A RESOLUTION

- 1 Urging the General Assembly not to accept a cost-of-living
- adjustment during the next three years and when unemployment
- in this Commonwealth is more than 10%.
- 4 WHEREAS, The novel coronavirus 2019 (COVID-19) was declared a
- 5 global pandemic by the World Health Organization on March 11,
- 6 2020; and
- 7 WHEREAS, There are now more than 3.8 million cases of COVID-
- 8 19 in the United States and over 141,000 deaths; and
- 9 WHEREAS, In this Commonwealth, there are more than 100,000
- 10 confirmed cases of COVID-19 and over 7,000 deaths; and
- 11 WHEREAS, As a result of the pandemic, the Commonwealth had a
- 12 \$3.2 billion shortfall in revenue during the 2019-2020 fiscal
- 13 year; and
- 14 WHEREAS, In May 2020, the Independent Fiscal Office estimated
- 15 that Pennsylvania will permanently lose \$5 billion in revenue
- 16 through June 2021; and
- 17 WHEREAS, The temporary closure of businesses to mitigate the
- 18 spread of COVID-19 caused the unemployment rate in Pennsylvania

- 1 to increase from 5.8% in March 2020 to 16.1% in April 2020; and
- 2 WHEREAS, The unemployment rate in Pennsylvania in June 2020
- 3 was 13.0%; and
- 4 WHEREAS, The General Assembly has held session throughout the
- 5 duration of the global pandemic to address the crisis and work
- 6 to protect Pennsylvanians; and
- 7 WHEREAS, The act of September 30, 1983 (P.L.160, No.39),
- 8 known as the Public Official Compensation Law, bases cost-of-
- 9 living adjustments for public officials in Pennsylvania to the
- 10 year-over-year change in the consumer price index published by
- 11 the United States Department of Labor; and
- 12 WHEREAS, Millions of hardworking Pennsylvanians continue to
- 13 struggle to pay their bills and afford basic needs amid the
- 14 global pandemic; and
- 15 WHEREAS, Pennsylvanians deserve to know that their State
- 16 legislators understand the hardships they continue to face every
- 17 day; and
- 18 WHEREAS, Legislators have a responsibility to set an example
- 19 for leaders at all levels of government and in the private
- 20 sector to follow; therefore be it
- 21 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives urge the General
- 22 Assembly not to accept a cost-of-living adjustment during the
- 23 next three years and when unemployment in this Commonwealth is
- 24 more than 10%; and be it further
- 25 RESOLVED, That the House of Representative pledge not to
- 26 accept a cost-of-living adjustment for the next three years; and
- 27 be it further
- 28 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives pledge not to
- 29 accept a cost-of-living adjustment during any year in which
- 30 unemployment in this Commonwealth is more than 10%; and be it

- 2 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives call upon the
- 3 Senate to make the same pledge not to accept a cost-of-living
- 4 adjustment for the next three years and when unemployment in
- 5 this Commonwealth is more than 10%.
