A RESOLUTION

- Designating the month of September 2016 as "Sepsis Awareness Month" in Pennsylvania.
- 3 WHEREAS, Sepsis, commonly called "blood poisoning," is the
- 4 body's overwhelming and life-threatening response to infection
- 5 which may lead to tissue damage, organ failure and death; and
- 6 WHEREAS, Physicians draw from a list of symptoms in order to
- 7 make a diagnosis of sepsis, including abnormalities of body
- 8 temperature, heart rate, respiratory rate and white blood cell
- 9 count; and
- 10 WHEREAS, Sepsis may be caused by an infection, usually
- 11 associated with an illness such as diabetes or cancer, or an
- 12 injury such as a cut or a scrape; and
- 13 WHEREAS, This medical condition may be caused by an infection
- 14 following routine surgery or a medical procedure; and
- 15 WHEREAS, Sepsis kills approximately 258,000 Americans

- 1 annually and that number is increasing; and
- 2 WHEREAS, Forty percent of patients diagnosed with severe
- 3 sepsis do not survive; and
- 4 WHEREAS, This medical condition is considered to be the most
- 5 costly in-hospital condition in the nation, costing more than
- 6 \$20 billion each year; and
- WHEREAS, Until a cure for sepsis is found, early detection is
- 8 the best hope for survival; therefore be it
- 9 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives designate the
- 10 month of September 2016 as "Sepsis Awareness Month" in
- 11 Pennsylvania.
