandates or statutory
- 27 authority that requires the regulations and associated
- 28 <u>requirements.</u>
- 29 (d) Catalog data report to office. -- The catalog data shall
- 30 be reported to the office in a manner specified by the office

- 1 and transferred to the Legislative Reference Bureau for
- 2 <u>publication in the Pennsylvania Bulletin.</u>
- 3 (e) Reduction goal. -- The 25% A reduction goal under <--
- 4 <u>subsection</u> (b) <u>shall be based on the total number of regulations</u>
- 5 <u>and regulatory requirements as provided by the baseline</u>
- 6 regulatory catalog. Progress towards the stated goal A REDUCTION\_<--
- 7 <u>UNDER SUBSECTION</u> (B) shall be measured by the number of
- 8 regulations and regulatory requirements that are either
- 9 <u>eliminated or streamlined through regulatory or other action.</u>
- 10 § 4404. Reporting by pilot agencies.
- 11 (a) Initial report. -- The pilot agencies shall report all
- 12 <u>regulations and regulatory requirements initially identified for</u>
- 13 <u>elimination</u>, <u>amendment or streamlining to the office</u>, the
- 14 Governor and the General Assembly by July 1, 2021, including:
- 15 (1) Any regulation proposed for elimination or
- 16 <u>modification that requires a change in State law.</u>
- 17 (2) Initiation of any reforms, through a rulemaking or

- 18 nonregulatory action, that produce a reduction of the
- 19 equivalent of 7.5% of the regulations and regulatory
- 20 requirements contained in the pilot agencies baseline
- 21 regulatory catalog.
- 22 (b) Follow-up report.--The pilot agencies shall report all
- 23 regulations and regulatory requirements initially identified for
- 24 elimination, amendment or streamlining to the office by July 1,
- 25 2022, including:
- 26 (1) Any regulation proposed for elimination or
- 27 modification that requires a change in State law.
- 28 (2) Initiation of any reforms, through a rulemaking or
- 29 <u>nonregulatory action, that produce a reduction of the</u>
- 30 equivalent of 15% of the regulations and regulatory

- 1 <u>requirements contained in the pilot agencies baseline</u>
- 2 regulatory catalog.
- 3 (c) Final report. -- The pilot agencies shall report all
- 4 regulations and regulatory requirements initially identified for
- 5 elimination, amendment or streamlining to the office by July 1,
- 6 <u>2023</u>, including:
- 7 (1) Any regulation proposed for elimination or
- 8 <u>modification that requires a change in State law.</u>
- 9 (2) Initiation of any reforms, through a rulemaking or

- 10 <u>nonregulatory action</u>, that produce a reduction of the
- 11 <u>equivalent of 25% of the regulations and regulatory</u>
- 12 <u>requirements contained in the pilot agencies baseline</u>
- 13 <u>regulatory catalog.</u>
- 14 (d) Failure to meet reduction goal.--If a pilot agency is <--
- 15 <u>unable to reach any of the reduction goals PRODUCE A REDUCTION</u> <-
- 16 OF THE REGULATIONS AND REGULATORY REQUIREMENTS under subsection
- 17 (a), (b) or (c), the pilot agency shall provide a separate
- 18 report to the Governor, the General Assembly and the secretary
- 19 <u>stating the reasons for not meeting the goal PRODUCING A</u> <--
- 20 REDUCTION.
- 21 <u>§ 4405</u>. Reporting.
- 22 (a) Annual report.--The secretary shall SUBMIT A report <--
- 23 <u>annually to the President pro tempore of the Senate and the</u>
- 24 Speaker of the House of Representatives no later than October 1,
- 25 2021, and October 1, 2022, on the progress of the regulatory
- 26 <u>reduction pilot program established under this section. THE</u> <--
- 27 REPORT SHALL INCLUDE RECOMMENDATIONS ON THE ELIMINATION OR
- 28 MODIFICATION OF REGULATIONS.
- 29 (b) Failure to meet reduction percentage. -- If, by July 1, <-
- 30 2022, the regulatory reduction pilot program has NOT achieved <-

- 1 <u>less than a 15% total A reduction in regulatory requirements</u>
- 2 <u>across both pilot agencies</u>, either by initiating rulemaking
- 3 <u>actions or other streamlining actions, the secretary shall</u>

- 5 reduction in the next available annual report to the President
- 6 pro tempore of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of
- 7 Representatives.
- 8 (c) Secretary report. -- The secretary shall report by August
- 9 15, 2023, to the President pro tempore of the Senate and the
- 10 Speaker of the House of Representatives the following
- 11 <u>information:</u>
- 12 (1) The progress towards identifying the 25% ACHIEVING A <--
- 13 <u>reduction <del>goal</del> IN REGULATIONS AND REGULATORY REQUIREMENTS.</u>
- 14 (2) Recommendations for expanding the program to other
- 15 <u>agencies</u>.
- 16 (3) Any additional information the secretary determines
- may be helpful to support the General Assembly's regulatory
- 18 reduction and reform efforts.
- 19 § 4406. Report required.
- 20 (a) Report on failure to achieve program <del>goal</del> REDUCTION.-- <--
- 21 If, by October 1, 2023, the program has NOT achieved less than
- 22 the 25% total A reduction in regulations and regulatory
- 23 <u>requirements across the pilot agencies under section 4403(b)</u>
- 24 (relating to establishment), either by initiating rulemaking
- 25 actions or other streamlining actions, the secretary shall
- 26 direct pilot agencies to report on the factors leading to why
- 27 the pilot agency could not meet the 25% ACHIEVE A reduction goal <--
- 28 <u>in regulations and regulatory requirements across the pilot</u>
- 29 agencies under section 4403(b) and provide recommendations for
- 30 policy and legislative changes required in order for the pilot

- 1 agency to achieve the intent of section 4401 (relating to
- 2 <u>legislative intent</u>) and goal under section 4403(b). No report
- 3 shall be required under this subsection if the program has
- 4 <u>achieved a 25% or greater reduction in regulations or regulatory</u>
- 5 <u>requirements across the pilot agencies</u>.
- 6 (b) Permitted budgetary review of pilot\_agencies.--The
- 7 President pro tempore of the Senate and the Speaker of the House
- 8 of Representatives may also direct the Legislative Budget and
- 9 Finance Committee to initiate a budgetary review of pilot
- 10 agencies. The review shall assess what obstacles exist to
- 11 meeting the 25% ACHIEVING A reduction goal under section
- 12 <u>4403(b)</u>.
- 13 (c) Legislative Budget and Finance Committee review.--The
- 14 President pro tempore of the Senate and the Speaker of the House

- 15 of Representatives shall direct the Legislative Budget and
- 16 Finance Committee to review the regulatory reduction efforts of
- 17 pilot agencies as part of the pilot program and report to the
- 18 General Assembly any findings and recommendations regarding:
- 19 <u>(1) Whether the A reduction goals IN REGULATIONS AND</u> <--
- 20 <u>REGULATORY REQUIREMENTS are reasonable and achievable.</u>
- 21 (2) Policies, practices and methods that may be adopted
- by agencies to successfully achieve the A reduction goals IN <--
- 23 REGULATIONS AND REGULATORY REOUIREMENTS.
- 24 § 4407. Regulatory catalogs of executive agencies.
- 25 By July 1, 2022, all executive branch agencies, boards and
- 26 <u>commissions under the policy jurisdiction of the Governor shall</u>
- 27 develop a baseline regulatory catalog and report their catalog
- 28 <u>data to the office, including:</u>
- 29 (1) Any specific Federal or State mandates.
- 30 (2) The statutory authority that requires the

- 1 <u>regulations and associated regulatory requirements.</u>
- 2 § 4408. Agency tracking of regulations.
- 3 (a) Tracking and reporting agency compliance. -- The office
- 4 shall track and report on the extent to which agencies comply
- 5 with existing requirements to periodically review all
- 6 regulations every four years and report the office's findings to
- 7 the Governor, the General Assembly and the Independent Fiscal
- 8 Office.
- 9 (b) Agency schedule of review. -- Agencies shall provide to
- 10 the office a schedule listing each regulation that shall be
- 11 reviewed in each of the four years, to be transmitted to the
- 12 <u>Legislative Reference Bureau for publication in the Pennsylvania</u>
- 13 <u>Bulletin</u>.
- 14 Section 3. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
