## A RESOLUTION

- 1 Recognizing the month of October 2020 as "Distracted Driving 2 Awareness Month" in Pennsylvania.
- 3 WHEREAS, On an average day, more than 700 crashes which
- 4 result in an injury involve distracted driving; and
- 5 WHEREAS, The economic toll of all motor vehicle crashes in
- 6 the United States exceeds \$400 billion annually; and
- WHEREAS, Talking into a mobile phone in hands-free mode,
- 8 texting and programming a dashboard infotainment system or GPS
- 9 device can divert an individual's attention away from driving
- 10 and result in physical or cognitive distraction; and
- 11 WHEREAS, Residents of this Commonwealth and all Americans
- 12 deserve to live in communities that promote safe driving
- 13 behaviors and healthy lifestyles; and
- 14 WHEREAS, Preventing distracted driving injuries and deaths
- 15 requires cooperation between all levels of government, employers
- 16 and the general public; and

- 1 WHEREAS, The National Safety Council works to promote
- 2 policies, practices and procedures leading to increased safety,
- 3 protection and health on roads and highways, as well as in
- 4 business and industry, in schools and colleges and in homes and
- 5 communities; and
- 6 WHEREAS, It is imperative that drivers focus attention on
- 7 motor vehicle injury risks and prevention; therefore be it
- 8 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives recognize the
- 9 month of October 2020 as "Distracted Driving Awareness Month" in
- 10 Pennsylvania.
